4. Bill No. 2019-29 - For possible action - Amends the schedule of fines and penalties in LVMC 11.10.140 pertaining to non-moving (parking) violations to increase fine and penalty amounts in various categories, and amends various provisions of LVMC Titles 10 and 11 to provide clarifying and parallel amendments, including an update to terminology and procedures relating to the City's use of vehicle immobilization devices. Proposed by: Jorge Cervantes, Chief Operations and Development Officer

Minutes:

COUNCILWOMAN FIORE declared the Public Hearing open.

BRANDY STANLEY, Parking Services Manager, stated this ordinance increases a few fines, including the basic parking fine, raising it from \$20.00 to \$25.00. She noted this fine has not increased for several decades, and even with the proposed increase, the amount is less than half of what many surrounding cities charge for a basic parking fine.

The ordinance also increases fines related to loading zones, commercial zones, bus stops, and other types of violations Parking Services is having trouble with related to pick up and drop off activities. Staff wished to increase the fine as more of a deterrent in order to help keep the curbs open.

Additionally, the ordinance will allow the use of the Barnacle, which is an immobilization device that is placed on the windshield to block a driver from operating the vehicle instead of on the tire. This device is smaller, lighter and is easier to put on. It also has a customer service component where a payment can be made over the phone and one can release the device on their own and return it at their leisure instead of having to wait for Parking Services to come and remove a boot. There is no fine increase proposed; this is just to add the customer service component by using the windshield blocker.

COUNCILWOMAN FIORE declared the Public Hearing closed.

Subsequent to the motion and vote, COUNCILWOMAN FIORE announced this bill will be eligible for adoption at the October 2, 2019 City Council meeting.
