We have already created Neighborhood Watch signs. In this phase of the program we are encouraging neighbors to get to know each other. Per the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department Neighborhood Watch Handbook: "Neighborhood Watch is designed to reduce burglaries and neighborhood crime. It involves getting to know one's neighbors. Neighborhood Watch is designed to reduce burglaries by requesting your participation in the following manner: Know your neighbors and communicate with them." The safety goal is to provide residents with reflective vests and flashlight for walking, biking during dark hours. We encourage Light the Night - meaning exterior lighting during dark hours. In looking for ways to improve neighbor to neighbor kindness and address some of the volatile issues, the committee began thinking of how can we remind our residents that they live in a community and have a responsibility to be a good neighbor. The project includes a newsletter devoted to kindness and how to be a good neighbor; nominate your neighbor as a good neighbor, will be placing a sign in the yard of the neighbor that has been nominated; rock painting events and placing around the community - with positive messages to encourage others; a mosaic banner of life in Desert Shores - can be paintings, drawings, or photographs that will be made into a banner that will be displayed at the front of the swim lagoon park; holding 2 game nights - 1 a trivia game night and 1 would be board game night and a tie dye project held at the swim lagoon park. Volunteers will contribute stories and photos, articles on being a good neighbor, for the newsletter and banner; will host and run the events, Desert Shores has 3,351 units, comprising of single family homes and condos. Duncan Court	5	Raising the alley wall for community safety.	This project was selected as one with a financial necessity for funding. The neighborhood residents will be involved as part of a community watch during the project. Elkhorn at High Noon	4	lead based batteries to Lithium for longevity and energy efficiency	light are solar powered. The panel on top of the light powers a battery and the battery provides power to the light after sundown. Currently the batteries used are an acid lead based battery. A large amount of those batteries need replacement. Our vendor American Solar Electric suggested we consider using a Lithium Ion Phosphate battery as a replacement. The cost is about 250% higher but the life of the battery is 5 years as opposed to the 1 year life of a lead acid battery. Five times less waste and the LIP battery is manufactured in Henderson where the lead acid batteries are made in Vietnam or China. The cost for the install of the LIP batteries would be \$4950. We couldn't do any public get togethers in 2020 and 2021 because of COVID-19 and now that the pandemic is easing up, we would like to have another neighborhood picnic to ease back into normalcy. We also want to provide visibility to the neighborhood association with t-shirts and stickers. We have approximately 600 homes within the association boundaries. Due to the enthusiasm of our residents the Winchester board ran with the project and worked diligently to present this for your consideration. Previously we attempted to secure the grant and due to circumstances beyond our control, we were not able to see the grant through to fruition. We are hoping that three times is the Charm!
