Our newly elected Ward 6 Councilwoman, Nancy Brune has been very active on behalf of her constituents, and particularly the senior community.

She has engaged with many and has included both Elizabeth Pattarettu and me in discussions regarding senior concerns and events. Her current plans are to be available at her satellite office at the Y located at 6601 N. Buffalo, LV NV 89131 on the second Thursday of the month. Either Elizabeth or I hope to join her at most of those gatherings. We plan to summarize the comments and concerns of the Ward 6 seniors so that they can be addressed.

Here are some from the first 2 meetings:

1. **Affordable Senior Housing:** What can the city do to provide reasonable rents within the Ward 6 locale? Several people expressed their disappointment with the number of buildings that are in the development "The Vue at Centennial" (located at Tenaya and the 215-Bruce Woodbury Beltway). They wondered if anything could be done to have some of those apartments dedicated to seniors, since it is a convenient location for senior needs and activities.
2. **Food concerns:** There were inquiries about programs within Ward 6 about each of the following: Food pantries; Food box distribution or delivery; Community meal for Seniors (similar to those at East LV, Whitney and Clark County libraries; Information about being excluded from the SNAP assistance due to the increase in Social Security income.
3. **Van transportation:** Expressed interest in getting transportation from the Active Adult center for events or to visit other Adult Centers.

CW, NB addressed these issues, explained that some involved Clark County, but would still be actively pursuing solutions and County coordination.

At CWs invitation we attended a meeting with Three Square and a presentation by LV Fire & Rescue with added senior safety tips from LV Metro.

I will forward further details to Chairwoman O'Rear-Cameron to see if there is an interest in presentations to our Advisory Board.
