Arts Commission Education Outreach Program

Public Art Education Series

Through the Public Art Education Series, the city of Las Vegas commits to expanding professional development opportunities to the Las Vegas arts community. In April 2022 the Education Subcommittee of the Arts Commission directed city staff to develop a program to offer educational opportunities to support the development of professional artists.

Vision

The city of Las Vegas illuminates arts and culture and celebrates the bold, dynamic, and diverse community through providing access to artworks within city spaces and outdoors in the public realm.

Mission

The city of Las Vegas' Public Art and Gallery Program serves valley residents and visitors, celebrating the city's extraordinary character, by acquiring and displaying artworks in public spaces and supporting community-led public art efforts.

Public Art Education Series Goals

- Provide educational programming for Las Vegas-based artists to enhance their knowledge and skills related to the practice of creating public art.
- Promote and foster the sharing of knowledge to develop expertise that advances careers within the field of public art.
- Celebrate and encourage connections within the Las Vegas arts and culture community.
- Offer professional established artists opportunities to share their expertise.

Community Involvement

The city of Las Vegas' Public Art and Gallery Program staff established a survey to invite the community to help inform the development of the Public Art Education Series. The survey was offered in English, Spanish, and Tagalog. It contained questions seeking input for potential educational opportunities and workshops in order to provide the greatest impact. The survey opened to the public on August 15, 2023, and closed on September 30, 2023.

Community Response

The information gathered from the survey provided insight related to the Public Art Education Series potential participants, topics to be addressed, and future programming to be developed. The majority of survey respondents self-identified as emerging artists – i.e. artists in the early stages of their careers, building out their resumes and project portfolios. We learned that the community was interested in improving skills related to developing public art design proposals, understanding calls for artists and requests for proposals, planning, and the management of public art projects, applying for grants, understanding artistic services agreements and copyright laws, as well as building a project budget, drafting professional artist resumes and hands-on skill sharing.

Additionally, the survey provided the Public Art and Gallery Program with information connected to artists in the community interested in leading professional artist educational workshops and lectures.

Public Art Education Series Development

Based on information gathered from the survey, the city of Las Vegas Public Art and Gallery Program staff developed an operational calendar of educational opportunities to support the development of professional artists. In July 2023, an expanded general fund budget request of \$25,000 was approved to support the education outreach program. Following a recommendation made in January 2024, by the Education Subcommittee of the Arts Commission, staff focused on offering quarterly public art education opportunities.

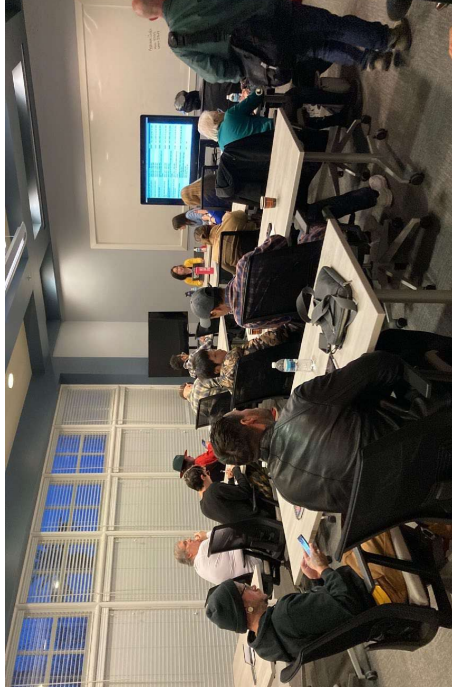

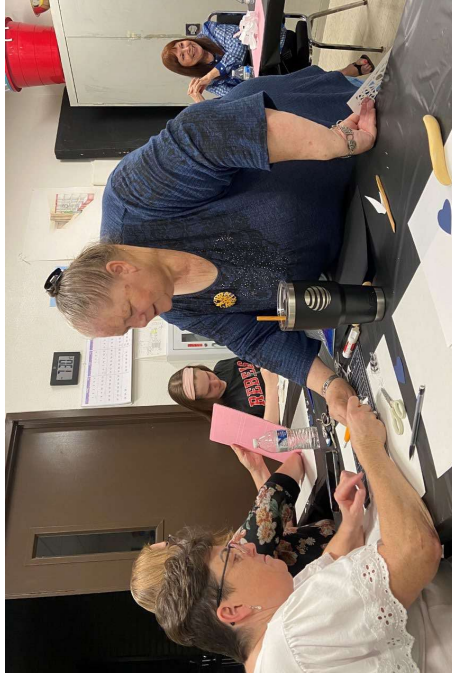

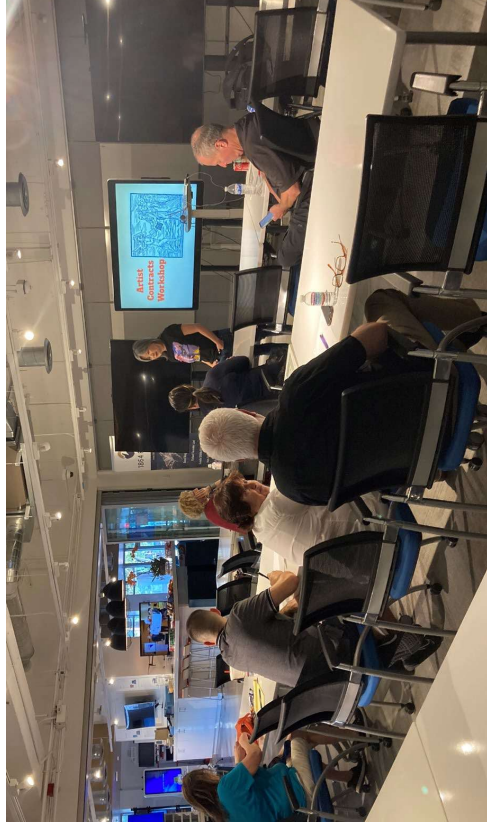
