PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

This bill will amend LVMC 6.84.010 and 6.84.050 to provide a definition of the term "wedding chapel" for licensing and regulatory purposes. It will update operational requirements for wedding chapels by allowing wedding chapels to comply with the existing requirement to post their rates through the use of digital signage, websites or brochures, and will require wedding chapels to provide patrons with an itemized invoice of charges prior to services being performed.

RECOMMENDATION:

3 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND LVMC 6.84.010 AND 6.84.050, RELATING TO WEDDING CHAPELS,
4 TO PROVIDE A DEFINITION OF “WEDDING CHAPEL” FOR LICENSING AND REGULATORY
5 PURPOSES, UPDATE OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS, AND PROVIDE FOR OTHER RELATED
6 MATTERS.

Summary: Amends LVMC 6.84.010 and
7 6.84.050, relating to wedding chapels, to provide
8 a definition of “wedding chapel” for licensing and
regulatory purposes, and to update operational
requirements.

9 THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS
10 FOLLOWS:

11 SECTION 1: Title 6, Chapter 84, Section 10, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las
12 Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

13 **6.84.010:** (A) No person shall engage in the business of operating a wedding chapel without first
14 obtaining and thereafter maintaining a valid unexpired license pursuant to this Code. The City Council finds
15 and determines that the operation of a wedding chapel should require a privileged license, and is therefore
16 subject to the provisions of Chapter 6.06.

17 (B) In addition to any requirement of Chapter 6.06 otherwise applicable, each employee
18 or agent of a wedding chapel business, including an independent contractor, who will engage in the
19 solicitation of business or the distribution of advertising materials for the wedding chapel must comply with
20 applicable provisions of Chapters 6.42 and 6.62.

21 (C) For purposes of this Chapter, “wedding chapel” means a business located within a
22 permanently affixed structure whose principal operation is the performance of wedding ceremonies. A
23 wedding chapel license authorizes the provision of incidental services related to weddings, such as
24 photography or floral arrangements, that are part of wedding packages provided by such wedding chapels.
25 Additional licensing, as required by the Las Vegas Municipal Code, will be required for any ancillary services
26 not referenced above, including but not limited to those services which are performed by privileged

1 businesses, pursuant to LVMC 6.06. The term “wedding chapel” does not include a business or location
2 whose primary use is to provide a location for hosting of receptions, banquets and other similar events, and
3 a wedding chapel license does not authorize the operation of a banquet hall, event center or multipurpose
4 venue.

5 SECTION 2: Title 6, Chapter 84, Section 50, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las
6 Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 **6.84.050:** (A) The owner or operator of [any wedding chapel or other establishment at which
8 weddings are performed shall post and maintain in a prominent and conspicuous place in the office or
9 reception room thereof a statement of rates of all charges for services.] a wedding chapel shall ensure that all
10 rates and charges associated with wedding-related services are made available to customers or patrons by one
11 or more of the following means:

12 (1) Posting the current rates and charges in a prominent and conspicuous place
13 in public view, which shall be presented in the form of a digital or printed sign in clearly discernible text with
14 characters not less than three-eighths inches in height;

15 (2) Providing a list of the current rates and charges in printed form upon request;
16 or

17 (3) Making a list of the current rates and charges readily accessible on the
18 establishment’s website (or other digital platforms used in place of a website).

19 (B) [The statement of charges for all services shall be in the form of a printed sign with
20 clearly discernible red lettering on a white background, the lettering to be not less than three-eighths inch
21 high.] The owner or operator of a wedding chapel shall create an itemized invoice, in printed or digital form,
22 listing any final fees and all charges agreed upon by all parties prior to any services being performed;

23 (C) It is unlawful for any wedding chapel [or other establishment performing weddings
24 or at which weddings are performed] to charge more than the posted or otherwise published rates, or to
25 require a condition of securing services not posted or previously agreed upon by all parties.

26 SECTION 3: If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase

1 in this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by
2 any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the
3 remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council of the City of Las Vegas hereby
4 declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
5 thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs,
6 sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

7 SECTION 4: Whenever in this ordinance any act is prohibited or is made or declared to
8 be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, or whenever in this ordinance the doing of any act is required
9 or the failure to do any act is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, the doing of
10 such prohibited act or the failure to do any such required act shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon
11 conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment for a term of
12 not more than six months, or by any combination of such fine and imprisonment. Any day of any violation
13 of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

14 SECTION 5: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or sections, subsections, phrases,
15 sentences, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983
16 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.



SUBJECT:

Bill No. 2025-40 - For possible action - Adopts an extension of an ad valorem property tax rate in the City of Las Vegas for the purpose of employing police officers with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, as required by Senate Bill 451 of the 83rd Session of the Nevada Legislature, and providing for other related matters. Sponsored by: Mayor Shelley Berkley

FISCAL IMPACT:

PURPOSE/BACKGROUND:

This bill would adopt an extension of an existing ad valorem property tax rate in the City of Las Vegas for the purpose of employing police officers with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department. The City of Las Vegas and Clark County both currently impose a 20-cent property tax rate on each \$100 of assessed valuation in their respective jurisdictions, which was approved by the voters at the 1996 General Election. That tax is set to expire in 2027. In its 83rd Session (2025), the Nevada Legislature passed Senate Bill 451 requiring the City and Clark County to renew this property tax. The extended tax will be in effect from July 1, 2027 to June 30, 2057.

RECOMMENDATION:

This bill should be submitted to a Recommending Committee for review, hearing and recommendation to the City Council for final action.

4 THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING POLICE OFFICERS WITH THE
5 LAS VEGAS METROPOLITAN POLICE DEPARTMENT, AS REQUIRED BY SENATE BILL 451 OF
6 THE 83RD (2025) SESSION OF THE NEVADA LEGISLATURE, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER
7 RELATED MATTERS.

9 Summary: Adopting an extension of an ad
10 valorem property tax rate in the City of Las Vegas
11 for the purpose of employing police officers with
12 the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, as
13 required by Senate Bill 451 of the 83rd (2025)
14 Session of the Nevada Legislature.

15 WHEREAS, an ad valorem property tax rate of twenty cents per one hundred dollars of
16 assessed valuation in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada was approved by the voters at the 1996 General Election
17 for the purpose of employing police officers with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and which
18 expires on June 30, 2027; and

19 WHEREAS, because the property tax rate of twenty cents per one hundred dollars of
20 assessed valuation was imposed before April 6, 2005, the property tax rate was not exempt from the partial
21 abatement of property taxes and thus was required to be included in the calculation used to determine the
22 amount of property taxes abated; and

23 WHEREAS, Senate Bill 451, 83rd Leg. (Nevada 2025), requires the City Council of the City
24 of Las Vegas to extend and continue the imposition of an ad valorem property tax rate of twenty cents on
25 each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation in the City of Las Vegas for the purpose of employing police
26 officers with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department for the period beginning on July 1, 2027, and
ending on June 30, 2057; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Senate Bill 451, 83rd Leg. (Nevada 2025), the property tax rate
imposed pursuant to this ordinance shall continue to be subject to abatement and included in the calculation
used to determine the amount of property taxes abated.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES

1 HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

2 SECTION 1: “Committee” means a metropolitan police committee on fiscal affairs.

3 “Department” means the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department and any successor thereto.

4 “Property Tax Rate” means twenty cents on each one hundred dollars of assessed valuation within the taxable
5 area of the Taxing District.

6 “Taxing District” means the area within the boundaries of the City of Las Vegas.

7 SECTION 2: For each fiscal year beginning on and after July 1, 2027, and ending before
8 July 1, 2057, the Property Tax Rate shall be imposed in the Taxing District for the purpose of employing
9 additional police officers.

10 SECTION 3: All officers charged with the duty of collecting ad valorem taxes shall
11 collect the Property Tax Rate imposed pursuant to this ordinance in the same form and manner, and with the
12 same interest and penalties, as other ad valorem taxes are collected, and shall pay all revenue generated by
13 the Property Tax Rate, including all interest and penalties, to the Department upon collection.

14 SECTION 4: The Committee shall authorize the Department to use the proceeds only for
15 the purpose of employing additional police officers and the incurrence of related costs.

16 SECTION 5: The Property Tax Rate imposed pursuant to this ordinance as required by
17 Senate Bill 451, 83rd Leg. (Nevada 2025), is not subject to the limitation provided in NRS 354.59811 and is
18 not exempt from any partial abatement from taxation provided pursuant to NRS 361.4722, 361.4723 or
19 361.4724.

20 SECTION 6: Except as otherwise provided in Subsection 1 of NRS 280.201, the Property
21 Tax Rate levied pursuant to this ordinance and as required by Senate Bill 451, 83rd Leg. (Nevada 2025), must
22 be levied at a uniform rate.

23 SECTION 7: If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
24 in this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by
25 any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the
26 remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council of the City of Las Vegas hereby

1 declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
2 thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs,
3 sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

4 SECTION 8: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or sections, subsections, phrases,
5 sentences, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983
6 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
