3 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY'S REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO ALCOHOLIC  
4 BEVERAGES TO ESTABLISH A LIQUOR MANUFACTURER LICENSE CATEGORY, AND TO  
PROVIDE FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

Summary: Amends the City's regulations  
pertaining to alcoholic beverages to establish a  
liquor manufacturer license category.

7 THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN  
8 AS FOLLOWS:

9 SECTION 1: Title 6, Chapter 50, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas,  
10 Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, designated as Section 145,  
11 reading as follows:

12 **6.50.145:** A liquor manufacturer's license authorizes the manufacture, production and bottling  
13 of alcoholic beverages of all kinds, including the brewing, distilling and rectifying activities associated  
14 therewith. The holder of such a license is subject to all Federal and State statutes and regulations  
15 applicable to those activities.

16 SECTION 2: Ordinance No. 6118 and Title 6, Chapter 50, Section 360, of the  
17 Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, are hereby amended so that Section  
18 360 reads as follows:

19 **6.50.360:** Each licensee shall pay to the Department, in advance, the semiannual license fees set  
20 forth in the following schedule:

21 Each special event general licensee shall pay a license fee of one hundred dollars per day.

22 Each special event beer/wine licensee shall pay a license fee of seventy-five dollars per day.

23                   SECTION 4: Ordinance No. 6118 and Title 6, Chapter 50, Section 380, of the  
24 Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, are hereby amended so that Section  
25 380 reads as follows:

26 **6.50.380:**     (A)   The origination charge listed in this Section is a one time charge which is due  
27 and payable at the time of filing an application for an alcoholic beverage license. Origination charges  
28 are as follows:

(B) The transfer of an alcoholic beverage license from one licensee to another is exempt from the origination charge set forth in this Section.


(C) In connection with the issuance of an original new City alcoholic beverage license to an existing County alcoholic beverage licensee whose business premises have been annexed into the City, the Department shall waive the origination charge at the request of the applicant.

1 However, a license concerning which such a waiver has been granted may not be sold, transferred to  
2 a third party, or transferred to a new location, notwithstanding any provision of this Title to the  
3 contrary.

4 SECTION 4: If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or  
5 phrase in this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or  
6 ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or  
7 effectiveness of the remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council of the  
8 City of Las Vegas hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision,  
9 paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections,  
10 subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional,  
11 invalid or ineffective.

12 SECTION 5: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or sections, subsections, phrases,  
13 sentences, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada,  
14 1983 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT

**Amends the City's regulations pertaining to alcoholic beverages to  
establish a liquor manufacturer license category**
