

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 521 AND ORDINANCE NO. 736, DEALING WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PUBLIC POUND IN THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS; PROVIDING FOR FEES FOR SERVICES PERFORMED BY THE POUNDKEEPER; PROVIDING FOR STORAGE AND PICKUP OF DEAD ANIMALS; PROVIDING FOR COPULATING DOGS; PROVIDING FOR THE POUND MASTER TO ISSUE CITATIONS; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 20 of Ordinance No. 521 and Section 18 of Ordinance No. 736 are hereby amended as follows:

The charges for impounding animals or fowl, including biting dogs, shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00) per animal or fowl, plus the sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) for each day, or part of a day, after the first twenty-four (24) hours. Except as otherwise changed herein, Section 18 of Ordinance No. 736 shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 2. Section 30 of Ordinance No. 521 is hereby amended to read as follows:

UNLAWFUL TO KEEP BARKING DOG OR NOISY ANIMAL. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor or own any dog, animal or fowl which by loud or frequent habitual barking, yelping, howling, braying, or other noise causes annoyance to the neighborhood or to any persons in the vicinity. Any animal or fowl found running at large in the City shall be deemed and considered to be a public nuisance. Any dog barking so as to create a disturbance shall also be deemed and considered to be a public nuisance. It shall be the duty of the pound master or his deputy, of the City of Las Vegas, to issue a citation to the owner or person in charge of such dog to appear in Municipal Court of the City of Las Vegas, in substantially the following form:

SECTION 3. Section 33 of Ordinance No. 521 is hereby amended to read as follows:

UNLAWFUL TO ALLOW FEMALE DOGS TO RUN AT LARGE IN COPULATING SEASON. The owner of any female dog in heat shall keep the same confined or on a leash at all times and shall not permit such dog to be at large in the streets, parks, or other public places in the City of Las Vegas, and shall keep said female dog in heat secured upon the owner's premises so that other dogs shall not have access thereto. Every female dog so found running at large shall be immediately seized and impounded in the public pound and held subject to the provisions of this Ordinance. The charge for impounding such a dog shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00) for the first impounding and Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for each impounding thereafter.

SECTION 4. DISPOSAL OF DEAD ANIMALS. It shall be the duty of the pound master of the City of Las Vegas to pickup dead animals from veterinarians and individuals and make a charge therefore in the sum of \$2.00 per animal for the pickup and disposal of each animal, while operating a regular route service. Veterinarians calling for special service in the pickup of a dead animal shall pay the sum of \$3.50 for each special call. It shall also be the duty of the pound master to pickup dead animals from individuals within the City of Las Vegas and make a charge therefor in the sum of \$3.50 for each call.

The pound master shall make special charges for the pickup of any animal which requires special handling and equipment by reason of the weight thereof. Said charges to be based on the time, labor, equipment and use of pound facilities.

SECTION 5. VETERINARIANS TO PROVIDE SUITABLE STORAGE. It shall be the duty of the veterinarians to provide a suitable sealed box, with cooling, within which to contain said dead animals so that the same will not deteriorate for a period of twenty-four (24) hours.

SECTION 6. Section 47 of Ordinance No. 521 is hereby amended to read as follows:

PUNISHMENT FOR VIOLATION. Any person owning, possessing, or having the care, custody and control of an animal who wilfully refuses, fails or neglects to furnish to said poundkeeper or license fee collector the required information as provided herein, or who wilfully fails, refuses or neglects to cause said animals to be registered and pay said registration fee at the time and in the manner herein provided, or who wilfully fails, refuses or neglects to perform any act or pay any other fee or charge required by this ordinance to be performed or paid, and any person who shall wilfully resist, interfere with or prevent the pound keeper or any of his assistants in the exercise of their duties,

or who wilfully violates any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished, by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail for not less than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and the payment of any fees and charges provided for in this ordinance due and remaining unpaid.

SECTION 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its publication, as in the next section provided, and final passage.

SECTION 9. The City Clerk and Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas shall cause this ordinance to be published once a week for two successive weeks immediately following its first reading and adoption, in the Las Vegas Review Journal, a daily newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas.



SECTION 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
SECTION 8. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its publication, as in the next section provided, and final passage.
SECTION 9.
