

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE V, CHAPTER 2, SECTION 1 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, 1960, BY INCREASING THE LICENSE TAX FOR REVENUE FOR OPERATORS OF HOTELS AND MOTELS WITHIN THE CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A RESERVATIONS BUREAU; PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Title V, Chapter 2, Section 1 of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1960, is hereby amended for the purpose of establishing a reservations bureau as follows:

LICENSE TAX: There is hereby fixed and imposed a license tax for revenue on the operators of hotels and motels within the City, in addition to license taxes heretofore and hereafter fixed and imposed, the following amounts:


- (A) Five per cent (5%) of all monies received from room rentals by hotels having seventy-five (75) or more rooms.
- (B) Four per cent (4%) of all monies received from room rentals by all hotels other than hotels having seventy-five (75) or more rooms, and by all motels, and by apartment hotels and apartment houses advertising and accepting less than weekly rentals. Said tax on apartment hotels and apartment houses to be limited to the rentals received on the less than weekly basis. In order to establish permanency of occupation for all hotels, other than hotels having seventy-five (75) or more rooms, and all motels, one (1) calendar month or thirty (30) days of continuous occupancy or rental shall constitute such permanency. Occupants of such room rentals will be considered a resident guest, and not subject to the payment of the room tax from and after thirty (30) days continued residence.
- (C) There shall be a discount allowed operators of establishments referred to in this Section. Such discount shall be an amount equal to two per cent (2%) of the amount of the tax being paid, not on net revenues, penalties or interest. This discount privilege is for payment being made on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of the month next following the month for which the tax is due, and shall not be allowed for payments made after that date.

SECTION 2. That if any one or more sections, sentences, clauses, or parts of this ordinance shall, for any reason, be questioned or held invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remaining provisions of this ordinance, but shall be confined in its operation to the specific sections, sentences, clauses, or parts of of this ordinance so held unconstitutional and invalid, and the inapplicability and invalidity of any section, sentence, clause or part of this ordinance, in any one or more instances shall not affect or prejudice in any way the applicability and validity of this ordinance in any other instances.

SECTION 3. That any person, partnership, corporation or association operating a hotel or motel or gaming establishment required to pay the license tax imposed by this ordinance who fails or refuses to pay such tax shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction pay a fine of not more than \$500.00 and/or be imprisoned in the City Jail for not more than six (6) months. Each day such violation occurs shall be a separate offense.

ORDINANCE NO. 844
