

ORDINANCE NO. 801

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 17, SECTION 12, CODE OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, 1949, BY PROVIDING FOR LICENSE FEES FOR REVENUE FROM INSURANCE AGENTS; DEFINING TERMS; PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.

(a) "Insurance" and "insurance business" for the purpose of this Ordinance shall include the classes as provided by Chapter 681, Nevada Revised Statutes.

(b) "Insurance Agent" means any person, partnership, association or corporation who or which solicits, negotiates or effects in the City of Las Vegas, on behalf of any company, contracts for insurance of any of the classes listed in Chapter 681, Nevada Revised Statutes. A person who secures and forwards information for the purposes of group insurance coverages or for enrolling individuals under group insurance coverages, or issuing certificates thereunder, where no commission is paid for such services, is not an agent and is not required to be licensed under the provisions of this Ordinance.

(c) "Broker" means a person who, for compensation and on behalf of another person, transacts insurance with, but not on behalf of, any insurer.

(d) "Solicitor" means any person engaged in the solicitation of contracts of the kind or kinds enumerated for any agent, or broker.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the business, act in the capacity of, advertise or assume to act as an insurance agent, broker or solicitor within the City of Las Vegas, without first obtaining a license as provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. The Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue shall issue each license in such form and size as shall be prescribed by the Board of Commissioners of the City. Each license shall show the name and address of the licensee and, in the case of an insurance solicitor license, it shall show the name of the insurance agent or broker by whom he is employed. Each license shall have imprinted thereon the seal of the City and, in addition to the foregoing, shall contain such matter as shall be prescribed by the Board of Commissioners.

SECTION 4. An application on the prescribed form shall be made to the Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue within ten days by any insurance solicitor who makes a change of employer, together with the name of the new employer in whose service such solicitor is about to enter. The Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue shall issue a new license to such solicitor for the unexpired period of the original license, upon receipt of such application in proper form, accompanied by the payment of a transfer fee as provided by this ordinance.

SECTION 5. Licenses provided for by this Ordinance shall be issued only to persons, corporations or associations holding a license issued by the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Nevada.

SECTION 6. The following license fees for revenue shall be charged by and paid to the Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue of the City of Las Vegas by all persons who are required to be licensed under the provisions of this Ordinance:

of the City, a transfer fee for a broker or agent's license shall be \$10.00, and the transfer fee for a solicitor's license shall be \$5.00.

SECTION 10. Any violation of this Ordinance, or provisions herein contained, shall constitute a misdemeanor, and the offender upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. This remedy shall not be deemed exclusive but merely cumulative and any and all license fees that may be due the City may be recovered by appropriate civil process.

SECTION 11. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its final reading and adoption, and final publication as in the next section provided.

SECTION 13. The City Clerk and Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas shall cause this ordinance to be published once a week for two successive weeks immediately following its first reading and adoption, in the Las Vegas Review Journal, a daily newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas.

SECTION 4. An application on the prescribed form shall be made to the Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue within ten days by any insurance solicitor who makes a change of employer, together with the name of the new employer in whose service such solicitor is about to enter. The Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue shall issue a new license to such solicitor for the unexpired period of the original license, upon receipt of such application in proper form, accompanied by the payment of a transfer fee as provided by this ordinance.

SECTION 5. Licenses provided for by this Ordinance shall be issued only to persons, corporations or associations holding a license issued by the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Nevada.

SECTION 6. The following license fees for revenue shall be charged by and paid to the Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue of the City of Las Vegas by all persons who are required to be licensed under the provisions of this Ordinance:

1. Insurance agent or broker. For each insurance agent or broker, a license fee of \$20.00 semi-annually, payable in accordance with the cycle system of billing established by the Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue.

2. Solicitor. For each insurance solicitor, a license fee of \$10.00 semi-annually, payable in accordance with the cycle system of billing established by the Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue.

3. Exemption. Where there shall be more than one person, members of a firm or co-partnership, or officers of a corporation engaged in the insurance business, the semi-annual license fee shall be in the sum of \$10.00 for each and every person, member of a firm or co-partnership, officer of a corporation, in excess of such one person engaged or employed in the prosecution of the business. It is the intent of this exemption to provide that the company or resident manager, or first agent of any company, shall pay the full \$20.00 semi-annual license fee and that every other person whether classified hereunder as an agent or solicitor shall pay to the City of Las Vegas the \$10.00 semi-annual license fee, provided that such agent or solicitor is employed by, or works for or under an employer who is already licensed under the provisions of this Ordinance.



SECTION 7. The renewal of an insurance agent, broker or solicitor license shall be automatic upon the payment of the required fees therefor. Failure of an insurance agent, broker, or solicitor to pay the fee required hereunder to keep such license in good standing, within fifteen days from the payment date required, shall result in the automatic cancellation of the license and such licensee shall be prohibited from engaging in the insurance business in the City until such license has been properly reinstated upon the payment of the penalty as provided by the ordinances of the City of Las Vegas.

(b) Payment within the specified time limit of the fees required by this Ordinance shall entitle every licensee to continue operating under the provisions of this Ordinance until notified in writing that a renewal has been denied; provided, however, that the Supervisor of Licenses and Revenue shall not renew the license of any insurance agent, broker or solicitor, unless such person is a holder of an unrevoked, unsuspended and uncancelled license issued by the Insurance Commissioner of the State of Nevada.

(c) In case an agent or broker fails to obtain renewal of his license by paying the required fee within the specified time limit, the licenses of all solicitors in his employ shall be automatically cancelled and shall not be reinstated until the license of the agent or broker has been properly reinstated, except that in such cases the solicitor shall have the privilege, upon filing proper application therefor, to transfer to another agent or broker without penalty.

SECTION 8. Every person licensed as an insurance agent, broker or solicitor, under the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be required to have and maintain a definite place of business within the City, which shall be used for the transaction of insurance business and which will serve as his office for the transaction of business under the authority of such license. When an insurance business is conducted in a private home, the location shall be in accordance with the zoning ordinance of the City of Las Vegas and any and all other City ordinances and regulations pertaining to the conduct and maintenance of such business.

SECTION 9. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other ordinances of the City, a transfer fee for a broker or agent's license shall be \$10.00, and the transfer fee for a solicitor's license shall be \$5.00.

SECTION 10. Any violation of this Ordinance, or provisions herein contained, shall constitute a misdemeanor, and the offender upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (500.00) or by imprisonment in the City Jail for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. This remedy shall not be deemed exclusive but merely cumulative and any and all license fees that may be due the City may be recovered by appropriate civil process.

SECTION 11. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
