

ORDINANCE NO. 1434

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE X, CHAPTER 29, SECTION 7 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, 1960 EDITION, TO PROVIDE THE MAXIMUM LENGTH OF VEHICLES PERMITTED ON CITY STREETS; PROVIDING EXCEPTIONS THERETO; PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 7, Chapter 29, Title X of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1960 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

10-29-7: MAXIMUM WIDTH AND LENGTH OF VEHICLES; EXCEPTIONS:

- (A) As used in this Section and in Sections 8 and 9 hereof, "special mobile equipment" means a vehicle, not self-propelled, not designed or used primarily for the transportation of persons or property, and only incidentally operated or moved over a street, highway or alley.
- (B) Except as otherwise provided in this Section and in Sections 8 and 9 hereof, the legal maximum width of any vehicle, combination of vehicles, special mobile equipment, or load thereon shall not exceed ninety-six inches (96").
- (C) If a vehicle is equipped with pneumatic tires, the maximum width from the outside of one (1) wheel and tire to the outside of the opposite outer wheel and tire shall not exceed one hundred and two inches (102"), but in such event the outside width of the body of such vehicle or the load thereon shall not exceed ninety-six inches (96").
- (D) Lights or devices which are required to be mounted upon a vehicle under any provisions of this Code or of the Nevada Revised Statutes may extend beyond the permissible width of the vehicle to a distance not exceeding ten inches (10") on each side of the vehicle, except that the maximum width shall not exceed one hundred and twenty inches (120").

- (E) Door handles, hinges, cable cinchers and chain binders may extend three inches (3") on each side, except that the maximum width of body and door handles, hinges, cable cinchers or chain binders shall not exceed one hundred and two inches (102").
- (F) No passenger vehicle shall be operated on any street, highway or alley within the City with any load carried thereon extending beyond the line of the hub caps on its left side or more than six inches (6") beyond the line of the hub caps on its right side.
- (G) Except as otherwise provided in Sections 8 and 9 hereof, the following vehicles shall not exceed a width of one hundred and twenty inches (120"):
1. Any trailer or semitrailer, including lift carriers and tip-bed trailers, used exclusively for the transportation of implements of husbandry or farmers or implement dealers.
  2. Special mobile equipment.
  3. Highway construction and maintenance equipment.
- This subsection does not apply to any street or highway which is a part of the National System of Interstate and Defense Highways, as described in subsection (d) of Section 103 of Title 23, U.S.C.
- (H) No person shall operate any bus, motor truck or combination of vehicles, including any attachments thereto coupled together, in excess of seventy feet (70'), upon the streets of the City of Las Vegas, except on the following routes:
1. Tonopah Highway from the north city limits of Las Vegas to Bonanza Road.
  2. Bonanza Road from Tonopah Highway to Main Street.
  3. Main Street from the north city limits to Las Vegas Boulevard South.
  4. Sahara Avenue from Interstate #15 to Fremont Street (Boulder Highway).
  5. Las Vegas Boulevard from St. Louis Avenue to Sahara Avenue.

(I) The provisions of this Section shall not apply to any specially designed equipment operated by any duly franchised public utility for the purposes of the installation, maintenance or repair of public facilities; provided, however, that the public utility desiring to operate any such specially designed equipment in excess of the maximum widths and lengths set forth in this Section, shall first register the same with the Department of Public Works.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00 and/or imprisonment in the city jail for not more than six months, or any combination of such fine and imprisonment. Every day of such violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, sections, subsections, phrases, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1960 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 1, Section 7, Chapter 29,

10-29-7. MAXIMUM WIDTH AND

(A) As used in this Section and  
 in Sections 8 and 9 hereof, "special  
 mobile equipment" means a vehicle,  
 not self-propelled, not designed or  
 used primarily for the transportation  
 of persons or property, and only in-  
 cidentally operated or moved over a  
 street, highway or alley.

(B) Except as otherwise provided  
 in this Section and in Sections 8 and  
 9 hereof, the legal maximum width  
 of any vehicle, combination of ve-  
 hicles, special mobile equipment, or  
 load thereon shall not exceed ninety-  
 six inches (96").

(C) If a vehicle is equipped with  
 pneumatic tires, the maximum width  
 from the outside of one (1) wheel  
 and tire to the outside of the oppo-  
 site outer wheel and tire shall not  
 exceed one hundred and two inches  
 (102"), but in such event the out-  
 side width of the body of such ve-  
 hicle or the load thereon shall not  
 exceed ninety-six inches (96").

(D) Lights or devices which are  
 required to be mounted upon a  
 vehicle under any provisions of this  
 Code or of the Nevada Revised  
 Statutes may extend beyond the  
 permissible width of the vehicle to  
 a distance not exceeding ten inches  
 (10") on each side of the vehicle;  
 except that the maximum width shall  
 not exceed one hundred and twenty  
 inches (120").

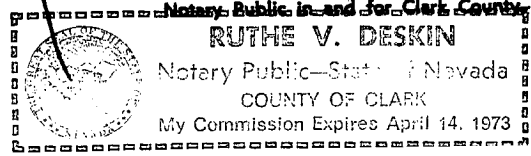

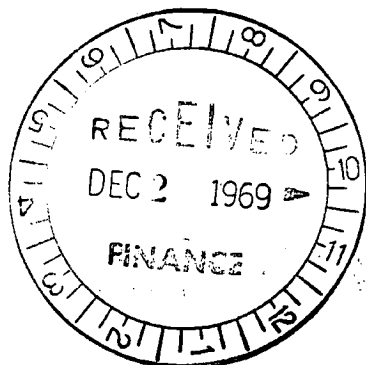
