

ORDINANCE NO. 1424

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE VI, CHAPTER 5, SECTION 1 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, 1960 EDITION, BY AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF EMPLOYEES OF ESTABLISHMENTS WHERE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE SOLD AT RETAIL ON THE PREMISES TO INCLUDE SECURITY GUARDS AND GREETERS; PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Title VI, Chapter 5, Section 1 of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1960 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6-5-1: DEFINITIONS: Whenever used in this Chapter unless the context otherwise requires:

"Employees of gambling houses" shall mean all dealers, shills, greeters, or any other person receiving a salary or percentage of profit from a gambling game or a gambling house (except slot machines, pin ball machines, and any other mechanically operated game where no attendant is required) as such games are defined in this Code, excluding stockholders who have no direct control of said operation.

"Employees of establishments where alcoholic beverages are sold at retail on the premises" shall mean bartenders, bus boys, bar managers, waiters, waitresses, security guards and greeters, and any other persons who serve alcoholic beverages to patrons for consumption on the premises.

"Taxi drivers" shall include all persons who drive any motor vehicle or conveyance used in the City for the purpose of transporting persons for hire, save and except those persons employed for hire to transport persons in interstate traffic exclusively, and those persons for hire to operate buses which operate under a City franchise.

"Alcoholic beverages" shall mean and include any and all distilled or rectified spirits, potable alcohol, brandy, whiskey, rum, gin, aromatic bitters, beer, wine, and every liquid or solid containing alcohol capable of being consumed by a human being.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00 and/or imprisonment in the city jail for not more than six months, or any combination of such fine and imprisonment. Every day of such violation shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, sections, subsections, phrases, sentences, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1960 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
