

FIRST AMENDMENT

ORDINANCE NO. 2130

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SECONDHAND DEALERS REQUIRING THAT ALL SECONDHAND GOODS BE RETAINED FOR A PERIOD OF TEN (10) DAYS IN THE CASE OF IDENTIFIABLE PROPERTY AND FOUR (4) DAYS FOR ALL OTHER SECONDHAND PROPERTY BEFORE SELLING, SHIPPING OR OTHERWISE DISPOSING OF THE SAME; PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith; AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF.

Commissioner Al. Levy	To require secondhand dealers to retain identifiable secondhand property for ten (10) days and all other secondhand property for four (4) days after receipt thereof, has been reported to the Metropolitan Police Department.

THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Title V, Chapter 8, Section 1 of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1960 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-8-1: Definitions: Whenever used in this chapter, the following words shall have the meaning described in this section, unless the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

(A) [A] "Secondhand dealer" [is hereby defined to] means any person, firm or corporation having a place of business in the City of Las Vegas for purchasing, trading, selling, or dealing in secondhand articles whether junk as defined by NRS 647.010 or other secondhand items. Pawnbrokers shall not be included in this definition, but shall be licensed under Chapter 7 of Title 5.

(B) "Identifiable" means secondhand tangible personal property which bears a serial number or person-

1 alized initials or inscription, and shall in-
2 clude secondhand tangible personal property
3 which, at the time it is acquired by the second-
4 hand dealer, bears evidence of having had a
5 serial number or personalized initials or
6 inscription.

7 SECTION 2: Title V, Chapter 8, Section 7 of the
8 Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1960 Edition,
9 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10 5-8-7: [Every dealer in secondhand goods must keep all goods
11 wares and merchandise, except furniture and carpets,
12 paper and rags, without concealment for a period of
13 fifteen (15) days, after the receipt thereof has
14 been reported to the Metropolitan Police Department,
15 before selling, shipping or otherwise disposing of the
16 same. Furniture and carpets shall be kept for a
17 period of four (4) days only. While in the possession
18 of any secondhand dealer, all goods shall remain
19 subject to inspection by any police officer during
20 normal business hours.]

21 Every dealer in secondhand property must keep without
22 concealment property that is identifiable for a
23 period of ten (10) days and all other secondhand
24 property for a period of four (4) days after the
25 receipt thereof has been reported to the Metropolitan
26 Police Department and before selling, shipping or
27 otherwise disposing of the same. While in the
28 possession of any secondhand dealer, all goods
29 shall remain subject to inspection by any police
30 officer during normal business hours.

31 SECTION 3: If any section, subsection, subdivision,
32 paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Chapter or any

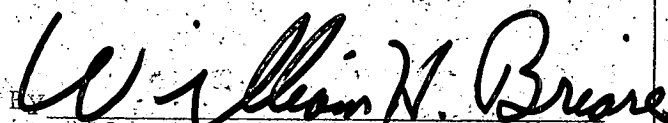
1 part thereof, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or
2 invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction,
3 such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of
4 the remaining portions of this Chapter or any part thereof. The
5 Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada,
6 hereby declares that it would have passed each section, sub-
7 section, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase
8 thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections,
9 subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or
10 phrases be declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

11 SECTION 4: All ordinances or parts of ordinances,
12 sections, subsections, phrases, sentences, clauses or para-
13 graphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas,
14 Nevada, 1960 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

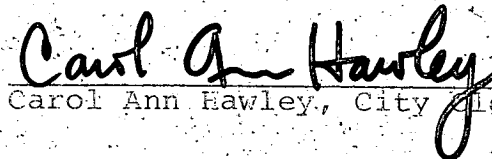
