

ORDINANCE NO. 219

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION THREE OF ORDINANCE NO. 201 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SLAUGHTERING OF ANIMALS AND SANITARY CONDITIONS OF ALL PLACES DISPENSING FOOD AND REFRESHMENT TO THE PUBLIC; PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION OF MEATS AND MEAT PRODUCTS TO BE POSSESSED AND SOLD IN THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS; PROHIBITING THE SALE AND POSSESSION OF UNINSPECTED MEATS FOR HUMAN FOOD; AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF MEAT INSPECTORS; ~~PROHIBITING~~ THE SALE OF MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS BY UNLICENSED ESTABLISHMENTS AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF" approved the fourth day of October, 1933, AS AMENDED.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain:

Section 1. Section Three of the above entitled Ordinance as amended is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. (a) No carcass of any animal mentioned in Section 1 hereof, which has not been inspected and passed as herein provided and which has not been slaughtered in a licensed establishment, where ante and post mortem inspection is possible shall <sup>not</sup> be possessed in the City of Las Vegas, offered for sale or processed for human food, by any person, firm, corporation or association. All animals may be received for slaughter and inspection to be stamped as herein provided at licensed establishments within the City of Las Vegas where there is on duty a veterinary inspector appointed under the department of Agriculture of the United States or a regular veterinarian inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act; provided, that all persons presenting said animals for inspection as herein provided, shall also comply with all the laws of the State of Nevada providing for the inspection of hides or the slaughtering of bovine animals, as provided in Chapter 58 of the Statutes of Nevada, 1931.

(b) The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas is hereby empowered to license one or more establishments within or adjacent to the City of Las Vegas where such carcasses may be slaughtered and inspected, provided such establishments comply with the sanitary requirements established from time to time by ~~the~~ City Board of Health.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct, maintain or operate an establishment for the slaughtering of animals or for the preparation of meat products to be offered for sale in the City of Las Vegas without a permit from the Board of City Commissioners.

(d) Any person desiring to operate and establish for the slaughtering of animals or for the preparation of meat products shall make application to the Live Stock Inspector. The Live Stock Inspector shall make an investigation to determine whether or not the location is satisfactory and the rules and regulations mentioned in Section 14 of this Ordinance, and the laws, rules ~~and~~ regulations of the Federal and State governments affecting the construction, equipment and sanitary maintenance of buildings and equipment of such establishments will be complied with and he shall recommend to the Board of City Commissioners whether or not the applicant should be granted a permit.

(e) The Board of City Commissioners will issue such permit only if it shall find that the laws or ordinances of the United States, the State of Nevada, and the City of Las Vegas affecting the locating, construction, equipment and sanitary maintenance of buildings and equipment of establishments for the slaughtering of animals or the preparation of meat products are being or can be complied with and that the operation of the establishment will comport with the public peace, health and safety.

(f) The Live Stock Inspector shall, from time to time, by and with the approval of the Board of City Commissioners, promulgate rules and regulations to control the location, construction, and maintenance in a sanitary manner of establishments for the slaughtering of animals or for the production of meat products.

(g) The Live Stock Inspector shall provide for both antemortem and postmortem veterinary inspections of all animals slaughtered in establishments for which permits have been issued and for the inspection of carcasses or parts of carcasses and of food products during the time of preparation, transportation and storage. He shall also provide for inspection and supervision of the sanitary form of construction and equipment, and sanitary maintenance of buildings and equipments, of the water supply, drainage sewage, disposal of refuse, and of the sanitary conduct of employees and sanitation of their clothing. All slaughtering shall be conducted on week days between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. except in case of emergency and then only on permission obtained from the Live Stock Inspector, and all preparation of meat food products shall be conducted within hours to be designated by the Live Stock Inspector. Both slaughtering and preparation of meat food products shall be conducted only upon such days as are designated by the Live Stock Inspector and in the presence of himself or his duly authorized representative.

(h) It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or offer for sale, transport or otherwise dispose of, for human consumption in the City of Las Vegas, any carcass or animals herein mentioned, or parts of carcasses of same, unless the same shall be identified by an "Inspection and Passed", or its equivalent, stamp or mark of the City of Las Vegas, Government of the United States, State of Nevada, or city, county, or city and county of Nevada, maintaining a regular meat inspection service under competent veterinary supervision for the proper antemortem and postmortem inspection of all animals slaughtered for the production of human food.

(i) Any meat or meat products found by the Live Stock Inspector in the inspection provided for in this ordinance to be unfit for human food or any carcass or parts of carcasses sold or offered for sale contrary to the provisions hereof, shall be subject to confiscation by the Live Stock Inspector or to treatment which shall satisfy him as to whether or not the articles can be used for human food.

(j) The Live Stock Inspector shall prepare for use on meats or meat products not intended for use as human food, a special stamp setting forth the nature of such products and for what same may be used other than for human consumption.

(k) Any Permit issued under the provisions of this ordinance may be revoked by the Board of City Commissioners at its discretion for violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance or any of the rules and regulations established under the authority hereof, or because the conduct or location of such premises has become a nuisance. Such permit shall be subject to suspension by the Board of City Commissioners for the same cause or causes and until the conditions resulting in such violations are remedied or because the business no longer comports with public health and welfare. During the period of such suspension, the Live Stock Inspector may with the approval of the Board of City Commissioners permit such preparation of food products in an establishment for the slaughtering of animals or for the preparation of meat products, as is absolutely necessary to preserve the food value thereof.

(l) After receipt in a licensed establishment every such animal or carcass thereof shall be inspected, and unless found to be free from disease, and otherwise sound, healthful and wholesome and fit for human food, it shall be marked: "L.V.H.D. Insp'd and Pas'd". If inspection takes place in an official establishment where a regular United States Inspector is maintained, then the rules and regulations of the United States meat inspection laws shall apply.

(m) Wherever "this ordinance", or its equivalent terms is used herein, such term shall include not only the provisions of this ordinance, but the original ordinance as amended, of which this ordinance is an amendment.

(n) If any section, sub-section, subdivision, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not effect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance. The Board of City Commissioners hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, sub-section, subdivision, sentence, clause, and phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, sub-section, subdivisions, clauses or phrases be held invalid.

This Ordinance was read aloud in full for the first time proposed and considered and voted upon this 4th day of May, 1936.

## ORDINANCE NO. 219

An Ordinance to amend Section three of Ordinance No. 201 entitled "An Ordinance regulating the slaughtering of animals and sanitary conditions of all places dispensing food and refreshment to the public; providing for the inspection of meats and meat products to be possessed and sold in the City of Las Vegas; Prohibiting the sale and possession of uninspected meats for human food; Authorizing the appointment of meat inspectors; Prohibiting the sale of meat and meat products by unlicensed establishments and providing a penalty for the violation thereof" approved the fourth day of October, 1933, as amended.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Section Three of the above entitled Ordinance as amended is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 3. (a) No carcass of any animal mentioned in Section 1 hereof, which has not been inspected and passed as herein provided and which has not been slaughtered in a licensed establishment, where ante and post mortem inspection is possible shall not be possessed in the City of Las Vegas, offered for sale or processed for human food, by any person, firm, corporation or association. All animals may be received for slaughter and inspection to be stamped as herein provided at licensed establishments within the City of Las Vegas where there is on duty a veterinary inspector appointed under the department of Agriculture of the United States or a regular veterinarian inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act; provided, that all persons presenting said animals for inspection as herein provided, shall also comply with all the laws of the State of Nevada providing for the inspection of hides or the slaughtering of bovine animals, as provided in Chapter 58 of the Statutes of Nevada, 1931.


