

ORDINANCE NO. 218

An Ordinance defining Garbage and Rubbish and regulating the collection and disposal of garbage, and rubbish in the City of Las Vegas, and matters relating thereto, and providing penalties for the violation of the provisions thereof and repealing certain ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, and other matters relating thereto.

The Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain:

Section 1--For the purpose of this ordinance the word "garbage" shall be held to mean and include and does mean and include all kitchen and table refuse and offal, swill, and also every accumulation of animal, vegetable and other matter that attends the preparation, consumption, sale of, dealing in or storing of meats, fish, fowls, birds, fruits and vegetables unsuitable for culinary purposes. And also all refuse, crockery, bottles, tin vessels, trimmings from lawns and flower gardens, paste board boxes, paper, straw, packing materials, boxes, ashes, and all waste matters, wherever the same may be accumulated within the city limits of the City of Las Vegas, whether at residences, warehouses, storehouses, or other places.

Section 2--It shall be unlawful for any person, company, or corporation having in his, her or its possession or control garbage, to sell, give away, or dispose of such garbage, except as hereinafter provided.

Section 3--All table and kitchen scraps, vegetables and meat scraps suitable for animal or fowl consumption shall be known as "wet garbage", and it shall be placed by the person having control over same in a fit garbage container which shall be free from coffee grounds, glass, metal, wood and all other substances not suitable for animal food, with a tight fitting cover main-

1 tained thereon so as to prevent ingress into the said container
2 of flies.

3 Section 4--All other garbage, excepting that mentioned in the next
4 preceding section, including trash, refuse, rubbish, tin cans,
5 broken glass, glassware, waste matter, scrap material, and all
6 rubbish of any nature the dimensions, weight or size of which will
7 permit shall be known as "dry garbage" and shall be placed in a
8 container suitable to safely secure same separate from the wet
9 garbage.

10
11 Section 5--Every place of business and every dwelling place within
12 the City of Las Vegas must provide and maintain sufficient metal
13 containers of adequate capacity and suitable in size for the
14 collection and storage of garbage and refuse separately. Such
15 containers must be maintained in good conditions, without breaks
16 or leaks, and of such shape and size that the collectors may
17 conveniently carry and dump the garbage therein into trucks used
18 for that purpose without spilling the contents upon themselves or
19 the ground. Such containers shall be placed so as to be readily
20 accessible for removing and emptying by collectors, and they must
21 be protected and secured so as not to be easily overturned by
22 dogs or other animals. Every owner or occupant of premises or
23 person under whose control premises may be, shall keep such
24 premises, including the alley in rear, clean and clear of all
25 garbage, rubbish or refuse or unwholesome matter of every kind.

26 Section 6--All trash, refuse, rubbish, dirt, building material,
27 tree leaves, limbs, trimmings and roots, auto bodies, scrap
28 metal or other scrap material of any nature, shape, size, or
29 weight that cannot be conveniently dumped into the trucks from the
30 containers mentioned in sections 3 and 4 shall be known as
31 "rubbish" and shall be collected by the occupants of the premises
32

1 and conveyed or caused to be conveyed by the occupant of the said
2 premises to the City Dump.

3 Provided, however, occupants of premises may burn small
4 quantities of dry rubbish on the premises such as leaves, paper
5 and lawn and flower cuttings, provided, however, in no event shall
6 any rubbish be burned between two hours before sundown and
7 sunrise of the following day or in such manner or at any such
8 place as to create a fire hazard to his own or another's property.

9 "Rubbish" as herein defined shall not be piled or col-
10 lected or permitted to be piled or collected in any street or
11 alley within the city.

12 Section 7--All garbage mentioned in sections 3 and 4 of this
13 Ordinance shall be removed from the premises under the supervision
14 and direction of the Sewer Commissioner of the City of Las Vegas,
15 and by no other person under such conditions and pursuant to such
16 regulations as said Commissioners shall hereafter from time to
17 time promulgate. After wet and dry garbage shall have been
18 placed in the said containers as herein provided, no person shall
19 disturb the said containers or the contents thereof or remove
20 the same or interfere therewith, except the agents or contractors
21 of the City and under the supervision and direction of the Sewer
22 Commissioner of the City of Las Vegas.

23 Section 8--Provided, however, that any person accumulating wet
24 garbage as herein defined may use the same for the purpose of
25 feeding his own chickens or rabbits wherever by law or city
26 ordinance such person is permitted to keep or maintain chickens or
27 rabbits.

28 Section 9--All "wet garbage", all "dry garbage", and all "rubbish"
29 as defined in sections three, four and six of this Ordinance is
30 hereby declared to be the property of the City of Las Vegas, after
31

1 removal to City Dump.

2 Section 10--Fees for the maintenance of the garbage collection service
3 shall be paid by the owner or occupant of the premises, in an amount
4 and at the time to be fixed from time to time by resolution of the
5 Board, and shall be paid to the City Clerk, who is authorized to
6 give receipt therefor.

7
8 Section 11--Any person violating any of the provisions of this
9 ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
10 conviction of same, shall be punished by a fine of not less than
11 five dollars and not exceeding the sum of two hundred and fifty
12 dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail until such fine is
13 paid at the rate of but not exceeding two dollars for each day of
14 such fine, in case such fine is not paid, or by imprisonment in
15 the City Jail for a period not to exceed thirty days, or by both
16 such fine and imprisonment.

17
18 Section 12--Ordinance No. 138 entitled "An ordinance regulating
19 the collection and fixing and establishing of rates and compensa-
20 tion to be collected by any person, company or corporation collect-
21 ing garbage in the City of Las Vegas, and repealing Ordinance No.
22 80 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance of the City of
23 Las Vegas regulating the storage and removal of garbage, offal,
24 and refuse, animal and vegetable matter", approved January 6,
25 1921, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict there-
26 with," approved July 5th, 1929, and all ordinances and parts of
27 ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.







Section 8—Provided, however, that any person accumulating wet garbage as herein defined may use the same for the purpose of feeding his own chickens or rabbits wherever by law or city ordinance such person is permitted to keep or maintain chickens or rabbits.

Section 9—All wet garbage, all dry garbage, and all "rubbish" as defined in sections three, four and six of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be the property of the City of Las Vegas, after removal to City Dump.

Section 10—Fees for the maintenance of the garbage collection service shall be paid by the owner or occupant of the premises, in an amount and at the time to be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Board, and shall be paid to the City Clerk, who is authorized to give receipt therefor.

Section 11—Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction of same, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars and not exceeding the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail until such fine is paid, at the rate of, but not exceeding, two dollars for each day of such fine, in case such fine is not paid, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 12—Ordinance No. 139, entitled, "An ordinance regulating the collection and fixing and establishing of rates and compensation to be collected by any person, company or corporation collecting garbage in the City of Las Vegas, and repealing Ordinance No. 80 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled, "An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas regulating the storage and removal of garbage, offal, and refuse, animal and vegetable matter," approved January 6, 1921, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith, approved July 5th, 1929, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 13—This Ordinance shall be and become effective immediately after its adoption, approval and the publication thereof for two consecutive weeks in the Las Vegas Review Journal, a daily newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas, and its final passage.

This Ordinance was read aloud in full for the first time, proposed, considered and voted upon this 18th day of December, 1935.
