3 AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKS, RECREATION AND SENIOR CITIZEN
4 ACTIVITIES; REPEALING TITLE 13, CHAPTER 36, OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE
5 OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, 1983 EDITION, AND ADOPTING IN
6 LIEU THEREOF A NEW CHAPTER, DESIGNATED AS CHAPTER 36, PROVIDING
7 FOR THE DIRECTOR AND DEPUTIES WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS,
8 RECREATION AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACTIVITIES, PROVIDING FOR THE
9 ESTABLISHMENT OF RULES AND FEES FOR THE USE OF PARKS AND OTHER
RECREATIONAL FACILITIES AND FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY SAID
DEPARTMENT, DESIGNATING CHILDREN'S PARKS, PROVIDING FOR GROUP USE
OF PARKS AND PERMITTING THE CLOSURE OF SUCH FACILITIES UPON
CERTAIN CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING
THERETO; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS HEREOF; AND REPEALING
ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

tion of rules and fees for the use
of parks, facilities and services
provided by said Department; desig-

sure of parks under certain circum-
stances.

16 THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA DOES
17 HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

18 SECTION 1: Title 13, Chapter 36, of the Municipal
19 Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby
20 repealed.

21 SECTION 2: Title 13 of the Municipal Code of the
22 City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to add
23 thereto a new chapter, to be designated as Chapter 36, reading as
24 follows:

25 Article 1. Administration

26 13.36.010: The Director of Parks, Recreation and Senior
27 Citizen Activities shall exercise such powers and perform such
28 duties as may be specified by the City Council or the City
29 Manager.

30 13.36.020: (A) The Director shall be appointed by, and shall
31 hold office at the pleasure of the City Manager, subject to rati-
32 fication and approval of the City Council.

1 (B) The Director shall receive such compensation as may from
2 time to time be fixed by the City Council.

3 13.36.030: The Director may be allowed such deputies and
4 assistants as in the judgment of the City Council may be
5 necessary, and the compensation of such deputies and assistants
6 shall be fixed and determined from time to time by the City
7 Council.

8 13.36.040: The Director, after review by the Parks and
9 Recreation Advisory Commission, shall recommend to the City
10 Council:

11 (A) Rules and regulations for the use by the public of the
12 City's parks and other recreational facilities; and

13 (B) A schedule of fees to be paid for certain uses of such
14 parks and recreational facilities and for certain services pro-
15 vided by the Department.

16 13.36.050: (A) Upon the adoption by the City Council of rules
17 and regulations which govern the use of the City's parks and
18 recreational facilities and a schedule of fees, three copies of
19 each shall be maintained in the Office of the City Clerk for
20 review by the public upon request.

21 (B) The Director shall cause to be posted at each park or
22 other recreational facility a copy of the rules and regulations
23 which govern the use of such park or facility, or a summary of
24 such rules.

25 Article II. Children's Parks

26 13.36.060: That certain park of the City known as Fantasy
27 Park, and such other parks as may hereafter be established pri-
28 marily for use by small children, is hereby designated as a
29 children's park.

30 13.36.070: From and after April 16, 1969, no person over the
31 age of twelve years, other than a parent, guardian or other
32 responsible person accompanying a child of the age of twelve

1 years or younger, shall visit, frequent, be present in or loiter
2 around any park which is designated in or pursuant to LVMC
3 §13.36.060 as a children's park.

4 Article III. Group Use

5 13.16.080: Any person who desires to use any park or
6 recreational facility of the City for a group of 25 individuals or
7 more, or any person who desires to conduct some event in which it
8 could reasonably be assumed that 25 or more persons might gather
9 at a park or recreational facility of the City to participate in
10 or witness such event, shall first apply and obtain a permit from
11 the Director. This Section does not apply to any event which is
12 sponsored by the Department.

13 13.36.090: The Director may deny or condition the issuance of
14 any permit which is applied for pursuant to LVMC §13.36.090 in
15 order to:

16 (A) Protect the use and enjoyment of the park or facility
17 for other members of the public;

18 (B) Protect the health and safety of all persons who visit
19 the park or facility;

20 (C) Ensure that there is adequate parking and sanitary faci-
21 lities to accommodate all persons who use the park or facility;

22 (D) Protect the grounds, equipment, vegetation, buildings,
23 fences and other amenities of the park or facility from damage,
24 overuse or destruction;

25 (E) Provide that the park or facility and the surrounding
26 area is kept clean and free from debris;

27 (F) Ensure that the group use does not disturb or annoy per-
28 sons who occupy land which is nearby such park or facility.

29 13.36.100: Any person who is aggrieved by the failure to issue
30 such a permit or a condition which is placed upon such a permit
31 may appeal the same to the City Council by written request filed
32 with the City Clerk.

1 Article IV. Hours of Closure

2 13.36.110: The City Council authorizes and empowers the City
3 Manager to establish the hours of closure of any of the City's
4 parks according to the following standards and criteria:

5 (A) When the presence of criminal activity in a park
6 necessitates the closure or limitation of public access to such
7 park; or

8 (B) When the peace and quiet of the surrounding neighborhood
9 is substantially disturbed by activities in a park; or

10 (C) When acts of vandalism have occurred in a park.

11 13.36.120: Except when action by the City Manager has
12 established different hours of closure of certain of the City's
13 parks pursuant to LVMC §13.36.110, all of the City's parks shall
14 be open to the public between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and
15 9:00 p.m. and during such other hours as may be appropriate to
16 accommodate events or activities which are sponsored by the
17 Department.

18 13.36.130: Upon establishing hours of closure for a park, the
19 City Manager shall cause to be posted in conspicuous places in
20 the park signs notifying the general public of the hours that the
21 park is closed.

22 Article V. Penalties

23 13.36.140: It is unlawful for any person to disobey the rules
24 and regulations which govern the parks or other recreational
25 facilities which have been posted pursuant to subsection (B) of
26 LVMC §13.36.050.

27 13.36.150: It is unlawful for any person without lawful
28 authority to attempt to or alter, deface, injure, knock down or
29 remove the rules and regulations which have been posted pursuant
30 to subsection (B) of LVMC §13.36.050.

31 13.36.160: (A) It is unlawful for any person over the age of
32 eighteen years, unless accompanying and responsible for a child

1 of the age of twelve years or younger, to visit, frequent, be
2 present in or loiter around any park which is designated in or
3 pursuant to LVMC §13.36.060 as a children's park.

4 B. Any peace officer who finds or observes any child
5 over the age of twelve years and under the age of eighteen years
6 within the confines of any park which is designated in or pur-
7 suant to LVMC §13.36.060 as a children's park, unless such child
8 is accompanying and is responsible for another child of the age
9 of twelve years or younger, shall take such child to the Clark
10 County Juvenile Hall. Such peace officer shall immediately
11 thereafter make a full and complete report in writing in tripli-
12 cate, transmitting one copy to the office of the Juvenile
13 Probation Officer of the County and another copy to the Juvenile
14 Judge of the Eighth Judicial District Court of the State of
15 Nevada, in and for the County of Clark.

16 13.36.170: It is unlawful for any person to go upon, remain in
17 or stop, stand or park any motor vehicle in any park, including
18 any parking lot therein or any publicly maintained parking lot
19 immediately adjacent thereto, during the time that it is closed
20 when signs have been posted in the park which specify the hours
21 of closure pursuant to LVMC §13.36.130.

22 13.36.180: It is unlawful to drink any alcoholic beverage or
23 intoxicating liquor or to possess such beverage or liquor in an
24 open container in the parking lots or play ground areas of any of
25 the City's parks.

26 13.36.190: It is unlawful for any person to make use of a park
27 or facility when a permit is required without having been issued
28 a permit as required by this Chapter.

29 13.36.200: It is unlawful for any person to conduct, operate,
30 advertise, sell tickets to or promote any rock concert or the
31 playing of amplified music whether for free or for a paid con-
32 sideration, unless such rock concert is licensed pursuant to LVMC

1 Chapter 6.73.

2 13.36.210: It is unlawful to bring, leave, turn loose or allow
3 to go any horse, cow, ox, sheep, goat, ass, swine, dog or fowl of
4 any kind in or upon a City park; provided, however, that this
5 section shall not apply to:

6 (A) Horses being led, ridden or driven upon any road or path
7 therein;

8 (B) Dogs which are fastened to or led by a chain or line of
9 suitable strength which is not more than eight feet in length.

10 SECTION 3: If any section, subsection, subdivision,
11 paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Chapter or any part
12 thereof, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid
13 or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such deci-
14 sion shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the
15 remaining portions of this Chapter or any part thereof. The
16 City Council of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, hereby declares
17 that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision,
18 paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the
19 fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions,
20 paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitu-
21 tional, invalid or ineffective.

22 SECTION 4: Whenever in this ordinance any act is
23 prohibited or is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or
24 a misdemeanor, or whenever in this ordinance the doing of any act
25 is required or the failure to do any act is made or declared to
26 be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, the doing of any such
27 prohibited act or the failure to do any such required act shall
28 constitute a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be
29 punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment
30 for a term of not more than six (6) months, or by any combination
31 of such fine and imprisonment. Any day of any violation of this
32 ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

RULES AND REGULATIONS
FOR THE USE BY THE PUBLIC
OF THE CITY'S PARKS AND OTHER
RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

The following rules and regulations have been adopted in accordance with Section 13.36.040 of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, and a violation of any of such rules constitutes a misdemeanor pursuant to Section 13.36.140 of said Code.

1. The consumption of alcoholic beverages or the possession of any open container that contains any such beverage is strictly forbidden in the playgrounds, children's play areas and parking lots of the parks and recreational facilities of the City of Las Vegas.

2. Certain areas in such parks may be posted with signs which designate those areas as playgrounds or children's play areas that are reserved exclusively for children who are under the age of 12 years. The presence of an adult in any such area is prohibited unless such adult is supervising or has the care, custody and control, or both, of a child who is playing in that area.

3. Visitors to such parks may bring dogs into the parks. However, any such visitor who brings a dog into a park is strictly responsible for the dog's actions while it is present in the park. Any dog that is brought into a park must be kept on a leash at all times while it is within the confines of the park.

It is unlawful for any person to bring a dog into any area that is posted with a sign which indicates that the presence of dogs is prohibited or is designated for sports or as a playground. Any dog that is seen running at large within the confines of any such park is subject to impoundment by the City's Animal Control Division. Pursuant to ordinance, the owner of any dog which is permitted to run at large in a park is subject to prosecution for a misdemeanor.

4. It is unlawful for any person to permit, allow or bring any type of animal, other than a dog, into a park without a special permit that is issued by the Director of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Senior Citizen Activities, which permit shall state the conditions under which such animal is permitted in the park, including a condition that prohibits permitting such animal to run at large.

5. The presence of vehicles and their use within such parks is a matter that is within the sole discretion of the Director of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Senior Citizen Activities, and a permit therefor must first be obtained from said Director.

6. No vehicle may be driven anywhere within the confines of any such park except in an area in which a sign clearly indicates that such is permitted. Any such sign may also limit the hours during which vehicles are permitted in such area.

7. No private vehicle may be driven anywhere in any such park other than on a paved and clearly marked asphalt road or parking lot. A failure to obey the signs that regulate vehicular traffic and parking which are posted in a park is unlawful.

8. Visitors may light fires in barbeques that may be provided by the City in a park or they may bring their own barbeque equipment. Building a fire which is not contained within such equipment is prohibited.

9. No person, other than law enforcement personnel, may be in possession of any fireworks, firearm or weapon of any type in any such park.

10. No person may sell food, programs or commercial goods of any sort within the confines of any such park without first obtaining a permit to do so from the Director of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Senior Citizen Activities.

11. Persons may bring metal detectors into the parks and may use the same to locate surface articles, but digging or excavating in a park in conjunction with the use of a metal detector is unlawful.

12. Except as a part of a golf program that is sponsored by, and supervised by personnel of, the Department of Parks, Recreation and Senior Citizen Activities, no person may play golf in any form or practice golf swings or golf shots

within the confines of any such park because of the dangers that such activities pose to other visitors to the park.

13. Abuse, defacing or destruction of property that belongs in or to any such park is unlawful.

14. No person may play music, either from records or tapes or in live performances, through an amplifier or a loudspeaker, or both, unless a permit therefor has first been obtained from the Director of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Senior Citizen Activities.

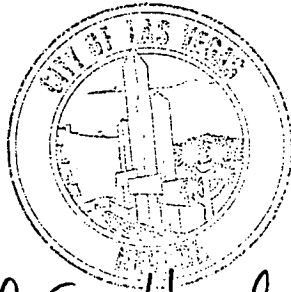
