Ordinance No. 6

An Ordinance to Prohibit the Use of Profane, Vile or Obscene Language on the Streets or Other Public Places in Las Vegas.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain,

Sec. 1. The use of profane, vile or obscene language or words upon the public streets, alleys, or highway of the City of Las Vegas is hereby prohibited.

Sec. 2. Immodest, improper, or indecent behavior upon any public street or highway, or in any store, hotel, saloon or other public place within said City of Las Vegas, is hereby prohibited.

Sec. 3. Any person violating either of the foregoing sections of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding three hundred dollars (300.00), or imprisoned not more than one hundred and fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

The foregoing ordinance was read in full to the Board. After due consideration by the Board it was, upon motion of Commissioner McGovern, seconded by Commissioner Stewart and duly carried ordered that the foregoing ordinance be adopted as read and the clerk instructed to have the same published as by law provided, the vote being cast as follows:
