Ordinance No. 9

An Ordinance to Provide for the Ringing of a Curfew Bell.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain:

It is hereby made the duty of the Chief of Police to provide that a curfew bell shall be rung at 9 o'clock p. m. of each and every day between June first and September first of each year, and at 8 o'clock p. m. of each and every day of the year other than those above mentioned, and upon the ringing thereof all children under the age of sixteen years shall be and remain off from the public streets of said City.

The foregoing ordinance was read in full to the Board. After due consideration by the Board it was upon motion of Commissioner McGovern, seconded by Commissioner Coughlin and duly carried ordered that the foregoing ordinance be adopted as read and the clerk instructed to have the same published as by law provided, the vote being cast as follows:
