## Ordinance No. 12

### An Ordinance to Preserve the Peace and Good Order of Las Vegas, Nevada.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain:

Section 1. Any person or persons who shall engage in any fight, or who shall challenge another person to fight; or who shall use profane, indecent, obscene or opprobrious epithets, or language in addressing any other person or persons in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, or any person who shall be guilty of any disorderly conduct in said city of Las Vegas shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the city jail of said city for any period not exceeding fifty days;

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval.

Upon motion of Stewart and seconded by Coughlin it was unanimously voted by the entire board that this ordinance be an emergency ordinance.
