

Ordinance No 80

An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas establishing a City Dump ground and regulating the Storage and Removal of Garbage.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

2 Sec. 1. That the city dump grounds for garbage, rubbish, etc.
3 be and the same is hereby established at and on that certain
4 piece or parcel of land, owned by said City of Las Vegas, situ-
5 ated within the corporate limits of said City of Las Vegas and
6 more particularly described as follows, to-wit. Commencing at
7 a point marked V. R. No. 5, located at the Southwest Corner of
8 the North half of the Southwest Quarter of Section twenty-six,
9 Township twenty South of Range sixty-one East, Mount Diablo
10 Base and Meridian, Clark County, Nevada, from whence the south-
11 west Corner of said Section bears South 0° 04' East 1319.0 ft.;
12 thence North 0° 04' West 208.71 ft.; thence North 89° 58' East
13 626.13 ft.; thence South 0° 04' E. 208.71 ft.; thence South
14 89° 58' West 626.13 ft. to the place of beginning, containing an
15 are of 3.00 acres, more or less.

16 Sec. 2. All garbage, rubbish and the like must be delivered
17 at the City dump grounds; but no part thereof shall be de-
18 posited at any other place within the City limits unless a
19 dumping ground is provided therefor by the Board of Commissioners
20 of said City. Said garbage, rubbish etc. shall be removed in
21 such way that no part thereof will be permitted to drop or be
22 scattered along the streets, alleys or other places over which
23 said garbage, rubbish etc. is transported.

24 Sec. 3. Any one gathering offal, swill or refuse material
25 shall collect the same in water-tight metal containers, with
26 close fitting covers, which shall be emptied at least once in
27 forty-eight hours. No vehicle so employed shall stand on any
28 street or alley longer than is necessary to transact such busi-
29 ness.

30 Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of every owner, tenant, lessee,
31 or occupant of any store, shop, business house, vegetable stand,
32 market, hotel, restaurant, boarding house, and every house,
building or store of any kind whatsoever, in the City of Las
Vegas, to provide upon or within said premises hereinabove in
this section set forth, suitable receptacles of tin, sheet or
galvanized iron, or other substantial material having snug and
tight fitting cover thereto, and to place and deposit imme-
diately upon its formation, all matter, waste and garbage of
any kind coming from or accumulated in any manner upon said
premises, in said receptacles.

 Sec. 5. Said receptacles containing such waste matter and
garbage shall be kept in a suitable and convenient place upon
said premises and must not be kept or placed in any public street,
alley, road, or upon any sidewalk or in any place whatsoever
where they will be a nuisance.

 Sec. 6. Said receptacles must at all times be kept tightly
sealed, and the owner, tenant, lessee or occupant of any kind
of the premises mentioned in Section 4 hereinabove, whereon or
wherein said garbage and waste matter is accumulated or created
must, before said garbage or waste matter becomes foul or
prejudicial to public health or private comfort, have the same
removed and carried away and deposited at and upon said City
dumping ground.

 Sec. 7. Any violation of any of the provisions of this
Ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor, and every person, firm
or corporation found guilty of violating any of said provisions
shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than Ten
Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or imprisoned in the
City Jail until such fine is paid at the rate of not exceeding
one day for each two dollars of such fine in case such fine is
not paid, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding three
months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

1 Sec. 8. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in operation
2 on and after its adoption and publication for the period of one
3 week (one issue) in _____, a weekly

Ordinance No. 80

An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas Regulating the Storage and removal of garbage, offal, and refuse, animal and vegetable matter.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Sec. 1. It is hereby made the duty of the occupant or occupants of every dwelling house or other building in the city of Las Vegas to provide a suitable and water-tight box or other vessel, of a convenient size to be handled by the garbage collector, in which said occupant or occupants shall cause to be placed or deposited all offal, garbage, and refuse, animal and vegetable matter, of the premises. Such occupants shall keep such box or other vessel at a place on the premises most accessible to the person collecting the garbage and offal, and it shall be unlawful to put any but refuse animal and vegetable matter in the vessel used for garbage and offal. Such vessel shall have a snug and tight fitting cover thereto, and such vessel shall not be kept or placed in any public street, alley, road, or upon any sidewalk or in any place whatsoever where it will be a nuisance. Such vessel must at all times be kept tightly sealed.

Sec. 2. All garbage and offal shall be collected in water-tight closed vehicles; and each vehicle shall be purified as often as the health officer may direct, and shall have painted thereon the word "Garbage."

Sec. 3. No person shall engage or assist in collecting, removing, or disposing of garbage or offal within the City of Las Vegas except as provided in this ordinance, and also so authorized by a permit from the health officer of the city; and it shall be unlawful for any person to interfere in any manner with the collection or disposal of garbage and offal by the person or persons authorized to do so.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of any person contracting with the city for the collection or disposal of garbage to comply with the Ordinances of the city, and also with such orders and regulations as may be made by the board of health.

Sec. 5. No person except the city contractor or his agents shall carry, convey, or transport any garbage through the streets, alleys, or public places of the city, except upon permission of the board of health; and that the Board of City Commissioners shall have power, from time to time, to designate the hours during which the collection of garbage may be conducted, and the place where such box or vessel shall be placed by the occupant of such premises or garage.

Sec. 6. Any violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor, and every person, firm or corporation found guilty of violating any of said provisions shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than five Dollars nor more than one Hundred dollars, or imprisoned in the City Jail until such fine is paid at the rate of not exceeding one day for each two dollars of such fine in case such fine is not paid, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in operation on and after its adoption and publication for a period of one week (one issue) in Las Vegas Age, a weekly newspaper published in said City of Las Vegas.

ORDINANCE No. 80

An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas Regulating the Storage and Removal of Garbage, Offal and Refuse, Animal and Vegetable matter.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Sec. 1. It is hereby made the duty of the occupant or occupants of every dwelling house or other building in the City of Las Vegas to provide a suitable and water-tight box or other vessel, of a convenient size to be handled by the garbage collector, in which said occupant or occupants shall cause to be placed or deposited all offal, garbage, and refuse, animal and vegetable matter, of the premises. Such occupants shall keep such box or other vessel at a place on the premises most accessible to the person collecting the garbage and offal, and it shall be unlawful to put any but refuse animal and vegetable matter in the vessel used for garbage and offal. Such vessel shall have a snug and tight fitting cover thereto, and such vessel shall not be kept or placed in any public street, alley, road, or upon any sidewalk or in any place whatsoever, where it will be a nuisance. Such vessel must at all times be kept tightly sealed.

Sec. 2. All garbage and offal shall be collected in water-tight closed vehicles; and each vehicle shall be purified as often as the health officer may direct, and shall have painted thereon the word, "Garbage."

Sec. 3. No person shall engage or assist in collecting, removing, or disposing of garbage or offal within the City of Las Vegas except as provided in this Ordinance, and also so authorized by a permit from the health officer of the City; and it shall be unlawful for any person to interfere in any manner with the collection or disposal of garbage and offal by the person or persons authorized to do so.

Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of any person contracting with the City for the collection or disposal of garbage to comply with the Ordinances of the City, and also with such orders and regulations as may be made by the board of health.

Sec. 5. No person except the City contractor or his agents shall carry, convey, or transport any garbage through the streets, alleys, or public places of the City, except upon permission of the board of health; and that the Board of City Commissioners shall have power, from time to

time, by Resolution, to designate the hours during which the collection of garbage may be conducted, and the place where such box or vessel shall be placed by the occupant of such premises on garbage collection days and during garbage collection hours.

Sec. 6. Any violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor, and every person, firm or corporation found guilty of violating any of said provisions shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than Five Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or imprisoned in the City Jail until such fine is paid at the rate of not exceeding one day for each two dollars of such fine in case such fine is not paid, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in operation on and after its adoption and publication for a period of one week (one issue) in the Las Vegas Age, a weekly newspaper published in said City of Las Vegas.
