

Ordinance No. 155

An Ordinance regulating the practice of civil engineering and surveying in the City of Las Vegas, providing for the examination and licensing of persons engaged in the same, creating an examination board, and providing for a violation thereof.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do Ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. The practice of civil engineering and surveying, or either, in the City of Las Vegas is subject to the regulations prescribed in this Ordinance, and it shall be unlawful for any person to practice civil engineering and surveying, or either, unless he shall obtain a license ~~so to do, as provided~~ <sup>and shall be registered</sup> in this Ordinance.

Sec. 2. No person shall be entitled to obtain a license to practice civil engineering and surveying, or either, from the City of Las Vegas, without first undergoing before a Board of Examination an examination as to his qualifications and competency as a Civil Engineer and surveyor, or either, and procuring from such Board a registration certificate thereof, except as hereinafter provided. Said Board of Examination shall consist of three members, to be appointed by the Board of City Commissioners, each of whom shall be a licensed and registered Civil Engineer, as defined by this Ordinance. Not more than one representative of any one engineering organization shall at any one time be a member of said Board of Examination. Such Board shall organize, adopt rules and regulations for its guidance, and elect one of its members to be President and another its Secretary. An affirmative vote of a majority of such Board at a regular or special meeting thereof shall be sufficient to authorize the issuance of such certificate to any applicant therefor upon such examination, such certificate to be signed by the President and Secretary of such Board. The Board of City Commissioners may at any time remove any member of such Board and appoint his successor. The records of said Board of Examination shall at all times be open to the inspection of the Mayor and any Commissioner of the City of Las Vegas, and such Board of Examination shall make such reports to said Board of City Commissioners from time to time as may be required by said Board of City Commissioners.

Sec. 3. No person shall be eligible to have issued to him the certificate provided for in Sec. 1 of this Ordinance who does not possess a good moral character, who is not more than twenty-one years of age and has resided in the State of Nevada for a period of six months prior to the issuance of such certificate, and shall be a graduate from a school of engineering of recognized reputation and shall have had two years experience in the practice of the profession for which he seeks such certificate, or shall have had six years experience in such profession, two years of which he shall have been engaged in responsible charge of the work of such profession. Each applicant for examination shall present to such Board of Examination an affidavit setting forth therein the period of his residence in the State of Nevada, his education and experience in the profession for which he seeks a certificate, and his age. The application for examination shall be accompanied by a receipt issued by the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas, showing that he has paid the sum of \$15.00 as an examination fee. Such examination shall be held by the Board of Examination not more than thirty days after the filing of the application, of which the applicant shall receive at least three days notice. Any person who has the qualifications prescribed in this section, and who has been actively engaged in the practice of his profession in the City of Las Vegas for a period of one year immediately prior to the taking effect of this Ordinance shall be granted a certificate of registration without examination upon the payment to the City Clerk of a registration fee of Ten Dollars, if paid within ten days after this Ordinance takes effect, and pays the license fee as hereinafter provided for. The scope of the examination shall be prescribed by said Board of Examination. Said Board of Examination shall keep on file in the office of the City Clerk a register of all applicants for certificates of registration, rejected applicants, and registered engineers and/or

surveyors. Each applicant who shall pass such examination shall be issued by said Board of Examination a registration certificate upon payment of a Ten Dollar registration fee and a license fee of Three Dollars to the City Clerk. Such fee of Three Dollars shall be a license fee for the practicing of such profession for one year or a fraction thereof. The City Clerk, upon such payment being made shall issue a City license therefor, but no such City license shall entitle the holder to practice his profession unless he shall also be a registered civil engineer and/or surveyor as herein provided. The license year shall commence on January first of each year and end on the 31st day of December of the same year, beginning with the year 1930. Such license shall be renewed at the beginning of each year. Each member of the Board of Examination shall be entitled to receive from the City of Las Vegas the sum of \$5.00 each out of each examination fee for each person so examined, which shall be in full compensation for all services rendered under this Ordinance, but to be entitled to receive such amount the member of such Board of Examination must have participated in the holding of such examination.

Sec. 4. Said Board of Examination shall have the power and it shall be its duty to cancel and annul the certificate of registration provided for in the preceding sections of this Ordinance, of any person holding the same, should it ascertain: 1. That such person has done, or habitually does any work in his profession, which indicates that the holder of such certificate is unqualified to practice such profession. 2. That such person has practised fraud or deception in procuring the certificate of registration. 3. That such person practices fraud or deception in the practice of his profession. 4. That such person has been convicted of a felony.

In prescribing procedure for the determination of the truth or falsity of any charge against a registered civil engineer and/or surveyor having for its purpose the revocation of his certificate of registration the accused person shall in every case have reasonable notice of and opportunity to appear and be heard at any meeting thereon.

It shall be unlawful for any person, whose certificate of registration has been so cancelled or annulled, to again engage in the work of his profession of civil engineer and/or surveyor in the City of Las Vegas until he has been reinstated by the Board of Examination and a new certificate of registration issued to him

Sec. 5. A license shall be required of a level man, instrument man, transit man or other person considered in responsible charge of work in the profession in field or office and they may obtain same without being registered by furnishing an affidavit that they are working under a registered civil engineer and/or surveyor, and such license shall only allow them to work under a registered civil engineer and/or surveyor. The amount and time of the payment of the license fee shall be the same as that provided for in Section 3 hereinabove. No such registration or license shall be required of laborers, axmen, rodmen, flagmen, chainmen or others performing labor in a minor capacity. The terms of this Ordinance shall not apply to engineers working for the United States Government, the State of Nevada or any railroad company unless they engage in private practice as civil engineer and/or surveyor in the City of Las Vegas, nor shall the same apply to non-resident engineers and/or surveyors who come into the City of Las Vegas for consultation, collecting information or to give expert testimony in court.

Sec. 6. All maps of surveys which must be approved by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas shall be certified by a registered and licensed civil engineer and/or surveyor.

Sec. 7. Definitions. A surveyor, within the meaning of this Ordinance is one who practices the art of surveying. A civil engineer within the meaning of this ordinance is one who practices any branch of the profession of engineering other than mining, metallurgical, military or architecture. The profession of civil engineering embraces the design and supervision of the construction of all public and private utilities and other works which require experience, and the

same technical knowledge as engineering schools of recognized reputation prescribe for graduation, except those in connection with mining operations exclusively.

Exceptions. This ordinance shall not apply so far as relates to the completion of existing contracts held by any civil engineer and/or surveyor at the date of its going into effect for civil engineering and or surveying services to be performed in said City of Las Vegas.

Sec. 8. It shall be unlawful for any surveyor or civil engineer to permit another who is not registered and licensed to operate under his registration and/or license except in such line as does not require registration and license, unless such person is employed by such registered civil engineer and/or surveyor and holds a license as hereinabove provided.

Sec. 9. Engineers and/or surveyors from outside the City of Las Vegas, except those specifically excepted in Sec. 7 hereinabove, who are employed by the City of Las Vegas on municipal works, shall be governed by this Ordinance, except in the matter of six months residence in the State of Nevada, for the period of the particular work for which they are employed. After the completion of said work, if such engineers and/or surveyors desire to continue the practice of the profession in Las Vegas, they shall be governed by this Ordinance in its entirety, except that he shall be entitled to have credited upon the residence requirement such period as he shall have been in the employment of the City of Las Vegas.

County work of the County of Clark, or State work of the State of Nevada

Sec. 10. Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of a violation of this Ordinance, or any section thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punishable by a fine of not exceeding two hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not exceeding one hundred days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 11. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 12. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after a period of ten days after its passage, approval and completed publication for a period of one week (issues) in Las Vegas Age, a tri-weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas.

An Ordinance regulating the practice of civil engineering and surveying in the City of Las Vegas, providing for the examination, registration and licensing of persons engaged in the same, creating an examination board, and providing for a violation thereof.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Sec. 1. The practice of civil engineering and surveying, or either, in the City of Las Vegas is subject to the regulations prescribed in this Ordinance, and it shall be unlawful for any person to practice civil engineering and surveying, or either, unless he shall obtain a license so to do, as provided in this Ordinance.

Sec. 2. No person shall be entitled to obtain a license to practice civil engineering and surveying, or either, from the City of Las Vegas, without first undergoing before a Board of Examination ~~an examination~~ as to his qualifications and competency as a Civil Engineer and surveyor, or either, and procuring from such Board a certificate thereof. ~~Said Board of Examination shall~~ consist of three members, to be appointed by the Board of City Commissioners, each of whom shall be a licensed and registered Civil Engineer, as defined by this Ordinance. Such Board shall organize, adopt rules and regulations for its guidance, and elect one of its members to be President and another its Secretary. An affirmative vote of a majority of such Board at a regular or special meeting thereof shall be sufficient to authorize the issuance of such certificate to any applicant therefor upon such examination, such certificate to be signed by the President and Secretary of such Board. The Board of City Commissioners may at any time remove any member of such Board and appoint his successor. The records of said Board of Examination shall at all times be open to the inspection of the Mayor and any Commissioner of the City of Las Vegas, and such Board of Examination shall make such reports to said Board of City Commissioners from time to time as may be required by said Board of City Commissioners.

Sec. 3. No person shall be eligible to have issued to him the certificate provided for in Sec. 1 of this Ordinance who does not possess a good moral character, ~~and has resided~~ <sup>who is not more than 21 years of age</sup> in the State of Nevada for a period of six months prior to the issuance of such certificate, and shall be a college graduate ~~with two years experience in the practice of the~~ <sup>from a school of engineering of recognized reputation,</sup> profession for which he seeks such certificate, or shall have had six years experience in such profession, two years of which he shall have been engaged in responsible charge of the work of such profession. Each applicant for examination shall present to such Board of Examination an affidavit setting forth therein the period of his residence in the State of Nevada, his education and experience in the profession for which he seek a certificate, and his age. The application for examination shall be accompanied by a receipt issued by the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas, showing that he has paid the sum of \$25.00 as an examination fee. Any person who has the qualifications prescribed in this section, and who has been actively engaged in the practice of his profession in the City of Las Vegas for a period of one year prior to the ~~enactment~~ <sup>taking effect</sup> of this Ordinance shall be granted a certificate of registration without examination, upon payment of said fee of \$25.00.

The scope of the examination shall be prescribed by said Board of Examination. Said Board of Examination shall keep in the office of the City Clerk a register of all applicants for certificates of registration, rejected applicants, and registered civil engineers and/or surveyors. Each applicant ~~for examination~~ who shall pass such examination and each engineer and/or surveyor who shall have paid the above fee in case no examination is required by the terms of this section, shall

*not more than one representative of any one engineering organization shall at any one time be a member of said Board of Examination.*

*Such examination shall be held by the Board of Examination not more than thirty days after the filing of the application, of which the applicant shall receive at least three days notice.*

That such person has been convicted of a felony.

In prescribing procedure for the determination of the truth or falsity of any charge against a registered civil engineer and/or surveyor having for its purpose the revocation of his certificate of registration the accused person shall in every case have reasonable notice of and opportunity to appear and be heard at any hearing thereon.

It shall be unlawful for any person, whose certificate of registration has been so cancelled or annulled, to again engage in the work of his profession of civil engineer and/or surveyor in the City of Las Vegas until he has been reinstated by the Board of Examination and a new certificate of registration issued to him.

Sec. 5. ~~No registration or license shall be required of a level man, instrument man, transit man or other person~~ <sup>considered in responsible charge of work in the profession in field or office,</sup> but no such registration or license shall be required of laborers, axmen, rodmen, flagmen, chainmen or others performing labor in a minor capacity.

Sec. 6. All maps <sup>of surveys, which must be approved by the City Commissioner</sup> shall be certified by a registered and licensed civil engineer and/or surveyor.

Sec. 7. Definitions. A surveyor is the ~~one~~ <sup>person</sup> practicing of the art of surveying. A civil engineer is the ~~practice~~ <sup>practice</sup> of any branch of the profession of engineering other than mining, metallurgical, military, ~~and~~ architecture. The profession embraces the design and supervision of the construction of all public and private utilities and other works which require experience, and the same technical knowledge as engineering schools of recognized reputation prescribe for graduation, except those in connection with mining operations exclusively.

Exceptions. This ordinance shall not apply to anyone having at the date of its going into effect an existing contract in writing for surveying or civil engineering services in said City of Las Vegas.

Sec. 8. It shall be unlawful for any surveyor or civil engineer to permit another who is not registered and licensed to operate under his registration and/or license except in such line as does not require registration and license, unless such person is employed by such <sup>civil engineer</sup> and/or surveyor and holds a license as provided in Sec. 5 of this ordinance.

Civil Engineers employed by the U.S. Government, the State of Nevada or any railroad company are to be exempt from the operation of this ordinance unless they engage in private practice as civil engineers and/or surveyors in the City of Las Vegas.

Sec. 11. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Engineers and / or surveyors from outside the City of Las Vegas, except those specifically excepted in Sec. 7 hereinabove, who are employed by the City of Las Vegas on municipal works, County work or the County of Clark, or State work of the State of Nevada, shall be governed by this Ordinance, except in the matter of six months residence in the State of Nevada, for the period of the particular work for which they are employed. After the completion of said work, if such engineers and / or surveyors desire to continue the practice of the profession in Las Vegas, they shall be governed by this Ordinance in its entirety, except that he shall be entitled to have credited upon the residence requirement such period as he shall have been in the employment of the City of Las Vegas.

Sec. 10. Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of a violation of this Ordinance or any section thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punishable by a fine of not exceeding two hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period not exceeding one hundred days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 11. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 12. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after a period of ten days after its passage, approval and completed publication for a period of one week (3 issues) in Las Vegas Age, a tri-weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas.

Passed and adopted this 14 day of March, 1930, by the following vote of the Board of City Commissioners: Smith, Hansell, Thomas, voting aye, Noes, none.
