## ORDINANCE NO. 66

### An Ordinance Relating to Travel and Traffic Upon the Public Streets of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, do ordain:

Section 1. The following terms whenever used in this ordinance, except as otherwise specifically indicated, shall be deemed to have and shall be held to include each of the meanings respectively set forth in this section, and any such terms used in the singular number shall be held to include the plural.

**STREET:** Every avenue, boulevard, highway, lane, alley, strip, path, square or place used by or laid out for use of vehicles.

**INTERSECTING STREET:** Shall mean any street which joins another at an angle whether or not it crosses the other street.

**CURB:** The lateral boundaries of a street designed or intended for the use of vehicles, whether marked by curbing construction of stone, cement, concrete or other material, or not so marked.

**VEHICLE:** Every wagon, hack, coach, carriage, omnibus, pushcart, bicycle, tricycle, motorcycle, automobile, or other conveyance, except baby carriage, railroad, street and interurban railway cars, in whatever manner or by whatever force or power the same may be driven, ridden or propelled, which is or may be used for or adapted to pleasure riding, or the transportation of passengers, baggage, merchandise or freight, upon any street; and every draft or riding animal, whether ridden, driven or led, or is standing still, excepting that an animal or animals attached to any vehicle shall, with such vehicle, constitute one vehicle.

**DRIVER:** Every rider or driver of any animal, the rider of a bicycle, tricycle, or motorcycle, the operator of a motor vehicle, the person in charge or control of an animal, bicycle, tricycle, motorcycle, motor vehicles or pushcart.

**ANIMAL:** Every horse, pony, donkey, mule, burro or other animal capable of being ridden or driven, or capable of being guided by rein or voice.

**DRIVE:** To ride, drive, propel or operate.

**BUSINESS DISTRICT:** Shall consist of all that portion of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, known as "Clark's Las Vegas Townsite," bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the southwest corner of the intersection of Main Street with Garces Street; thence running northerly along the easterly side of said Main Street to its intersection with Stewart Street; thence running easterly along the northerly side of said Stewart Street to its intersection with Fifth Street; thence running southerly along the easterly side of said Fifth Street to its intersection with Garces Street; thence running westerly along the southerly side of said Garces Street to its intersection with Main Street, the place of beginning; Clark Avenue, Wilson Avenue, Second Street, Third Street and Fourth Street, in the Original Townsite of Las Vegas, Nevada.

**RESIDENCE DISTRICT:** Shall consist of Buck's Addition, Buol's First and Second Additions, Wardie Addition, Ladd's Addition, Fairview Addition, Grand View Addition, Original Townsite of Las Vegas, Nevada, except Clark Avenue, Wilson Avenue, Second Street, Third Street and Fourth Street, and all of the unplatted acreage contained in Sections numbered 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34 and 35, in Township Twenty (20) south of Range Sixty-one (61) East, M. D. B. & M., and Sections 2, 3, 4 and 5 in Township Twenty-one (21), South of Range Sixty-one (61) East, M. D. B. & M.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or propel, or cause or permit to be driven or propelled, any vehicle, road roller, traction engine, or any implement, machine or other vehicle, except motor vehicles, upon or along any public street in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, or to permit any such vehicle, road roller, traction engine, implement, or machine, to remain upon any such street during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise of the next succeeding day, unless there is attached to the left hand side of such vehicle a lamp showing a white light visible in the direction toward which the front of said vehicle is directed, and a red light visible in the reverse direction, or unless there is attached on the front at or near the left hand side of such vehicle a lamp showing a white light visible in the direction toward which the front of such vehicle is directed and also a lamp attached to the rear of such vehicle to the left of the center thereof, showing a red light, visible in the reverse direction; and, provided further, that upon a bicycle one white light showing toward the direction in which such bicycle is proceeding shall be deemed a compliance with the provisions of this section.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars nor more than Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Two Days nor more than Twenty-five Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride, drive or propel, or cause or permit to be ridden, driven or propelled, any motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle, upon any public street of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, during the period of one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, of the next succeeding day, unless the said vehicle is equipped with at least two lamps showing white lights visible under normal atmospheric conditions at least five hundred feet in the direction toward which said motor vehicle is proceeding, and shall also carry at the rear of said motor vehicle to the left of center thereof, a lighted lamp exhibiting one red light plainly visible for a distance of five hundred feet toward the rear, and so placed that the number on the rear of such motor vehicle shall be illuminated by a white light in such a manner that such number can be plainly distinguished under normal atmospheric conditions at a distance of not less

than fifty feet in the reverse direction to which such vehicle is proceeding.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Five Days nor more than Fifty Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride, drive or propel or cause or permit to be ridden, driven or propelled, upon any public street of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, or to leave standing upon such street, any motorcycle unless such motorcycle shall carry during the period from one hour after sunset of any day to one hour before sunrise of the next succeeding day, at least one lighted lamp showing a white light visible under normal atmospheric conditions at least two hundred feet in the direction in which the motorcycle is proceeding, and shall also carry at the rear of such motorcycle one red light or red reflex mirror plainly visible from the rear.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Thirty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Five Days nor more than Fifteen Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 5. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride, drive or propel, or cause to be ridden, driven or propelled, any bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, automobile or other riding machine or horseless vehicle, in, upon or along any public street within the limits of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, without having attached to such bicycle, tricycle, velocipede, automobile or other riding machine or horseless vehicle a bell, gong, horn or other signal device, in good working order, and sufficient to give warning of the approach of such vehicle to pedestrians and to riders and drivers of animals or other vehicles and to persons entering or leaving other vehicles. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or to sound, or to cause or permit to be used or to be sounded, in or upon any street, alley or other public place any such bell, gong, horn or other signal device in any manner other than to produce an abrupt sound sufficiently loud to serve as an adequate warning of the approach of the vehicle to which the same is attached, or to sound, or cause or permit to be sounded any such bell, gong, horn or other signal device except when necessary to give such warning. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to which is attached any bell, gong, horn or other signal device, to unnecessarily blow such horn, ring such bell or operate such other sound producing device in the immediate vicinity of any hospital or school located in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

Every person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars nor more than Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Two Days nor more than Twenty-five Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven, any horse or other animal; or to ride, drive or propel, or cause to be ridden, driven or propelled, any vehicle at a rate of speed greater than fifteen miles per hour in, upon or along the public streets, alleys, lanes, avenues, boulevards, strips, paths or squares in the business district of the city of Las Vegas, Nevada, as described and referred to in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Five Days nor more than Fifty Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 7. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven, any horse, or other animal; or to ride or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven or propelled, any vehicle at a rate of speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour in, upon or along any of the public streets, alleys, lanes, avenues, boulevards, strips, paths or squares in the residence district of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, as described and referred to in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Five Days nor more than Fifty Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 8. It shall be unlawful for any person, while in an intoxicated condition, to ride or drive any animal, or drive any vehicle, in any street, alley, lane, avenue, boulevard, highway, strip, patch or square, now in use or laid out to be used by vehicles within the limits of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

Every person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars nor more than Two Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Ten Days nor more than One Hundred Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 9. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of fourteen years to drive any motor vehicle in, upon or along any public street within the limits of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

Sec. 10. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to cause or permit any motor vehicle to be driven in, upon or along any public street within the limits of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, by any

person under the age of fourteen years.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than Ten Days nor more than Fifty Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 11. It shall be unlawful to use or operate any motor vehicle or the motor thereof with devices known as the "muffler cutouts" in, upon or along any of the public streets of that portion of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, known as the business district of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, as described and referred to in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars nor more than Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not less than Two Days nor more than Twenty-five Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 12. It shall be unlawful to use or operate any motor vehicle, or the motor thereof, unless such motor vehicle or motor thereof is equipped with devices in good working order which shall at all times be in constant operation to prevent accidents and excessive noise.

Sec. 13. The driver of every vehicle shall drive such vehicle in a careful manner and with due regard for the safety and convenience of pedestrians and all vehicles upon the streets upon which the vehicle is driven.

Sec. 14. The driver of any vehicle, upon meeting any other vehicle at any place upon any street, shall turn to the right, and on all occasions shall travel on the right hand side of such street and as near to the right hand curb as possible.

Sec. 15. The driver of any vehicle shall, in overtaking and passing any other vehicle in or upon any street, give an alarm with a bell, gong, horn or other signal device, and pass to the left of such vehicle and shall not pull over to the right until so far ahead as not to interfere with the progress of the vehicle passed.

Sec. 16. The driver of any vehicle moving slowly in, upon or along any street, shall keep such vehicle as closely as possible to the curb on the right, allowing more swiftly moving vehicles free passage on the left.

Sec. 17. The driver of any vehicle in or upon any street shall, before turning, stopping or changing the course of such vehicle, and before turning such vehicle when starting the same, first see that there is sufficient space for such movement to be made with safety, and shall then give a plainly visible or audible signal to the drivers of the vehicles behind the vehicle so turning, stopping, or changing its course, or turning from a standstill, of his intention to make such a movement. Such signal shall be given by raising the hand or whip or by means of a signal device that has been previously approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, and indicating with such hand, whip or signalling device, the direction in which the turn is to be made.

Sec. 18. The driver of any vehicle in or upon any street shall, in turning to the right into another street, turn the corner as near the right hand corner as possible.

Sec. 19. The driver of any vehicle in or upon any street shall, in turning to the left into another street, pass to the right of and beyond the center of the street intersection before turning.

Sec. 20. The driver of any vehicle crossing from one side of any street to the other side thereof, shall make such crossing by turning to the left, so as to head in the direction in which the traffic is moving on the side of the street toward which the crossing is made.

Sec. 21. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to stop the same or cause the same to be stopped in or upon any street with the left side of such vehicle toward or along or next to the curb.

Sec. 22. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to stop the same, or cause the same to be stopped, in or upon any street unless the wheels of such vehicle nearest the curb are not more than two feet distant from such curb; provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not apply in case of emergency, or when such stop is made for the purpose of allowing another vehicle or pedestrian to pass in front of such vehicle so stopped, or in compliance with an order or signal from a police officer.

Sec. 23. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle standing at the curb in or upon any street to fail or refuse to give way promptly to a vehicle for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers, baggage, freight or merchandise.

Sec. 24. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride, drive or propel, or cause to be ridden, driven or propelled, in, upon or along any street within the business district of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, as described and referred to in Section 1 of this Ordinance, in a backward direction, if by so doing the free and uninterrupted passage of another vehicle is impeded.

Sec. 25. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to back such vehicle without first giving visible or audible warning to drivers of vehicles or to pedestrians behind such vehicle so backing.

Sec. 26. The driver of any animal attached to a vehicle backed up to the curb upon any street shall turn such animal and keep the same turned at right angles to such vehicle and in the direction in which the traffic is moving on the side of the street which the animal is standing, or as near a right angle as the tongue or pole of the vehicle will permit.

Sec. 27. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven, any horse or other animal, or to ride, drive or propel, or cause to be ridden, driven or propelled, any vehicle across, upon or along, any public sidewalk, or to leave any such animal or vehicle to stand thereon, or permit any such

animal or vehicle to stand upon any public street in such a manner as to obstruct the free use of such street.

Sec. 28. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or drive, or cause to be ridden or driven, any dangerous, unbroken or partially broken animal upon any public street or to use, or cause to be used, any such street for the purpose of breaking or training any animal.

Sec. 29. The drivers of all vehicles must look out for and give right of way to vehicles approaching simultaneously from their right at street intersection, except as otherwise provided for in this Ordinance.

Sec. 30. The driver of any vehicle turning to the left from one street into another street shall allow the right of way to vehicles traveling in the direction to which such vehicle is turning; and the driver of any vehicle traveling in the direction in which such vehicle is turning shall have the right of way over such vehicle so turning.

Sec. 31. The driver of any vehicle turning to the right from one street into another shall have the right of way over vehicles traveling in the direction in which such vehicle is turning; and the driver of such vehicle traveling in the direction in which such vehicle is turning shall allow such right of way to such vehicle so turning.

Sec. 32. Officers and members of the Fire Department and their apparatus of all kinds, when going to, or on duty at, or returning from, a fire, shall have the right of way over all other persons and vehicles on any street or through any procession, except vehicles carrying the United States mail.

Sec. 33. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle in or upon any street in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, or for any person standing or walking in any such street, to fail, refuse or neglect to allow the right of way to any officer, fireman or apparatus of the Fire Department when the same is going to, on duty at, or returning from a fire.

Sec. 34. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to tear down, remove, or in any manner deface, destroy or carry away any guide board or sign placed or caused to be placed at the center of the intersection of streets or elsewhere within the city limits of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, for the guidance of travel and traffic, by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Five Days nor more than Fifty Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 35. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished, unless otherwise provided by this Ordinance, by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail for a period of not less than Five Days, nor more than Fifty Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 36. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force one week (one issue) after its publication in the Clark County Review; a weekly newspaper, published in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.
