Corkhill, being first duly sworn, deposes and says: That he is a citizen of the United States, over the age of eighteen years; that he is the publisher of the Clark County Review, a weekly newspaper of general circulation printed and published at Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, and that the Ordinance NO. 39 of the City of Las Vegas

ORDINANCE NO. 39

An Ordinance to Regulate and Prevent the Discharge of Fire-Arms, Air Guns, etc., Within Certain Portions of the City of Las Vegas.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful within the limits of Clark's Las Vegas Townsite in the City of Las Vegas, except in a regular licensed shooting gallery, to wilfully discharge any pistol, fire-arm, air gun, musket, or instrument of any kind, character or description, which throws a bullet or missiles for any distance by means of the elastic force of air or any explosive substance.

Sec. 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), or imprisoned in the City Jail not more than one hundred and fifty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 3. This Ordinance shall be published for a period of one week (one insertion) in the Clark County Review and thereupon and thereafter it shall take effect and be in force.

The foregoing Ordinance was passed by the Board of City Commissioners this 2nd day of April, 1913, upon the following vote: Commissioners Stewart, Coughlin, McGovern, Von Tobel, and His Honor the Mayor Peter Buol, aye. Noes, none.
