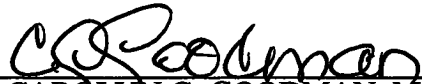

2 16 030 - Appointment—Compensation

The Senior Citizens' Center Director shall be appointed by the City Manager and confirmed by the mayor and City Council, and shall receive such compensation as is fixed by the City Council

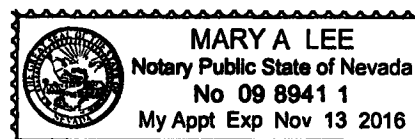
