**ORDINANCE NO. 6394**

AN ORDINANCE TO UPDATE THE REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT ZONES TO AUTHORIZE THEIR USE IN AREAS WHERE CERTAIN TYPES OF SPECIAL EVENTS TAKE PLACE, AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

Summary: Updates the regulations pertaining to residential parking permit zones to authorize their use in areas where certain types of special events take place.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Title 11, Chapter 65, Section 30, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

**11.65.030:** Any residential area within the City shall be deemed eligible to apply for a residential permit parking zone providing the area in question meets the [following requirements:

(A) The residential area requesting a residential permit parking zone is adjacent to a commercial or other development with a high parking demand;

(B) The streets for which a residential permit parking zone is requested are primarily residential streets;

(C) A parking study has been made which shows that seventy percent or more of the available on-street spaces are occupied, for a period in excess of two hours between the hours of eight a.m. and six p.m. and that twenty-five percent of the parked vehicles are nonresident vehicles;

(D) A signed petition requesting the zone which contains signatures representing fifty-one percent of the residences affected is submitted to the City Traffic Engineer.]

requirements of Subsections (A), (B) and (C) and, in addition, the requirements of either Subsection (D) or Subsection (E):

(A) The residential area requesting a residential permit parking zone is in close proximity to a commercial or other development with a high parking demand;

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1 (B) The streets for which a residential permit parking zone is requested are primarily  
2 residential streets;

3 (C) A signed petition requesting the zone which contains signatures representing fifty-  
4 one percent of the residences affected is submitted to the City Traffic Engineer;

5 (D) A parking study has been submitted which shows that seventy percent or more of  
6 the available on-street spaces are occupied, for a period in excess of two hours between the hours of eight  
7 a.m. and six p.m. and that twenty-five percent of the parked vehicles are nonresident vehicles;

8 (E) The residential area is in close proximity to an area or development that, on an  
9 annual basis, hosts at least five special events with a high parking demand.

10 SECTION 2: Title 11, Chapter 65, Section 40, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las  
11 Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

12 **11.65.040:** The approval of a residential area for a residential permit parking zone will be carried out  
13 in the following manner:

14 (A) A request for a residential permit parking zone shall be submitted in writing to the  
15 City Traffic Engineer by a resident or residents of the affected residential area.

16 (B) A survey, as described in this Chapter, will be conducted by the [Traffic]  
17 Transportation Engineering Division to determine if the area qualifies for a residential permit parking zone.

18 (C) The residents of the area shall be notified by the [Traffic] Transportation  
19 Engineering Division of the results of the survey and of future action to be taken.

20 (D) A petition prepared by the [Traffic] Transportation Engineering Division shall be  
21 delivered to the requestor(s) for them to contact all of the affected residences and obtain signatures and  
22 addresses supporting the establishment of a residential permit parking zone.

23 (E) Upon completion and verification as to the accuracy of the petition by the City  
24 Traffic Engineer, the proposal shall be taken to the next regular meeting of the Traffic and Parking  
25 Commission for its recommendation to the City Traffic Engineer.

26 (1) If the recommendation of the City Traffic and Parking Commission is

1 favorable, the City Traffic Engineer must grant the request, and amend Schedule 17-VI by written finding  
2 subject to LVMC 11.65.020.

3 (2) If the recommendation of the City Traffic and Parking Commission is not  
4 favorable, the City Traffic Engineer must deny the request and give the requestor written notice of such  
5 decision within fifteen days of the recommendation.

6 (3) The written notice required in Subsection (E)(2) of this Section must state  
7 that the requestor may appeal such decision by filing a notice of appeal with the City Clerk's office within  
8 forty-five days of the date of said notice.

9 (4) The City Council shall hear the appeal at the next regularly scheduled  
10 meeting following the expiration of ten days after the filing of the notice of appeal, and either affirm,  
11 reverse or modify the decision of the City Traffic Engineer, or take such other action it deems warranted.

12 SECTION 3: Title 11, Chapter 65, Section 50, of the Municipal Code of the City of Las  
13 Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 **11.65.050:** (A) The approval of a residential permit parking zone is within the discretion of the  
15 City Council. Once a residential permit parking zone has been approved by the City Council; [the Traffic  
16 Engineering Division shall:

17 (1) Install]

18 (1) The Transportation Engineering Division shall install parking signs on the  
19 streets designated as a residential permit parking zone. The signs, as they may be updated or supplemented  
20 from time to time by the Parking Services Division of the Department of Economic and Urban  
21 Development, shall indicate the times, locations and conditions under which parking shall be by permit  
22 only;

23 (2) [Issue] The Parking Services Division shall issue a maximum of three  
24 permanent residential parking permits and a maximum of two visitor placards per residence for a  
25 designated residential permit parking zone upon application and payment of the application fee by a person  
26 eligible for such permit[.]; and

1 (3) In the case of permits designed to be used during special events in the area,  
2 the Parking Services Division shall provide to permit holders such advance notice of those events as is  
3 deemed feasible and appropriate.

4 (B) A person is eligible to apply for a residential parking permit if he/she owns or  
5 operates a motor vehicle and resides on property immediately adjacent to a street, avenue or other location  
6 within the residential permit parking zone. Proof of residency in the residential permit parking zone on a  
7 block designated for implementation must be presented at the time application is made.

8 (C) The application for a permit shall contain the name of the owner or operator of the  
9 motor vehicle; residential address; the make, model, registration and license plate number of the motor  
10 vehicle; and the number of the driver's license of the applicant. The motor vehicle registration and the  
11 driver's license of the applicant must be presented at the time of making said application in order to verify  
12 the contents thereof. The owner or operator of any motor vehicle applying for a residential parking permit  
13 shall have a valid Nevada motor vehicle license. The motor vehicle registration must show the applicant's  
14 present address.

15 SECTION 4: Title 11, Chapter 65, Section 110, of the Municipal Code of the City of  
16 Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

17 **11.65.110:** (A) It shall constitute a violation of this regulation for any person to falsely represent  
18 himself as eligible for a residential parking permit or to furnish any false information in an application to  
19 the [Traffic Engineer] Parking Services Division of the Department of Economic and Urban Development  
20 in order to obtain a residential parking permit.

21 (B) No person other than the permittee named shall use a residential parking permit or  
22 display it on a vehicle operated or parked, and any such use or display by a person other than the permittee  
23 shall constitute a violation of this Section by the permittee and by the person who so used or displayed such  
24 parking permit.

25 SECTION 5: If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or  
26 phrase in this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or

1 ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or  
2 effectiveness of the remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council of the City  
3 of Las Vegas hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph,  
4 sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections,  
5 subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

6 SECTION 6: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or sections, subsections, phrases,  
7 sentences, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983  
8 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.


9 SECTION 7: Whenever in this ordinance any act is prohibited or is made or declared to  
10 be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, or whenever in this ordinance the doing of any act is required  
11 or the failure to do any act is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, the doing of  
12 such prohibited act or the failure to do any such required act shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon  
13 conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment for a term of  
14 not more than six months, or by any combination of such fine and imprisonment. Any day of any violation  
15 of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.
