2 **ORDINANCE NO. 6574**

3 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING PARKING REGULATIONS TO AMEND LVMC CHAPTER 11.52 TO
4 PROHIBIT OVERSIZE VEHICLE PARKING ON STREETS ADJACENT TO RESIDENTIAL
DISTRICTS, PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND PUBLIC PARKS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER RELATED
5 MATTERS.

7 Summary: Amends the City's parking regulations
8 to prohibit oversize vehicles from parking on
streets adjacent to residential districts, public
9 schools and public parks.

10 THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS
11 FOLLOWS:

12 SECTION 1: Title 11, Chapter 52, Section 305, of the Municipal Code of the City of
13 Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 **11.52.305:** (A) Except as otherwise provided in this Section or as permitted by posted sign, it is
15 unlawful for a person to stand, park or store, [upon any residential street,] upon any street adjacent to a
16 residence district, public school or public park, a commercial vehicle, recreational vehicle, trailer, or any
17 combination of vehicle and trailer having an overall length of twenty-four feet or more or an unladen
18 weight in excess of eight thousand pounds. For purposes of the preceding sentence, a "residence district"
19 means the territory contiguous to a street, not comprising a business district, in which the parcels abutting
such street for a distance of three hundred feet or more are mainly occupied by dwellings or by dwellings
and buildings in use for residence.

20 (B) The provisions of Subsection (A) do not apply to a commercial vehicle that is:

21 (1) Parked in front of property from which or to which goods or passengers
22 are being picked up or delivered, but only for that period of time during which goods or passengers are
23 being expeditiously loaded or unloaded; or

24 (2) Being used in conjunction with the performance of service, repair,
25 construction or similar essential use within the immediate neighborhood.

26 (C) A person may park a recreational vehicle upon a residential street in front of

1 property from which or to which passengers and travel items will be loaded or unloaded, but only:

2 (1) For a period not to exceed forty-eight consecutive hours; and

3 (2) In accordance with a permit issued by the Parking Services Division of the
4 Department of Economic and Urban Development in accordance with Subsection (D).

5 For purposes of this Subsection (C) and Subsection (D), "recreational vehicle" means any vehicle or trailer,
6 or vehicle-trailer combination, that is designed, maintained and used as a travel trailer, camper, motor
7 home, tent trailer, or camping trailer.

8 (D) A permit issued for recreational vehicle parking described in Subsection (C):

9 (1) Shall specify the location and vehicle to which it pertains, the date and
10 time permitted parking may begin, and the date and time the permit expires;

11 (2) Must be displayed in or on the vehicle in a conspicuous location that is
12 clearly visible from the street;

13 (3) Is valid only for the vehicle, location and times specified;

14 (4) Is not valid with reference to the same recreational vehicle more than six
15 times within any three-month period;

16 (5) Is not valid for any period that commences less than seventy-two hours
17 after a previous permit for the same recreational vehicle has expired; and

18 (6) May be revoked for abuse, misuse, ineligibility or other good cause.

19 (E) It is unlawful for a person to stand, park or store a mobile billboard upon any street
20 at a location within five hundred feet of a dwelling, including any apartment unit or residential
21 condominium. For purposes of this Subsection (E), "mobile billboard" means one or more sign structures
22 that are mounted on a vehicle or trailer and are used for general advertising or advertising for hire. The
23 term does not include signs that are displayed or installed on:

24 (1) A bus, taxicab or similar vehicle that is used primarily for the purpose of
25 transporting multiple passengers; or

26 (2) A vehicle operated in the normal course of the vehicle owner's business, if

1 the signs contain advertising or identifying information directly related to the business and are not used to
2 display advertising unrelated to that business.

3 SECTION 2: If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or
4 phrase in this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or
5 ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or
6 effectiveness of the remaining portions of this ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council of the City
7 of Las Vegas hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph,
8 sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections,
9 subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

10 SECTION 3: Whenever in this ordinance any act is prohibited or is made or declared to
11 be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, or whenever in this ordinance the doing of any act is required
12 or the failure to do any act is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, the doing of
13 such prohibited act or the failure to do any such required act shall constitute a misdemeanor and upon
14 conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment for a term of
15 not more than six months, or by any combination of such fine and imprisonment. Any day of any violation
16 of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

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SECTION 4: All ordinances or parts of ordinances or sections, subsections, phrases, sentences, clauses or paragraphs contained in the Municipal Code of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, 1983 Edition, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.





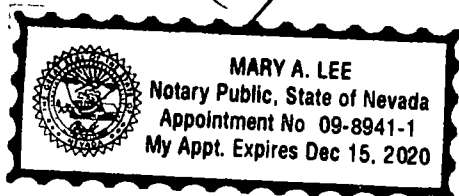
