At a regular and adjourned meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 13th day of March, 1922, at the hour of two o'clock p.m. Present Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, with members Thos. R. Hodgens, and W. E. Arnold, Commissioner H. N. Anderson being absent.

At this time the Clerk read for the first time Ordinance #90 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Section six (6) of Ordinance No. 66 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Travel and Traffic Upon the Public Streets of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada," as amended by Section 1 of Ordinance No. 86 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Section six (6) and to Repeal Section seven (7) of Ordinance No. 66 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance Regulating Travel and Traffic upon the Public Streets of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada;" also to amend Sections twenty (20) and Twenty-two (22) of said Ordinance No. 66, and to add three new sections to said Ordinance No. 66 to be known as Sections 34a, 35a and 66a respectively, by way of amendment, and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith. Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried, this Ordinance was passed to the second reading. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner Aye. Nones, none.

At this time the clerk read for the first time Ordinance No. 91 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the cleaning of lots within the limits of Clark's Las Vegas Townsite in the City of Las Vegas, and providing penalties for the violation thereof, and repealing all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in Conflict therewith. Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried this Ordinance was passed to the second reading. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner Aye. Nones, none.

Commissioner Hodgens was directed by the Board through the Mayor Pro Tem to investigate ways and means of purchasing new fire apparatus.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time it was moved by Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried that the Board adjourn until Wednesday, March 15, 1922, at the hour of seven o'clock p.m. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Nones, none.

At a regular meeting of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 15th day of March, A. D. 1922, at the hour of seven o'clock p.m. Present Commissioners Thomas R. Hodgens, W. E. Arnold, and H. N. Anderson with Mayor Pro Tem W. H. Dentner, together with the City Attorney and City Clerk.

At this time the Clerk read for the second time Ordinance No. 88 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled "An Ordinance to amend Section six of Ordinance No. 77 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance to Prohibit gaming in the City of Las Vegas, without first obtaining a license therefor, regulating the same, fixing the amount of such license, providing a penalty therefor, and repealing all Ordinances in Conflict therewith" and repealing all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with such amendment. Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold

and duly carried, this Ordinance was passed. Voting Commissioners Hodgins, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Hoos, none. Commissioner Anderson not voting.

Thereupon the Clerk read for the second time Ordinance No. 89 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled "An Ordinance to Repeal Subdivision (43) of Section seven of Ordinance No. 48 of the City of Las Vegas, licensing, for the purpose of regulation and revenue, every kind of lawful business hereinafter specified, transacted or carried on within the corporate limits of the City of Las Vegas, State of Nevada, fixing the rates of license tax upon the same and providing for the collection of said license tax, and a punishment for carrying on or conducting any such business without a license, and repealing Ordinances Nos. 1, 2, 4, 13, 14, and 35" approved December 3, 1913, as such subdivision (43) is created and enacted by Ordinance No. 81 of the City of Las Vegas, approved June 15th, 1921. Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgins, seconded by Commissioner Arnold said Ordinance was duly passed. Voting Commissioners Hodgins, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Hoos, none.

Thereupon the Clerk read for the second time Ordinance No. 90 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Section six (6) of Ordinance No. 66 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled 'An Ordinance Regulating Travel and Traffic upon the Public Streets of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada' as amended by Section 1 of Ordinance No. 86 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Section six (6) and to Repeal Section seven (7) of Ordinance No. 66 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled 'An Ordinance Regulating Travel and Traffic upon the Public Streets of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada'; also to amend Sections twenty (20) and Twenty-two (22) of said Ordinance No. 66, and to add three new sections to said Ordinance No. 66 to be known as Sections 34a, 35a, and 36a respectively, by way of amendment, and to repeal all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict therewith". Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgins, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, this Ordinance was duly passed. Voting Commissioners Hodgins, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Hoos, none.

At this time the Clerk read for the second time Ordinance No. 91, of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the cleaning of lots within the limits of Clarke Las Vegas Townsite in the City of Las Vegas, and providing penalties for the violation thereof, and repealing all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict therewith". Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgins, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, this Ordinance was duly passed. Voting Commissioners Hodgins, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Hoos, none.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgins, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, the following Resolution was ordered spread upon the minutes of this Board:

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas at a regular meeting of said Board held on the 7th day of December, A.D. 1921, by resolution duly adopted authorized the Mayor City Clerk and the Water Works, Sewerage and Light Commissioner, on behalf of said City of Las Vegas, to enter into a written contract for the furnishing of electric current for street lighting purposes, and for other service, therein specified, and

Whereas, a contract has this day been entered in to by and between the Consolidated Power and Telephone Company, a corporation, the party of the first part, and the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, the party of the second part, wherein the party of the first part agrees to supply electric current for street lighting and other purposes, at the sum of seven cents (7 cts.) per K.W., as is more fully set forth in the copy of the contract on file in the office of the clerk of this Board, said contract having been entered into by the Mayor Pro Tem, City Clerk and Water Works, Sewerage and Light Commissioner, in behalf of the party of the second part,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that we, the Board of Commissioners, of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, do hereby approve the execution of said Contract.

Voting Commissioners Hodgins, Arnold, Anderson, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Hoos, none.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgins, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried it was the order of the Board that the Water Works, Sewerage, and Light Commissioner, be, and he is hereby authorized to take the meter reading April 1st, 1922, at which date the new contract is to become effective. Voting Commissioners Hodgins, Arnold, Anderson, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem

Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold the following Resolution was introduced:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a great necessity exists for the acquisition by the City of Las Vegas of additional equipment for the Fire Department, to-wit, a fully equipped fire truck with centrifugal pump, chemical equipment, and approximately 1000 feet of fire hose, in that the present equipment is wholly inadequate, and without such new equipment there is a constant menace to the safety of the lives and property of the inhabitants of this City, and

WHEREAS, the funds available for the conduct of said Fire Department during the year 1922 are not sufficient for use to any extent toward the purchase of the above mentioned equipment, and,

WHEREAS, for the purposes aforesaid it will be necessary for said City to borrow the sum of Three Thousand Dollars for a period of two years by the issuance of the negotiable note, or notes of said City, bearing interest at the rate of not to exceed eight per cent per annum, redeemable as by law provided out of an emergency tax fund,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of City Commissioners of said City of Las Vegas do hereby authorize and empower the Mayor Pro Tem and City Clerk to borrow for the purposes aforesaid the sum of Three Thousand Dollars for a period not to exceed two and one half years, and to issue as evidence thereof the negotiable promissory note or notes of said City in the aggregate of said sum of Three Thousand Dollars, the same to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum to be redeemable at the option of this Board at any time when money is available in the emergency tax fund, to be known as "City of Las Vegas Nevada Emergency Tax", to be levied by this Board at the first tax levy following the creation of such indebtedness as by law provided.

Dated this 15th day of March, A.D. 1922.

Action on this Resolution was deferred until the next regular meeting of this Board to be held on the 5th day of April, A.D. 1922, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock p.m., and the Clerk was directed to have Notice of said contemplated action published for one issue in the Las Vegas Review, a weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas.

Street Commissioner Arnold was authorized by the Mayor Pro Tem to provide "Slow Down" signs for the school house district.

At this time the Clerk read the following communication:

whereupon it was the motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold that the resignation of Commissioner Anderson be accepted. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

The matter of the appointment of a Commissioner of the Fourth Class of the City of Las Vegas, to fill the unexpired term of H. H. Anderson, resigned, coming on before the Board, it was the motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, that Ray W. Gorton be appointed to the office of Commissioner of the Fourth Class, said appointment to take effect upon the filing of a good and sufficient bond in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, and upon taking the oath of office as required by law. Voting Commissioner Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye, Noes, none.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, it was ordered that the following Proclamation of the Mayor Pro Tem be published in the Las Vegas Review, a newspaper published weekly in the City of Las Vegas, for one week. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, Herbert Hoover, Chairman of the Interstate Colorado River Commission, will visit Las Vegas, Nevada, on Saturday, the 18th day of March, 1922, to inspect the Boulder Canyon Dam site on the Colorado River, and

WHEREAS, the City of Las Vegas constitutes the nearest and only gateway and approach to said proposed dam site and power project, and

WHEREAS, the building of said dam will result in making Las Vegas the metropolis of Nevada, and will be instrumental in establishing large industries here, including smelters, refineries and manufactories due to the cheap hydroelectric power that will be created and available at the switchboard.

NOW THEREFORE, in realization of the significance of the visit

of Secretary of Commerce Hoover, a member of the Cabinet of President Warren G. Harding, and his official representative on the Colorado River Project, I hereby declare Saturday, the 18th day of March, 1922, Las Vegas Boulder Canyon Dam Day, and respectfully suggest that all ordinary business cease during the afternoon of said day that a proper reception may be given to such official representative.

There being no farther business to come before the Board at this time, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried that the Board stand adjourned until the next regular meeting, to be held on the 5th day of April, 1922, at the hour of seven -thirty o'clock p.m. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 5th day of April, A.D. 1922, at the hour of seven o'clock p.m. Present Mayor Pro Tem W. H. Dentner, with members Thomas H. Hodgens and W. E. Arnold, together with the City Attorney and City Clerk.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read.

Reports of officers read, approved and ordered placed on file with the Clerk of this Board.

All bills allowed as per claim book on file with the Clerk of this Board, excepting the claim of the Standard Oil Company for the sum of \$26.13 which was laid over for further investigation.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried it was ordered that the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars be transferred from the General Fund to the Street Fund, and it was further ordered that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed so to notify the City Treasurer. Voting Com. Hodgens, Arnold, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

The bond of Ray W. Gorton as Commissioner of the Fourth Class in the sum of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars, with C. A. French and E. S. Sheppard as sureties thereon, having been approved by J. J. Stewart, chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Nevada, it was the motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold that said bond be, and the same is hereby approved. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon Ray W. Gorton took the oath of office as required by law and assumed his seat as Commissioner of the Fourth Class of the City of Las Vegas.

Thereupon His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner appointed Ray W. Gorton Water, Sewerage and Light Commissioner of the City of Las Vegas.

At this time it appearing to the Board that this is the time set by notice for action on the following resolution, and it further appearing to the Board that said Resolution has been introduced at a regular meeting of this Board held on the 15th day of March, A.D. 1922; and that subsequent to such meeting said Resolution was published in the Las Vegas Review, a weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas, for two publications, one week apart; and it further appearing that fifteen (15) Days have elapsed since the date of the first publication, thereupon it was moved by Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold that said Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted, and it was further ordered that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of said Resolution to the State Board of Revenue for approval.
