At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 5th day of April, A.D. 1922, at the hour of seven o'clock p.m. Present Mayor Pro Tem W. H. Dentner, with members Thomas R. Hodgens and W. E. Arnold, together with the City Attorney and City Clerk.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read.

Reports of officers read, approved and ordered placed on file with the Clerk of this Board.

All bills allowed as per claim book on file with the Clerk of this Board, excepting the claim of the Standard Oil Company for the sum of \$26.13 which was laid over for further investigation.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried it was ordered that the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars be transferred from the General Fund to the Street Fund, and it was further ordered that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed so to notify the City Treasurer. Voting Com. Hodgens, Arnold, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Nones, none.

The bond of Ray W. Gorton as Commissioner of the Fourth Class in the sum of One Thousand (\$1000.00) Dollars, with C. A. French and E. S. Sheppard as sureties thereon, having been approved by F. J. Stewart, chairman of the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Nevada, it was the motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold that said bond be, and the same is hereby approved. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Nones, none.

Thereupon Ray W. Gorton took the oath of office as required by law and assumed his seat as Commissioner of the Fourth Class of the City of Las Vegas.

Thereupon His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner appointed Ray W. Gorton Water, Sewerage and Light Commissioner of the City of Las Vegas.

At this time it appearing to the Board that this is the time set by notice for action on the following resolution, and it further appearing to the Board that said Resolution has been introduced at a regular meeting of this Board held on the 15th day of March, A.D. 1922; and that subsequent to such meeting said Resolution was published in the Las Vegas Review, a weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas, for two publications, one week apart; and it further appearing that fifteen (15) Days have elapsed since the date of the first publication, thereupon it was moved by Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold that said Resolution be and the same is hereby adopted, and it was further ordered that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of said Resolution to the State Board of Revenue for approval. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Nones, none.

## RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, a great necessity exists for the acquisition by the City of Las Vegas of additional equipment for the Fire Department, to-wit, a fully equipped fire truck with centrifugal pump, chemical equipment, and approximately 1000 feet of fire hose, in that the present equipment is wholly inadequate, and without such new equipment there is a constant menace to the safety of the lives and property of the inhabitants of this City, and:

WHEREAS, the funds available for the conduct of said Fire Department during the year 1922 are not sufficient for use to any extent toward the purchase of the above mentioned equipment, and,

WHEREAS, for the purposes aforesaid it will be necessary for said City to borrow the sum of Three Thousand Dollars for a period of two years by the issuance of the negotiable note, or notes of said City, bearing interest at the rate of not to exceed eight per cent per annum, redeemable as by law provided out of an emergency tax fund,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of City Commissioners of said City of Las Vegas do hereby authorize and empower the Mayor Pro Tem and City Clerk to, borrow for the purposes aforesaid the sum of Three Thousand Dollars for a period not to exceed two and one half years, and issue as evidence thereof the negotiable promissory note or notes of said City in the aggregate of said sum of Three Thousand Dollars, the same to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum to be redeemable at the option of this Board at any time when money is available in the emergency tax fund, to be known as "City of Las Vegas Emergency Tax" to be levied by this Board at the first tax levy following the creation of such indebtedness as by law provided.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried it was the order of the Board that the City Attorney be, and he is hereby instructed to draw up an ordinance establishing a City Dump ground, defining the boundaries thereof, and establishing a penalty for the violation thereof. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem, Dentner, Aye.; Noes, none.

It was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Gorton, and duly carried that R.J. Oppedyke be appointed a special officer, without salary, with special authority to enforce the proposed ordinance relating to a City Dump Ground. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem, Dentner, Aye.; Noes, none.

At this time the Board entered into a discussion of the purchase of Fire Equipment as proposed in the above Resolution, and there appeared before the Board representatives of several firms dealing in fire equipment, who presented their bids to the Board. After considerable discussion, it was the opinion of the Board that the equipment offered by the Hirsch and Hirsch Company, and the hose offered by the Eureka Fire Hose Company represented the best possible equipment for the price asked, and it was the unanimous opinion of the Board that, upon the approval of the above mentioned Resolution by the State Board of Revenue, the above mentioned equipment should be purchased by the Board.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of J.E. Morgan for a Gaming License in the City of Las Vegas, said application having been heretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Hodgens, and it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried that said Gaming License be issued to said applicant. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem, Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of Cleto Aguirre for a Gaming License in the City of Las Vegas, said application having been heretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Hodgens, and it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried that said Gaming License be issued to said applicant. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem, Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of James Germain for a Gaming License in the City of Las Vegas, said application having been heretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Hodgens, and it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried that said license be issued to said applicant. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem, Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of Albert James for a Gaming License in the City of Las Vegas, said application having heretofore been approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Hodgens, and it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioners Arnold, and duly carried that said license be granted to said applicant. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton, and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented to the Board the application of G. Lopes for a Gaming License in the City of Las Vegas, the same having been heretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Hodgens, and it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried that said license be granted to said applicant. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton and His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Gorton, and duly carried that the Board stand adjourned until Wednesday, April 19th, A.D. 1922, at the hour of seven thirty o'clock p.m.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 20th day of April, 1922, at the hour of five o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Pro tem Dentner, with members Ray W. Gorton, W. E. Arnold, together with the City Attorney and Deputy City Clerk.

At this time the Clerk read for the first time Ordinance No. 92 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled: "An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas establishing a City Dump Ground, and regulating the removal and disposal of rubbish, etc." On motion of Commissioner Arnold, seconded by Commissioner Gorton, and duly carried, this Ordinance was passed to the second reading. Voting Commissioners Arnold, Gorton and His Honor the Mayor pro tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time the Clerk read and presented the Resolution drawn up to adopt the deed of the Las Vegas Land and Water Company which conveys jointly to the County of Clark and City of Las Vegas a fair grounds and auto camping grounds. An extended discussion was had upon this matter by the commissioners present and it was decided that the City Attorney be directed to consult with Mr. W. R. Braeken, Agent for the Las Vegas Land and Water Company at Las Vegas, with regard to eliminating from the deed the clause which requires that a fair be held on these
