

OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK, LAS VEGAS, NEVADA.

June 21st, 1922.

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held at the hour of three o'clock p.m. Present His Honor the Mayor Pro Tem W.H. Dentner, with Commissioners Thomas R. Hodgens, W.E. Argold, and Ray W. Gorton, together with the City Attorney and City Clerk.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read.

Bills allowed as per claim book on file with the Clerk of this Board.

Upon the presentation of a map of Clark's Las Vegas Townsite showing the grades as provided in Ordinance #47, the following Resolution was adopted upon motion of Commissioner Gorton, seconded by Commissioner Hodgens, and duly carried.

Resolved that the map of Clark's Las Vegas Townsite presented by Fred W. Rodolf, to replace the map referred to in Ordinance 47, and adopted with said Ordinance, but which has since been lost or mislaid, be and the same is hereby adopted to be used in place of said map which was filed September 5, 1913, in connection with Ordinance #47, but subsequently lost, it being the opinion of this Board that the map presented by the said Fred W. Rodolf is identical with said map filed September 5, 1913 and subsequently lost. Voting Commissioners Arnold, Hodgens, Gorton and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time a committee from the Realty Board called to discuss that portion of the Traffic Ordinance, No. 90, which provides that no car may be parked closer than ten inches from the curb. After listening to the remarks of Messrs. Riley, Payne, and Breeze, the Board took the matter under consideration. It appearing to the Board that said feature of this Ordinance is apparently not for the best interests of the City of Las Vegas, it was the order of the Board upon the motion of Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, seconded by Commissioner Hodgens, and duly carried, that the City Attorney be and he is hereby directed to draw an amendment to Ordinance No. 90 providing that vehicles may be parked against the curb. Voting Commissioners Arnold, Hodgens, Gorton and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye, Noes, none.

Adolph Levy appeared before the Board to request permission to build a fire roof porch in front of his new building on Fremont Street, whereupon it was the decision of the Board that upon the presentation of a written permit, permission might be granted by this Board.

Thereupon E.F. McWilliams presented to the Board a map for numbering the houses of the City of Las Vegas, in accordance with an Ordinance and Resolution previously adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, whereupon, on motion of Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, seconded by Commissioner Hodgens, and duly carried, it was the order of the Board that said map of the City of Las Vegas be accepted, and that the houses of the city be numbered in accordance with said map upon its completion. Voting Commissioners Arnold, Hodgens, and Gorton and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

It was the order of the Board, upon motion of Commissioner Arnold, seconded by Commissioners Hodgens, and duly carried, that the streets in Clark's Las Vegas, Townsite be signed. Voting Commissioners Arnold, Hodgens, Gorton and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time the Clerk read the following communication:

Board of City Commissioners,
City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

Gentlemen:

The undersigned is now the owner of the ground upon which the Las Vegas City Jail and pound is located.

I hereby serve you this ^{written} notice that you must remove the City Jail and pound from my premises at once.

If the city wishes to dispose of its jail and pound, however, and will act promptly, execute the proper Bill of Sale of the jail and pound and deposit such Bill of Sale with the First State Bank of

Las Vegas, said bank will deliver to you \$52.60 (Fifty-two & 60/100 Dollars) in cash, which sum I have deposited therein for the said jail and pound, with the understanding that the city is to retain and remove both the cage from the jail and the wooden structure that has been used for housing dogs from the premises.

I have been very patient and business-like with you in the matter and trust you will appreciate my position. I can do no improving nor building until the burros, cows, mischievous colored boys and others quit frequenting my premises and all of this occasioned by your jail and pound being left on my premises.

whereupon, it was the order of the Board, upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried, that Fire and Police Commissioner Thomas R. Hodgens, be and he is hereby authorized to accept the offer of Frank M. Ryan, and to execute a Bill of Sale from the city to Mr. Ryan. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the following communication:

Las Vegas, June 10th, 1922

To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Trustees,
For the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada.

We, the undersigned, citizens and residents of the City of Las Vegas, respectfully petition your honorable Board, calling attention to a condition that prevails on the vacant lot situated on the corner of 1st street and Bonnaville Street; this condition being an open corral with stock, which breeds flies and stench, making it very undesirable for the neighborhood. We, therefore consider this a nuisance as stock should be kept in a building in our opinion and not kept out in an open corral near dwellin houses. We would, therefore, request that your Honorable Board take steps to have this unsanitary condition eliminated.

Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold and Gorton and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the following proclamation was adopted and ordered published for one week (one issue) in the Las Vegas Review. Said order was upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Gorton, and duly carried upon the following vote: Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Gorton, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is deemed fitting to observe with appropriate exercises Independence Day the 4th day of July, 1922, and a program therefor has been made,

Now, therefore, I, W. H. Dentner, Mayor Pro Tem of the City of Las Vegas, do hereby request all citizens to join in such exercises, and in order to make the same a safe and sane Fourth, hereby request the people to observe the following regulations established by the Board of City Commissioners relating thereto:

1. No fireworks shall be set off in any building, yard or

premises or on any of the public streets or alleys in Clark's Las Vegas Townsite or upon the roof of any building therein, as an appropriate place therefor will be prepared in the City Park.

2. Automobile races will be held on the following public streets; From 1st street on West to 5th street; along 5th street to Stewart Street; along Stewart Street to Main street; along Main Street to Clark Street; along Clark street to 5th Street; and, along 5th street to Stewart street, and such races will be conducted beginning at ten o'clock A.M. and ending about 12 o'clock noon on said day, and all persons are warned to keep off of said streets during such hours. Guards will be stationed at each block along such race course for protection.

Thereupon the Clerk read for the second time an Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas, Ordinance No. 92, entitled "An Ordinance regulating and Prohibiting the sale, use and possession of certain narcotic drugs in the City of Las Vegas; prescribing a penalty for the violation thereof and other matters relating thereto." Whereupon, on motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, said Ordinance was duly adopted upon the following vote: Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Nays, none.

Thereupon the Clerk read for the second time an Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas, Ordinance No. 93, entitled "An Ordinance Prohibiting the Manufacture, Storage, or Keeping, Sale or other Disposal of Intoxicating Liquors in the City of Las Vegas; Regulating Other Matters Pertaining thereto; providing a penalty for the Violation of this Ordinance, and repealing All Ordinance or Parts of Ordinances in Conflict therewith." Whereupon, on motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded By Commissioner Arnold, said ordinance was duly adopted on the following vote; Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Nays, none.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time it was ordered that adjournment be taken until Wednesday, July 5th, 1922 at the hour of seven o'clock p.m. Motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Gorton. Vote was as follows; Commissioners Hodgens Arnold, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Nays, none.
