At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 4th day of April, 1923, at the hour of two o'clock p.m. Present Hon. W. H. Dentner, Mayor Pro Tem, with Commissioners Thos. R. Hodgens, W. E. Arnold, and Harry Blandin, together with the City Attorney and City Clerk.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as read, upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold. Carried on the following vote, Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold and Blandin, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Reports of officers read, approved and ordered placed on file in the office of the Clerk of this Board.

All bills allowed as per claim book on file with the Clerk of the Board.

At this time the Board proceeded to a further consideration of the letting of a contract for the collection of garbage in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 80 and as per Notice for Bids published. It appearing to the Board that the bid of R. J. Oppedyk (as set forth in the Minutes of the previous meeting) is the only bid presented, and it further appearing to the Board that said bid of R. J. Oppedyk is a reasonable bid, it was the order of the Board, upon motion of Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, seconded by Commissioner Hodgens, that the contract for the Collection of garbage in the City of Las Vegas, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 80 be let to R. J. Oppedyk for the sum of Ninety (\$90) Dollars per month, beginning April 15, 1923, for the period of two years, same to take effect upon his filing a good and sufficient bond

Thos.R.Hodgens, whereupon, it was the order of the Board, upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, that the license be granted as applied for. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Blanding, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of J.H.Morgan for a gaming license (4 games) at the Texas Bar, the same having been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Thos. R.Hodgens, whereupon it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Arnold, seconded by Commissioner Blanding, that the license be granted as applied for. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Blanding, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of Skinner and Pirtle for a gaming license (2 games) at the Overland Bar, the same having been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Thos.R.Hodgens, whereupon it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, that the license be granted as applied for. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Blanding, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of L.Hargrave for a gaming license (3 games) at the Big Four the same having been approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Thos.R.Hodgens, whereupon, it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, that the license be granted as applied for. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Blanding, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of Thos.Gibbons for a gaming license(2 games) at the Exchange, the same having theretofore been approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Thos.R.Hodgens, whereupon, it was the order of the Board, upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Blanding that the license be granted as applied for. Voting Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Blanding and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye Noes, none.

At this time the Clerk read for the second time proposed Ordinance No.99 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled "An Ordinance to prohibit spitting upon public sidewalks and in other public places in the City of Las Vegas", which was adopted on motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Blanding, and passed upon the following vote: Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Blanding, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

The Clerk was directed to write to the Park Commission requesting them to change the park fence at the corner of Stewart and Fifth Streets so as to permit drivers of approaching vehicles an unobstructed view, thus lessening the possibility of future accidents. This action was taken upon motion of Commissioner Hodgens, seconded by Commissioner Blanding, and passed on the following vote. Commissioners Hodgens, Arnold, Blanding and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time C.C.Boyer appeared before the Board regarding the securing of Federal Aid for the improvement and construction of a Federal Aid Highway through the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, and after due discussion Commissioner Blanding presented the following Resolution:

WHEREAS under an act of the Congress of the United States approved Nov.9,1921

"An Act to amend the Act entitled "An Act to provide that the United States shall aid the States in the construction of rural post roads, and for other purposes," approved July 11,1916, as amended and supplemented, and for other purposes; it is provided among other matters and things that Federal Aid in the construction of Highways may be extended to municipalities having a population of less than two thousand five hundred as shown by the last available census," and

WHEREAS it is further provided that the construction, reconstruction and maintenance of the highways or parts of highways under the provisions of said act, and all contracts, plans, specifications and estimates relating thereto shall be undertaken by the State Highway Departments subject to the approval of the Secretary of Agriculture, and that all funds raised under the authority of the State or any political or other subdivision thereof, shall be made available for expenditure under the direct control of the State Highway Department, and

WHEREAS, the City of Las Vegas desires to avail itself of the benefits of said Act and to that end to co-operate with the Federal Government, through the Department of Highways, in the building, construction and maintenance of a paved or gravel surface highway along the route of the said highway through the City of Las Vegas, as now established and located or hereafter to be located.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, that the State Highway Department of the State of Nevada be requested to take such initial steps as may be necessary to carry the foregoing resolution into effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in accordance with Assembly Bill No.78, approved March 5th, 1923, Authorizing the City Commissioners of the City of

in the sum of One Thousand (\$1000) Dollars, and upon the approval of said bond by this Board.

~~At this time the City Assessor presented the sidewalk as essential for the construction of the proposed cement sidewalk on Fourth Street, whereupon, it was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Arnold, seconded by Commissioner Hodgins, that the City Clerk cause to be published a notice notifying all persons interested that they may be heard at the next regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners to be held on the 2nd day of May, 1923, at the hour of two o'clock P.M. Voting Commissioners Hodgins, Arnold, Blanding, and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Noes, none.~~

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of T. Merritt for a gaming license (2 games) at the building in the rear of the First State Bank, the same having been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Thos. R. Hodgins, whereupon it was the order of the Board, upon motion of Commissioner Hodgins, seconded by Commissioner Blanding, that the license be granted as applied for.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of Al. James for a gaming license (2 games) at the Arizona Club, the same having been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner

Las Vegas to issue bonds of the said City of Las Vegas for the total amount of not to exceed \$50,000.00. The City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas hereby agree that before issuing all or any portion of the said bonds, or incurring any indebtedness hereunder, the question of the issuance of said bonds shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of said City of Las Vegas, either at the next general election or at a special election to be held as set forth in Section 3 of said Assembly Bill No. 78 (a copy being attached hereto). The City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas agree to set aside in a special fund such funds as will be required to meet the City's share of the cost of the work proposed under this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such improvement work shall consist of grading, paving and gravel surface from the northerly City limits to the easterly City limits of the said City of Las Vegas, all of which construction shall conform with the specifications prepared by the Department of Highways and approved by the Federal Government.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas do by this resolution agree and make available and place under the control of the State Highway Department of the State of Nevada, such funds as shall be annually required to properly maintain to the required Government Standard, after constructing the highways and streets herein provided for.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that three copies of this resolution duly certified by the City Clerk be forwarded to the State Highway Department of the State of Nevada.

The motion to adopt the foregoing resolution was duly seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and upon roll call, the vote thereon was as follows:

WHEREUPON, the Mayor declared the resolution adopted.

Thereupon the following Resolution was presented by Commissioner Blanning:

WHEREAS this Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, did on the 4th day of April A.D. 1923 at a regular meeting adopt a Resolution requesting the Department of Highways of the State of Nevada to take the initial steps as are necessary for said City of Las Vegas in securing Federal Aid towards the improvement and paving or graveling of the surface of Main Street from the northerly city limits to Fremont Street and of Fremont Street from Main Street to the easterly City limits, and

WHEREAS said Department of Highways of the State of Nevada now has a survey party in this vicinity and

WHEREAS it is the desire of this Board that the improvement above mentioned should be begun at the earliest possible date and

WHEREAS it will considerably decrease the cost of the preliminary survey if the work be done while the above mentioned survey party is easily available,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Department of Highways of the State of Nevada be requested to make the preliminary survey for the improvements as set forth in the Resolution heretofore adopted as soon as possible and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board will make available sufficient funds for the payment of the cost of said survey upon the presentation of proper claims by said Department of Highways of the State of Nevada and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of this Board be and she is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of said Resolution to the Department of Highways of the State of Nevada.

This Resolution was seconded by Commissioner Hodgson, and adopted on the following vote: Commissioners Hodgson, Arnold, Blanning and Mayor Pro Tem Dentner, Aye. Yeas, none.

Thereupon, there being no further business to come before the Board at this time, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Blanning, seconded by Commissioner Arnold, and duly carried that the Board adjourn until Wednesday the second day of May, A.D. 1923, at the hour of two o'clock P.M.
