At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 15th day of October, 1923, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock p.m. Present Hon. W. C. German, the Mayor, with Commissioners A. R. Anderson, C. E. Shield and E. H. Elwell, together with the City Attorney and City Clerk,

At this time the Board took under consideration the schedule of rates as presented by S. W. Craner to the public Service Commission, and it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, and duly carried, that said schedule of rates be recommended for adoption with the provision that the server, S. W. Craner supply the users with plenty of water. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Shield and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor W. C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

At this time it appearing to the Board that the Fair Board has requested that the mayor be authorized to issue a proclamation for all business houses to close between the hours of one and five p. m. on two days of the Fair, it was ordered on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Shield, and duly carried, that the mayor be and he is hereby authorized to confer with the Fair Board and to issue a proclamation requesting all business houses to close between the hours of one and five p.m. on one day during the Southern Nevada Fair. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Shield, and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

On motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Shield, it was ordered that hereafter bills will be considered and acted upon only at the regular meetings held on the first Tuesday of every month. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Shield and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

At this time it was the order of the Board, upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that the Clerk notify City Health officer, C. E. Balette that it is the desire of this Board that he be present at the regular monthly meetings of said Board, held on the first Tuesday of each month, and that he submit a report in writing at that time. Voting Commissioner Anderson, Shield and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

Upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Shield, the following preamble and Resolution were duly adopted:

Whereas, on the 7th day of July, 1923 Carl Winegart, upon a plea of guilty to a charge of unlawfully manufacturing, storing and keeping for sale intoxicating liquor in violation of Ordinance No. 93 of the City of Las Vegas, was duly sentenced by the Municipal Judge in the Municipal Court of the City of Las Vegas to pay a fine of two hundred and ninety dollars (\$290.00), and in default thereof to serve by imprisonment in the City Jail of the City of Las Vegas one day for each two dollars of said fine, a total of one hundred and forty days, and

Whereas, in default of the payment of said fine, or any part thereof, said Carl Winegart was on said 7th day of July, 1923 duly committed to the City Jail of said City of Las Vegas to

serve said sentence as aforesaid, and  
 Whereas, said Carl Winowart has since said 7th day of July, 1923 been confined in said City Jail under said commitment and sentence, and is still confined in said City Jail under said commitment and sentence, and has served one hundred (100) days of said sentence up to and including this 15th day of October 1923 and  
 Whereas, during the period of his incarceration of said Carl Winowart has proved himself a model prisoner, trustworthy and industrious, and in the capacity of a "trusty" has well and faithfully performed valuable services for said City in driving the surtinking truck of the City for a long period of time, and also in the hauling of gravel for the street, and in various other capacities, including valuable assistance in fire parties and at fires occurring in said City, and  
 whereas, these matters have been brought to the attention of the Board of City Commissioners from time to time by the Police Commissioner, the Chief of Police and other parties, and said Board is convinced that this is a proper case for clemency.  
 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, duly assembled at an adjourned regular meeting of said Board on this 15th day of October, 1923, do hereby recommend to the Board of Pardons and Parole of the State of Nevada, the remission of the remainder of said fine so entered against said Carl Winowart, and the commutation of his imprisonment for the remainder of the term necessary in the ordinary course to serve out said fine; that a certified copy (certified by the city clerk) be made of this Resolution, and immediately forwarded to said Board of Pardons and Parole, with request for speedy action upon the application hereby made.  
 The vote of said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners C. R. Shield, W. H. Elwell, A. R. Anderson, and His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, voting aye. None none.

At this time the City Attorney read for the first time proposed Ordinance No. 102 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance to amend Subdivision number 8 of Sec. 2 of Ordinance No. 61 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled 'An Ordinance to amend Section Seven (7) of Ordinance No. 48 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled 'An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas, licensing, for the purpose of regulation and revenue, every kind of lawful business hereinafter specified, transacted or carried on within the corporation limits of the City of Las Vegas, State of Nevada, fixing the rates of license tax upon the same and providing for the collection of said license tax, and a punishment for carrying on or conducting any such business without a license, and repealing Ordinances Nos. 1, 2, 4, 13, 14 and 35,' approved December 3, 1913 and amended Dec. 13, 1915 by Ordinance No. 62 of the City of Las Vegas, and further amended March 5, 1919 by Ordinance No. 74 of the City of Las Vegas, and to amend Section 6 of said Ordinance No. 28 as created by said Ordinance No. 74, and repealing all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict therewith," and same was passed to the second reading upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Shield and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor W. C. German, Aye. None none.

Thereupon the City Attorney read for the first time proposed Ordinance No. 103 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance to Amend Section No. 1 of Ordinance No. 10 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled 'An Ordinance Defining Vagrancy and Providing Penalties for Vagrancy,' and repealing all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict therewith", and upon motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, the same was laid on the table until the next regular meeting. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Shield and Elwell, Aye. His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, No.

At this time the Mayor, W. C. German, asked the City Attorney whether it was permissible for the Mayor to make or second a motion without crossing the chair, and was advised by the City Attorney that this Board is a Board of Commissioners, and no order could prohibit the Mayor from either making or seconding a motion, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. None none.
