

Thereupon the Clerk also read for the first time the draft of proposed Ordinance No. 103 as proposed by Mayor German. Thereupon it was ordered on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Shield that the draft of said proposed Ordinance No. 103, as drawn by the City Attorney be amended by striking out section 2 and section 6a which contains the closing restrictions, and by striking from sec. 6b, between lines 16 and 17 the words "or other obstruction," and by striking from the title the word "two" and substituting the word "a", and striking out the suffix "s" from the word Sections--all between lines 1 and 2 and also to strike out the words "6a and", and the word "respectively" between lines 2 and 3. Voting on said motion Commissioners Anderson, Shield and Elwell, Aye. His Honor the Mayor W. C. German, No.

On motion of Commissioner Shield, seconded by Commissioner Anderson it was ordered that said draft of proposed ordinance No. 103, drawn by the City Attorney be passed as amended to the second reading. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Shield, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, Aye. Nones, none.

Thereupon it was ordered on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Shield that the Board adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held Tuesday, the 4th day of December, A. D. 1923, at the hour of seven thirty o'clock p. m. *Voting Commissioner Anderson, Shield, Elwell and*

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 4th day of December, A. D. 1923, at the hour of seven thirty o'clock p. m. Present His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, with Commissioners A. R. Anderson, and W. H. Elwell, together with the city Attorney and city clerk, Commissioner C. A. Shield being absent.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read, and there appearing to be no omissions or corrections, it was ordered that they be approved as read.

Reports of officers were read and ordered placed on file in the office of the Clerk.

All claims allowed as per claim book on file in the office of the clerk, excepting that the claim of Edwin T. West in the sum of \$5.00; the claim of Ed. Von Tobel in the sum of \$9.70, and the claim of Ed W. Clark Fwd. Co in the sum of \$4.00 were ordered held up for further investigation.

Thereupon the clerk read for the first time proposed ordinance No. 104 of the City of Las Vegas, the same having been submitted as an emergency ordinance, entitled "An ordinance creating a Board of Park Trustees, providing for the appointment of members thereof, defining their powers and duties and other matters relating thereto."

Thereupon it was the resolution of the board, upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that an emergency exists and the enactment of the above entitled ordinance is necessary by reason of such emergency. Voting on said resolution Commissioners Anderson and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Nones, none.

Thereupon it was the order of the board that the above entitled ordinance be and the same is hereby passed as an emergency ordinance. Voting Commissioner Anderson and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Nones, None.

At this time the Clerk read for the second time proposed ordinance No. 103 of the City of Las Vegas, as drawn up by the City Attorney, entitled,

"An ordinance to amend Section six (6) of Ordinance to prohibit gaming in the City of Las Vegas, without first obtaining a license therefor, regulating the same, fixing the amount of such license, providing a penalty therefor, and repealing all Ordinances in conflict therewith, and to amend said ordinance No. 77 by adding a new section 6a, and to repeal all Ordinances and parts of

ordinances in conflict with said amendments."

Thereupon it was the motion of Commissioner Andersen, seconded by Commissioner Elwell that said proposed ordinance be amended by inserting the words "or other obstruction" after the word "screen", between lines 16 and 17, page 2. Voting on said motion Commissioners Anderson and Elwell, Aye. His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German Voting no.

After listening to considerable discussion regarding said proposed ordinance, the same was passed and adopted, on motion of commissioner Elwell, upon the following vote:- Commissioners Anderson and Elwell, Aye. His Honor the Mayor W. C. German, No.

At this time Division Engineer C. C. Boyer of the Department of Highways, submitted his estimate on the proposed improvement by gravel surfacing 16 foot strips on either side of the proposed 18 foot Federal Aid Highway, and the same was ordered placed on file.
