Upon motion of Commissioner Shield, seconded by Commissioner Matzdorf, the Clerk was directed to post and publish the following notice of Public Improvement in accordance with the requirements of the Charter. Voting Commissioners Matzdorf, Anderson, Shield, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor W. C. German, aye. Noes, none.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT.

Notice is HEREBY GIVEN, that the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas propose to cause to be constructed the following: a surface 16 feet in width on each side of the proposed Las Vegas Federal Aid Highway on Fremont Street in the City of Las Vegas, between Main and Fifth Streets, and including the intersections with Main, First, Second, Third, and Fourth Streets and with the alley between Main and First Streets. It is proposed to construct a surface 5 inches thick (6 1/2 ins. loose) in accordance with Department of Highways Standard specification; using screenings from the Nevada Lime & Rock Company Quarry at Sloan, Nevada. It is proposed to provide the expense of such construction to be paid by special assessment according to benefits of the area affected by such improvement; such district being more particularly described as the Los Angeles & Salt Lake R. R. Co. station grounds (unplatted), South half of blocks 2, 15, 18, 21 and 34 and the North Half of blocks 3, 14, 19, 30 and 35 in Clark's Las Vegas Townsite; all as more particularly described in the plats and diagrams hereinafter mentioned.

Said Board will meet at the Commissioners' room in the County Court House at Las Vegas, Nevada on Monday, the 28th day of January, 1924 and consider any suggestions and objections that may be made by parties in interest to the proposed improvements.

Estimates of the expense of said proposed improvements, and plats and diagrams of the work and locality to be improved are on file with the City Clerk for public examination.

It was ordered, on motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Matzdorf, that the salary of the City Treasurer be increased from the sum of Twenty-five (\$25) Dollars per month to the sum of Fifty (\$50) Dollars per month, commencing January 1st, 1924.
