At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 26th day of February, A.D. 1924, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. This being the time set by law for the preparation of a Budget, thereupon, the Board proceeded to take up the budget and tax levy for the year 1924, in accordance with the provisions of the State of Nevada, and the matter being discussed at length it was ordered, upon motion being duly made by Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Shield, and unanimously carried that the following Budget be adopted, the vote on said motion being as follows: Commissioners Matzdorf, Shield, Anderson and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. Thereupon the following Resolution was adopted by the Board upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Kwell:

BE IT RESOLVED that the said Budget be signed in behalf of this Board by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk and the same be filed with the City Clerk and a copy thereof be published in a weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas, for two publications, one week apart. The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Matsdorf, Shield, Anderson and Kwell, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Noes, none.

The Board then proceeded to take up the matter of the levy of taxes for the City of Las Vegas for the year 1924. Upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, and duly carried, the following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that an ad valorem tax of five cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Salary Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of twelve cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Street Fund of the City of Las Vegas.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of three and one half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Sewer Bond Interest Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of fifteen and one half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Sewer Bond Redemption Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of seven cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Highway Bond Interest Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT an ad valorem tax of eight cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Highway Bond Redemption Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of seventeen and one half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Light Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an advalorem tax of two and one half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Cemetery Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an advalorem tax of eight cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Publicity Fund.

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Matsdorf, Shield, Anderson and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the following Resolution was adopted upon motion of Commissioner Shield, seconded by Commissioner Elwell:

RESOLVED that the City Clerk be and she is hereby authorized and directed to notify the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Nevada, of the tax rate established and levied by this Board for the year 1924, and to direct said Board of County Commissioners to levy and cause to be collected and paid at the sum of seventy-nine cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property, situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, except such property as is exempt from taxation. Voting on said Resolution Commissioners Matsdorf, Shield, Anderson and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time R.E. Kincaid appeared before the Board in response to the summons of the Board, regarding the contemplated revoking of the license issued to Mr. Kincaid at the Lincoln Hotel. After due discussion between Mr. Kincaid and the Board action on the matter was deferred.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, it was ordered upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that the Board adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on the 4th day of March, A.D. 1924, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. Voting Commissioners Matsdorf, Shield, Anderson, and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.
