

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an advalorem tax of two and one half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Cemetery Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an advalorem tax of eight cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1924, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Las Vegas Publicity Fund.

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Matzdorf, Shield, Anderson and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

Thereupon the following Resolution was adopted upon motion of Commissioner Shield, seconded by Commissioner Elwell:

RESOLVED that the City Clerk be and she is hereby authorized and directed to notify the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Nevada, of the tax rate established and levied by this Board for the year 1924, and to direct said Board of County Commissioners to levy and cause to be collected and paid the sum of seventy-nine cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property, situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, except such property as is exempt from taxation. Voting on said Resolution Commissioners Matzdorf, Shield, Anderson and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Nays, none.

At this time R. K. Kincaid appeared before the Board in response to the summons of the Board, regarding the contemplated revoking of the license issued to Mr. Kincaid at the Lincoln Hotel. After due discussion between Mr. Kincaid and the Board action on the matter was deferred.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time, it was ordered upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that the Board adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on the 4th day of March, A.D. 1924, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. Voting Commissioners Matzdorf, Shield, Anderson, and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 11th day of March, 1924. Present His Honor the Mayor, W. C. German, with Commissioners F. E. Matsdorf, A. R. Anderson and W. H. Elwell, together with the City Attorney A. W. Ham, Esq. and the City Clerk, Commissioner C. B. Shield being absent.

At this time all claims were allowed as per claim book.

At this time a committee from the Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce appeared before the Board and a discussion of the routing of the proposed Federal Aid Highway.

At this time the question of constructing a cement sidewalk on the west side of second street, the following Resolution was adopted upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf:

"BE IT RESOLVED that it is the determination of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas to order the construction of a concrete sidewalk along the West side of Second Street in Clark's Las Vegas Townsite, City of Las Vegas, as follows, to-wit: Commencing at the intersection of Second Street with Garces Street and running thence northerly along the West side of Second Street to and including Lot 25, Block 15, Clark's Las Vegas Townsite, City of Las Vegas, excepting Lots 23 to 28 incl., Block 10 of said Townsite fronting on said Second Street, Lots 21 to 27 incl. and the north twenty feet of lot 22 in Block 11, said Townsite fronting on Second Street, Lots 17 to 23 incl. in Block 13, said Townsite fronting on Second Street, and lot 12, Block 14, said Townsite fronting on Second Street; said sidewalk to be constructed in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas relating to the construction of sidewalks, being Ordinance No. 47; the cost of said improvement to be done at the exclusive cost of the owners of the ground fronting on said proposed area of improvement and abutting on said proposed improvement, and shall be collected by special assessment assessed upon the taxable lots and premises abutting upon said improvement in proportion to their number of feet of frontage. And the Commissioner of Streets and Public Places is hereby directed to prepare an estimate of the cost of said improvements and plans and diagrams of same."

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioner Matsdorf, Anderson and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor W. C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

It was the order of the Board upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, that this Board does hereby, rescind the resolutions previously adopted on the following dates to-wit: July 19, 1923, and January 8, 1924, which Resolutions read as follows, respectively:
