Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, January 6th, 1925.

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 6th day of January, A.D. 1925, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. Present Hon. W.C. German, Mayor, with Commissioners F.B. Matsdorf, W.E. Elwell and A.R. Anderson, together with the City Attorney, A.W. Ham, and the City Clerk.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read, and there being no omissions or corrections were approved as read.

Reports of officers were read, approved and ordered placed on file in the office of the Clerk.

All claims allowed was perclaim book on file in the office of the Clerk of this Board.

On motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, the Clerk was directed to draw a warrant in favor of E.W. Griffith and Son in the following amounts: \$363.02 on the General Fund of the City of Las Vegas, and \$41.58 on the Sidewalk Assessment Fund #9, said payments being on account of the construction of the concrete sidewalk on the west side of Second Street, as per contract between the City of Las Vegas and E.W. Griffith and Son. Voting Commissioners Elwell, Matsdorf and Anderson and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

There upon it was ordered upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to draw a warrant in the sum of \$566.80 on the General Fund of the City of Las Vegas, in favor of the Pacific Tank and Pipe Company of Los Angeles in part payment of the account of \$1066.80 due said Company. Voting Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell, Anderson and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

Thereupon the Clerk was directed to draw a warrant in the sum of \$3027.36 in favor of the State Highway Department the balance due on the city's share of the cost of the improvement of Fremont and Main Streets under Federal Aid. This order was made upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, and was passed on the following vote; Commissioners Anderson, Matsdorf, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

At this time the Clerk presented the application of Ronald Gibson for a gaming license for two games at the Big Four, the same having been approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Matsdorf, whereupon, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a gaming license for two games to Ronald Gibson at the Big Four on First Street. Voting Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell, Anderson and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of J.L. McLaurine for a gaming license for two games at the Exchange Pool Hall on Fremont Street, the same having heretofore been approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Matsdorf, whereupon, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a gaming license for two games to J.L. McLaurine at the Exchange Pool Hall on Fremont Street. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Matsdorf, and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Nays, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of R.E. Bay for a gaming license for two games at the Arizona Club on First Street, the same having been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Matsdorf, whereupon, it was ordered upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a gaming license for two games to R.E. Bay at the Arizona Club on First Street. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Matsdorf, and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of Morgan, Stocker and Horden for a gaming license for five games at the Vegas Bar on Fremont Street, the same having been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Matsdorf, whereupon, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a gaming license for five games to Morgan, Stocker and Horden at the Vegas Bar on Fremont Street. Voting Commissioners Matsdorf, Anderson and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nays, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of Morgan, Stocker and Horden for a gaming license for two games at the Northern Bar, the same having been heretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Matsdorf, whereupon, it was ordered, upon motion duly made and carried that the Clerk do and she is hereby directed to issue a gaming license for two games to Morgan, Stocker and Horden at the Northern Bar on Fremont Street. Voting Commissioners Elwell, Anderson and Matsdorf and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time the Clerk presented the following communication:

Las Vegas, Nevada, January 5, 1925.

To the Honorable Board of City Commissioners,
Las Vegas, Nevada:

Gentlemen:

In reference to Mr. John L. Russell's offer to donate land dated October 18th, 1924, for a tarrest extension of Clark Avenue in Original Townsite of Las Vegas through his land along the South line of $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 28 and along South line of $\frac{1}{2}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 29, Tp. 20 S.R. 61 E.R.D.B. & H. to connect with the old L.V. & T.R.R. grade now used for State Highway, will state that your Mayor and Councilman A.R. Anderson asked me to give probable cost of survey to obtain description for the necessary deed and make plat for city records.

Mr. Russell had planned to lay road out on different lines and had paid me to make survey of his boundary lines, and feels that as he is willing to donate the land while other people are being paid for rights of way, that the city should be willing to pay for street survey, which I will guarantee not to cost over Seventy-five (\$75.00) Dollars including a map for filing record in your city records. I will need two chainmen at \$5.00 per day each for two days and myself at \$15.00 per day after which survey I would take part of day to make up map and deed.

Thereupon, after due consideration, the Clerk was directed, upon motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, to notify Mr. McWilliams that the city will pay for the survey as set forth in the above letter in a sum not to exceed \$75.00, said sum to be paid to Mr. McWilliams upon delivery to the city of deed to a fifty foot right of way, as above described. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Elwell, Matsdorf and the Mayor, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon, there being no further business to come before the Board at this time, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, that the Board adjourn until the next regular meeting to be held on the 3rd day of February, A.D. 1925.
