At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 3rd day of February, A.D.1925, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. Present Hon. W.C.German, Mayor, with Commissioners A.R. Anderson, W. H. Elwell and F.E. Matsdorf together with the City attorney F.A. Stevens and the City Clerk.

The minutes of the previous regular and special meetings were read, and there being no omissions or corrections, were approved as read.

Reports of officers read, approved and ordered placed on file in the office of the Clerk of the Board.

All bills allowed as per claim book on file in the Office of the Clerk. The Claim of R. E. Cowan for service as City Police was reduced from the sum of \$100 to \$85 on recommendation of the Police & Fire Commissioner.

At this time A.A. Hinman requesting the repeal of Ordinance No. 75 of the City of Las Vegas. After listening to Mr. Hinmans statement an order was made, and motion of Commissioner Elwell, instructing the City Attorney to draw an ordinance repealing subdivision 27 of section 1 of ordinance no. 75 of the City of Las Vegas. The vote on said motion was as follows:- Commissioners Anderson, Elwell, Matsdorf and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. None, none.

Thereupon the Clerk read a communication from Mr. H. A. Whitebeck, principal of the High School containing recommendations for the revision of the existing curfew law, whereupon and order was made, upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, instructing the City Attorney to draw an amendment to the curfew ordinance (Ordinance No. 20) conforming to the recommendations contained in Mr. Whitebeck's letter.

An order was made upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell directing the Clerk to draw a warrant in favor of E. J. Griffith & Son, in the sum of \$60., the balance due on contract for concrete cement sidewalk on the west side of second street.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of G. Lopez for a gaming license (two games) at the Elwell building back of the First State bank, the same having been therefore approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner, whereupon it was ordered upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, that said application be granted, seconded by Commissioner Elwell. The Clerk was ordered to issue a gaming license for two games to the applicant, G.Lopez.

At this time the Board took under consideration the City Budget and tax levy for the year 1925, and the matter was continued for further discussion at a regular adjourned meeting to be held on Tuesday, the 17th day of February at the hour of seven thirty o'clock P.M.

At this time C.C. Boyer, Division Engineer of the Department of Highways of the State of Nevada, presented to the Board the proposition of altering the original plan of construction of the Federal Aid Highway through the City of Las Vegas, whereby the Willits surface was to be laid over the present base, and stated to the Board that this plan did not meet with the approval of the Bureau of Public Roads; that said Bureau of Public Roads believed that unless the present base were removed the street when finished would be much too high. Thereupon, after considerable discussion, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matzdorf, that this Board enter into an agreement with the State Highway Department to have the base removed, as above suggested, and it appearing to the Board that the cost of the said proposed work to the City will be \$3318.00, it was further ordered that this Board shall make available for said work the above mentioned sum of \$3318.00. Voting on said Resolution Commissioners Anderson, Matzdorf, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nocs, none.

Thereupon the Board took under advisement the question of issuing an additional Four Thousand (\$4,000.00) Dollars worth of bonds to meet the cost of the additional work decided upon in connection with the construction of a Federal Aid Highway through the City of Las Vegas to connect with route 6 of the State Highway system of the State of Nevada, it appearing to the Board that the amount of money now remaining in the State Highway Fund is insufficient to cover the cost of said proposed additional work, and it also appearing to the Board of City Commissioners by an Act of the Legislature of the State of Nevada that the City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas have the authority to issue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.00 for the construction of a highway through the City of Las Vegas to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway System under an act of the Legislature of the State of Nevada in convention assembled, entitled, "An Act authorizing the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, to issue bonds to provide for the construction of a highway through said City of Las Vegas, to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway system of the State of Nevada; and providing for the ratification thereof by special or general election before the issuance of any such bonds," approved March 5, 1923, and

It further appearing to this Board that Thirty Four Thousand (\$34,000.00) Dollars worth of said authorized issue of bonds has been sold for the purpose above mentioned, and it also appearing that the further sum of \$3,318.00 is required for additional work in connection with said construction, and it further appearing to the Board of City Commissioners that the amount of money now remaining in the State Highway Fund of the said City of Las Vegas is insufficient to meet the cost of the additional work contemplated.

Now, THEREFORE, on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matzdorf, the question being put to the Board, the following Preambles and Resolutions were regularly and duly adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board:

WHEREAS, pursuant and in strict compliance with the provisions and authority of the constitution and laws of the State of Nevada, including the provisions of Chapter 74 of the Laws of the State of Nevada, 1923, being an act of the Senate and Assembly of the State of Nevada, entitled: "An Act authorizing the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark to issue bonds to provide for the construction of a highway through said City of Las Vegas to connect with route 6 of the State Highway System of the State of Nevada, and providing for the ratification thereof by special or general election before the issuance of any such bonds," approved March 5, 1923, the City of Las Vegas was authorized to issue its bonds in a sum not to exceed \$50,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a highway through the City of Las Vegas to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway system of the State of Nevada; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to each of the requirements of said Act, and particularly with the requirements of Secs. 2, 3, 4 and 5 of said Chapter 74 of the laws of 1923 of the State of Nevada, the question of the issuance of highway bonds of the City of Las Vegas to the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) was submitted to the qualified electors of the City of Las Vegas in the County of Clark, State of Nevada, at a general city election held in said City of Las Vegas on the 8th day of May, 1923, of which election Notice having first been duly given strictly as provided by law, and at which election more than a majority of the votes cast were in favor of the issuance of said bonds, and the result of the vote upon said question of the issuance of said bonds having been duly certified to this Board by the election boards conducting said election, and the result of the vote on said question of the issuance of said bonds having been by this Board at a meeting duly and regularly held on the 16th day of May, 1923, declared in the manner and form and at the same time as other returns of said general city election were canvassed and proclaimed; and

WHEREAS, it appears to this Board that the qualified electors of said City of Las Vegas have authorized the issuance of highway bonds of the City of Las Vegas in the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), and

WHEREAS, it appears to this Board that the issuance of not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars of said highway bonds has been authorized by said act of the legislature of the State of Nevada, and such issuance ratified by the vote of qualified electors of the City of Las Vegas at a general city election held as aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas deems it advisable for the best interests of the City of Las Vegas that it offer for sale at this time Las Vegas Highway bonds in the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) of said authorized issue of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of said bonds, and that same be sold at private sale,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions and authority of said above mentioned Act, and the ratification thereof at said general city election as aforesaid, it be and is hereby ordered that prior to the 1st day of January 1925, bonds of said City of Las Vegas in an aggregate amount of not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars, (\$4,000.00) exclusive of interest, being a part of said issue as authorized of \$50,000.00 of Las Vegas Highway bonds for the purpose of providing funds for the construction of a highway through said City of Las Vegas to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway system of the State of Nevada, be prepared and ready for issuance, that said bonds as so prepared shall be each in the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) numbered from thirty-five (35) to thirty-eight (38) consecutively, and shall bear annual interest at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum from the date thereof, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of July and the 2nd day of January of each year payable at the office of the City Treasurer of said City of Las Vegas, in the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, State of Nevada; that said bonds shall be designated "Las Vegas Highway Bonds (1925 series)", and shall be dated January 1, 1925, and that said bonds shall be negotiable coupon bonds and shall mature and become payable as follows:

Bonds thirty-five (35) and thirty-six (36) to become due and payable on or before the first day of July, 1948; bonds thirty-seven (37) and thirty-eight (38) to become due and payable on or before the first day of July, 1943.

The payment and redemption of said bonds will be in the order of their issuance, the lowest bond being the first paid and redeemed, and so on until the whole amount of said bonds shall have been paid and redeemed.

Each of said bonds shall have coupons attached representing each interest installment to date of maturity of the principal. Both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable in gold coin of the United States of America, at present standard of eight and fineness, at the office of the City Treasurer of the City of Las Vegas, in the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, State of Nevada. Interest on said bonds shall cease as the same mature.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that said bonds and coupons with the necessary variations as to numbers and maturities, shall be in substantially the following form, respectively, to-wit:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That the City of Las Vegas, Municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Nevada, acknowledges itself to be indebted and for value received hereby promises to pay the bearer on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 19\_\_\_\_, the principal sum of One Thousand Dollars, together with interest thereon from date hereof until paid, at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of July and the 2nd day of January of each year, which interest to the date of the maturity of the principal is evidenced by and payable upon presentation and surrender of the annexed interest coupons as they severally become due. Interest on this bond shall cease on the date the bond becomes due and payable. Both principal and interest on this bond are payable in Gold Coin of the United States of America, at present standard, of weight and fineness, at the office of the City Treasurer in the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, State of Nevada, and forth prompt payment of the principal and interest of these bonds as they respectively become due, the full faith, credit and resources of said City are hereby irrevocably pledged.

This bond is one of a series like date, tenor and amount but different maturities issued for the purpose of constructing a highway through said City of Las Vegas to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway System, and pursuant to an election duly called and held at which more than a majority of the qualified electors voted in favor of the issuance of said bonds, and proceeding of the Board of City Commissioners duly passed and adopted, and it authorized by and issued in full conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and laws of the State of Nevada, including Chapter 74 of the Session Laws of said State for the year 1925, and all acts of the Legislature amendatory thereof, and supplemental thereto.

It is further certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution of laws of the State of Nevada to exist, happen and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this bond have existed, happened and have been performed in regular and due form, time and manner as required by law, and that the amount of this bond together with all other indebtedness of said City does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitations.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on Tuesday the 17th day of February, A.D. 1925, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. Present Hon. W.C. German, Mayor, with Commissioners A.R. Anderson, P.E. Matsdorf and W.H. Elwell, together with the City Attorney, J.A. Stevens, and the City Clerk.

At this time the City Attorney read for the first time proposed ordinance No. 108 of the City of Las Vegas, being an amendment to section 1 of Ordinance No. 75 of the City of Las Vegas, and same was passed to the second reading upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, the vote being as follows: Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell, Anderson and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the City Attorney read for the first time proposed Ordinance No. 109 of the City of Las Vegas, the same being an ordinance to prevent children under eighteen years of age from loitering on the public streets or in other public places in the City of Las Vegas at night, and the same was passed to the second reading on motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, and passed on the following vote, to-wit: Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell, Anderson, and His Honor the Mayor W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time the Board took under consideration the matter of instructing the City Attorney to draft a new dance ordinance, as per the recommendation of the Grand Jury of Clark County, and after considerable discussion the matter was continued until the next regular meeting for further discussion.
