At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on Tuesday the 17th day of February, A.D. 1925, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. Present Hon. W.C. German, Mayor, with Commissioners A.R. Anderson, P.E. Matsdorf and W.H. Elwell, together with the City Attorney, F.A. Stevens, and the City Clerk.

At this time the City Attorney read for the first time proposed ordinance No. 108 of the City of Las Vegas, being an amendment to section 1 of Ordinance No. 75 of the City of Las Vegas, and same was passed to the second reading upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, the vote being as follows: Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell, Anderson and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the City Attorney read for the first time proposed Ordinance No. 109 of the City of Las Vegas, the same being an ordinance to prevent children under eighteen years of age from loitering on the public streets or in other public places in the City of Las Vegas at night, and the same was passed to the second reading on motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, and passed on the following vote, to-wit: Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell, Anderson, and His Honor the Mayor W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time the Board took under consideration the matter of instructing the City Attorney to draft a new dance ordinance, as per the recommendation of the Grand Jury of Clark County, and after considerable discussion the matter was continued until the next regular meeting for further discussion.

On motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, the City Attorney was

instructed to draft an ordinance to amend Ordinance No.107 of the City of Las Vegas, by instructing the City Attorney to make it within the discretion of the Board to revoke the license of the proprietor after conviction, instead of ~~revoke~~ by changing the word "must" to "may", and such other amendment as are necessary to carry out the intent of the ordinance. The vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Matsdorf, Anderson, Elwell, Aye. His Honor, the Mayor, W.C.German, Aye. Noes, none.

Upon motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, it was ordered that the prosecution of the case pending under Ordinance No.107 of the City of Las Vegas be put over until the 3rd day of March, 1925, pending the first and second readings of the proposed amendments to said ordinance. Voting on said motion Commissioner Elwell, Matsdorf, and Anderson, Aye. His Honor the Mayor, W.C.German, Aye. Noes, none.

This being the time set by law for the preparation of a Budget, thereupon the Board proceeded to take up the budget and tax levy for the year 1925, in accordance with the provisions of the State of Nevada, and the matter being discussed at length it was ordered, upon motion being duly made by Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, that the following Budget be adopted. Voting on said motion: Commissioners Anderson, Elwell, Matsdorf, and His Honor the Mayor, W.C.German, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the following resolution was adopted by the Board upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf:

BE IT RESOLVED that the said Budget be signed in behalf of this Board by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk and the same be filed with the City Clerk and a copy thereof be published in a weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas, for two publications, one week apart. The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Matsdorf, Anderson, and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, W.C.German, Aye. Noes, none.

The Board then proceeded to take up the matter of the levy of taxes for the City of Las Vegas for the year 1925. Upon motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, and duly

carried, the following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of twelve and one-half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Salary Fund.

RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of nineteen and one-half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Street Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of nine and one-half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Light Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of six cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Cemetery Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of seven and one-half cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Publicity Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of two cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Sewer Bond Interest Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of fourteen cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Sewer Bond Redemption Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of nine cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Highway Bond Interest Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an advalorem tax of eight cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1925, including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known and used as the Highway Bond Redemption Fund of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioner Matsdorf, Anderson and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

Thereupon the following Resolution was adopted upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell:

RESOLVED that the City Clerk be and she is hereby authorized and directed to notify the Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Nevada, of the tax rate established and levied by this Board for the year 1925, and to direct said Board of County Commissioners to levy and cause to be collected and paid the sum of eighty-eight cents on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, except including the net proceeds of mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation. Voting on said Resolution Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell and Anderson, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Hoos none.

Thereupon the following Resolution was adopted upon motion of Commissioner Elwell, second-

ed by Commissioner Matsdorf;

RESOLVED that licenses and fines collected in the City of Las Vegas during the year 1925 be divided as follows, to-wit: General Fund, 50%; Police and Fire Fund, 50%. Voting on said Resolution Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell, and Anderson and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon, there being no further business to come before the Board at this time, it was ordered, upon motion duly made and carried, that the Board adjourn until Wednesday, the 25th day of February, A.D. 1925, at the hour of three-thirty o'clock P.M., when it shall again convene to consider such matters as may be brought before it at that time. Voting on said motion Commissioners Matsdorf, Elwell and Anderson and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Noes, none.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 25th day of February, A.D. 1925, at the hour of three-thirty o'clock P.M. Present His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, with Commissioners A.R. Anderson, W.H. Elwell and F.E. Matsdorf, together with the City Attorney F.A. Stevens, and the City Clerk.

At this time the Clerk read for the first time proposed ordinance No. 110 of the City of Las Vegas, the same being an amendment to Ordinance No. 107, and the same was ordered passed to the second reading on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Elwell, Matsdorf and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time the Board proceeded with the proposed private sale of Four Thousand (\$4,000.00) Dollars Las Vegas Highway bonds, this being the amount required to take care of unforeseen additional work on the improvement of Main and Fremont Streets under Federal Aid, said proposed sale having been decided upon at a regular meeting of the Board held on the 3rd day of February, A.D. 1925.
