

April 7th, 1925.

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 7th day of April, A.D. 1925, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock P.M. Present Hon. W.C. German, Mayor, with Commissioners A.R. Anderson, F.E. Matzdorf, and W.H. Elwell, together with acting city attorney Harley A. Harmon, and the City Clerk.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and there being no omissions or corrections were approved as read.

Reports of officers were read, approved and placed on file.

All claims allowed as per claim book on file in the office of the Clerk of the Board. The claim of the Mesquite Grocery for hay and a broom were referred to W.H. Elwell for further investigation.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the deed of Mary H. Russell, John L. Russell and D. Pecette to the City of Las Vegas to the following described property, to-wit: a parcel of land situate in Sections 28 and 29, Township 20 South, Range 61 East, M.D.B. & M., in the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, the same being a strip of land fifty (50) feet wide, twenty-five (25) feet on each side of the following described center line: Beginning at a point on the north and south center line of section 28, Tp. 20S., R. 68 E., M.D.B. & M. from which the south quarter section corner of said section 28 bears S. 0 45' W., 1347.1 feet; thence N. 89 36' W., 2661.85 feet to a point from which the section corner common to Sections 28, 29, 32 and 33 of said Township bears S., 0 25' E., 1365.7 feet; thence N. 88 44' W., 1354.41 feet; thence westerly on a curve with a radius of 700 feet; tangent to last mentioned course, and convex to the South, a distance of 642.83 feet to the intersection with the center line of the State Highway from Las Vegas to Tonopah, Nevada, containing 5.08 acres more or less, as shown on plat hereto attached and made a part thereof.

After due consideration of the matter it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matzdorf, that said deed be accepted by the City and that the city agree to gravel said piece of land for use as a city street within 18 mos. This order was ~~passed~~ passed on the following vote: Commissioners Anderson, Matzdorf and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Nocs, none.

At this time the Clerk presented the application of Morgan, Stocker and Horden for a gaming license for five games at the Vegas Bar, the same having been theretofore approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner, whereupon it was ordered upon motion of Commissioner Matzdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell that said application be granted and that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a license for five games to Morgan, Stocker and Horden at the Vegas Bar. Voting on said motion Commissioners Anderson, Matzdorf, and Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Nocs, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the application of A.C. Summers for a gaming license for two (2) games at the Big Four, the same having been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner, whereupon it was ordered, upon motion duly made and carried that said application be granted and that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a license for two (2) games to A.C. Summers at the Big Four. This order was passed on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, and the following vote: Commissioner Anderson, Matzdorf, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Nocs, none.

The Clerk then presented the application of J.L. McLaurine for a gaming license (2 Games) at the Exchange Pool Hall, the same having been theretofore approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner, whereupon it was ordered upon motion of Commissioner Matzdorf, seconded by Commissioner Anderson that said application be granted and that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a gaming license (2 games) to J.L. McLaurine at the Exchange Pool Hall. Voting on said motion; Commissioners Anderson, Elwell and Matzdorf and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German,

Aye, Hoos, none.

Whereupon the Clerk presented the application of G. Lopez for a gaming license (2 games) at the building in the rear of the First State Bank building, the same having been theretofore approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner, whereupon it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, that the said application be granted and that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to issue a gaming license for two games to G. Lopez at the building back of the First State Bank Building. Voting on said motion, Commissioners Anderson, Elwell, Matsdorf, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Hoos, none.

It appearing to the Board that the amended charter of the city of Las Vegas grants the Board of City Commissioners permission to pay the City Marshall and City Policeman a higher salary than they have heretofore received, and

It further appearing to the Board that said officers of the City of Las Vegas, to-wit the City Marshall and City Policeman are entitled to an increase in salary since they work long hours and carry heavy responsibility,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the salaries of the City Marshall and City Policeman respectively shall and they are hereby increased to the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars per month, said increase to include the salary for the month of April, payable May 1st, 1925.

Said Resolution was adopted on motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, and passed upon the following vote: Commissioners Anderson, Matsdorf, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

On motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, it was ordered that the Clerk be and she is hereby directed to draw a warrant for Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars in favor of the Pacific Tank and Pipe Co., of Los Angeles, on the Treasurer/as payment of a balance due said company. Voting on said motion; Commissioners Elwell, Anderson, Matsdorf and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Hoos, none.

The following Resolution was adopted upon motion of Commissioner Matsdorf, seconded by Commissioner Anderson:

Resolved that the licenses and fines for the month of March, 1925, be placed to the credit of the Police and Fire Fund, and be it further resolved that the Clerk of this Board shall so notify the City Treasurer. Voting on said motion: Commissioners Matsdorf, Anderson, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

At this time the Clerk presented therewith the resignation of Henry E. Lillis as Municipal Judge, as follows:

whereupon, it was ordered, on motion duly made and carried, that said resignation be and the same is hereby accepted to take effect at once. Said motion was made by Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, and was passed upon the following vote: Commissioners Elwell, Anderson, Matsdorf, and His Honor the Mayor, W.C. German, Aye. Hoos, none.

The matter of the appointment of a Municipal Judge for the City of Las Vegas, to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Henry E. Lillis, coming on before the Board, and it appearing that the only application for the position is the verbal application of C.D. Breese, the newly appointed Justice of the Peace of Las Vegas Township, it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matsdorf, that the said C.D. Breese, be and he is hereby appointed Municipal Judge of the City of Las Vegas, said appointment to take effect upon the filing and approval of a good and sufficient bond in the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars, and upon the taking of the oath of office provided by law. It was further ordered that the Mayor be and he is hereby directed to approve said

bond upon presentation by Mr. Breese. Voting on said motion Commissioners Anderson, Matzdorf, Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk read for the first time proposed ordinance No. 111 of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, entitled, "An Ordinance Prohibiting the manufacture, storage or keeping, sale, offering or exposing for sale or barter, or other disposal of intoxicating liquors in the City of Las Vegas; Regulating Other Matters Pertaining Thereto; Providing a Penalty for the Violation of this Ordinance, and Repealing All Ordinances and Parts of Ordinances in Conflict Therewith." On motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Matzdorf, it was ordered that said Ordinance be passed to the second reading. Voting Commissioners Anderson, Matzdorf, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon, there being no further business to come before the Board at this time it was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Matzdorf, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, that the Board adjourn until April 21st, 1925, at the hour of three-thirty o'clock P.M.
