Las Vegas, Nevada, January 7th, 1926.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 7th day of January, A.D. 1926, at the hour of three o'clock P.M. Present: G. Mandy, Mayor Pro Tem, with Commissioners C.J. Hammond, W.H. Elwell, and O.J. Smith, together with the City Attorney and City Clerk, Mayor J.P. Hesse, being absent.

The minutes of the previous regular and adjourned meetings were read and there being no omissions or corrections were approved as read.

Reports of officers were read, approved and ordered placed on file in the office of the Clerk.

All claims allowed as per claim book on file in the office of the Clerk. The claim of R.E. Cowan was reduced from \$200 to \$40 for the reason that the Board had allowed the claim of R.E. Lake, Jr., in the sum of \$160 for salary during the absence of the said R.E. Cowan.

On motion of Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, it was ordered that the licenses and fines for the month of December, 1925 be distributed as follows:

Licenses to the General Fund.

Fines to the Police and Fire Fund.

Voting on said motion: Commissioners Hammond, Smith and Elwell and Mayor Pro Tem, Mandy, Aye. Noes, none.

The Clerk was directed to notify W.C. Pulton, agent for the Standard Oil Company that this Board does not desire to sign any contract with the said Company.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the following communication:

To the City Commissioners,  
Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, wish to call your attention to the beauty parlor ordinance.

The license fee to conduct a beauty parlor under this ordinance is fifteen dollars, (\$15) per quarter, which, to our belief and judgment is excessive and against which we wish to protest. We believe this part of the ordinance should be amended, and wish to suggest that a fee of five dollars (\$5.00\* per quarter would seem to us to be more just and reasonable.

Thereupon said communication was laid on the table for further consideration.

On motion of Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Elwell, the following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that the State Highway Department of Nevada be authorized to negotiate with and purchase a right of way of S.R. Whitehead over a portion of Meadows addition to Las Vegas for the sum of \$270.00.

The vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Smith, Elwell, Hammond, and Mayor Pro Tem, Mandy voting aye. Noes, none.

Upon motion of Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Hammond, it was ordered that the sum of \$765.40 be transferred back from the Street Fund to the General Fund, from which it was heretofore transferred during the year 1925. Voting on said motion: Commissioners Hammond, Smith, Elwell and Mayor Pro Tem, Mandy, Aye. Noes, none.

Thereupon the Clerk presented the following applications for Gaming licenses, to-wit: the application of G. Lopez for two games at the Miner's Club; the application of A.T. McCarter for three games at the Exchange Pool Hall; the application of Morgan, Stocker and Horden for four games at the Vegas Bar; the application of Lilly and James for two games at the Criterion,

all of which had been theretofore approved by Police and Fire Commissioner Hammond. Upon motion of Commissioner Hammond, seconded by Commissioner Elwell it was ordered that gaming licenses issue to the following: G.Lopez, Miners Club, two games; A.T.McCarter, Exchange Pool Hall, three games; Morgan, Stocker and Horden, four games, Vegas Bar; Lilly and James, Criterion, two games; The vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Hammond, Smith, Elwell and Mayor Pro Tem Mundy voting aye. Noes, none.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time it was ordered on motion of Commissioner Elwell, seconded by Commissioner Smith, that the Board adjourn until <sup>next regular meeting to be held on Tuesday, 7th, 1926</sup> ~~Saturday the 16th day of January, 1926~~ at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County Nevada, held on the fourth day of February, A.D. 1926, at the hour of three o'clock P.M. Present Hon. J.F. Hesse, Mayor, with Commissioners W.B. Mundy, O.J. Smith and W.H. Elwell, together with the City Attorney, F.A. Stevens, Esq., and the City Clerk, Commissioner C.J. Hammond being absent.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read, and there being no omissions or corrections were approved as read.

Reports of officers were read, approved and ordered placed on file in the office of the Clerk of the Board.

All claims allowed as per claim book on file in the office of the clerk. The claim of R.E. Cowan in the sum of \$160.00 for services in December, 1925, was rejected for the reason that Mr. Cowan had offered to pay for the services of special police during the leave of absence granted him. The claim of the Mesquite Grocery in the sum of \$17.15 was ordered returned for itemization.

At this time Dr. W.S. Park appeared before the Board and presented a plat of the proposed Park Place subdivision, an addition to the City of Las Vegas, and upon motion of Commissioner Mundy, seconded by Commissioner Smith, it was ordered that said proposed subdivision be and the same is hereby approved, and it was further ordered that said approval be inscribed on said map by the Mayor Pro Tem, and attest by the City Clerk. Voting on said motion Commissioners Mundy, Smith, Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor J.F. Hesse, Aye. Noes, none.

At this time the Clerk brought up for consideration the request of beauty parlor operators for a reduction of occupation license, the same having been presented at the last meeting of the Board and taken under investigation. It was ordered, upon motion of Commissioner Mundy, seconded by Mayor Hesse, that the petition for reduction be denied at this time. Voting on said motion Commissioners Mundy, Smith, and Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor, J.F. Hesse, Aye. Noes, none.

The matter of the budget for the year 1926 was taken under consideration, and it was decided to meet on the 11th day of February for further discussion of the matter.
