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On
thereupon motion of Commissioner Smith, seconded by Com. Elwell, the budget as pre-
sented by the Clerk was approved and ordered filed in the various offices as required by
law. Voting on said motion: Commissioners Mundy, Smith, Elwell, and His Honor the Mayor,
J.F.Hesse, Aye. Nees, none.

At this time proposed Ordinance No. 124, entitled an Ordinance to amend, revise and
re-enact Section 22 of Ordinance No. 66, of the City of Las Vegas" was read for the first
time and laid over for second reading.

No further business appearing it was ordered on motion of Commissioner Elwell,
seconded by Commissioner Smith, same being unanimously carried that this board adjourn
until Wednesday, March 9, 1927, at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

At a regular meeting of the Board of the City Commissioners of the City of Las
Vegas, Nevada, held on the third day of March, A.D. 1927, at the hour of three o'clock P.M.
Present: Hon. J.F.Hesse, Mayor, with Commissioners W.B.Mundy, O.J.Smith, W.H.Elwell, together
with the City Attorney and the City Clerk. Commissioner C.J.Hammond being absent.

Minutes of the previous regular and adjourned meetings were read, and there being
no omissions or corrections were approved as read.

Reports of officers were read, approved and ordered placed on file.

All claims were allowed as per claim book in the office of the Clerk.

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It appearing to the Board that this is the time for considering the election
to be held for the purpose of electing a Mayor and ^{two} ~~four~~ ^{and a City Clerk} Commissioners of the City of Las
Vegas, Nevada, it was the order of the Board, on motion of Commissioner W. B. Mundy, and
seconded by Commissioner W. H. Elwell that the following Resolution be spread upon the min-
utes of the Board:

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 3 of the Charter of the City of
Las Vegas, Nevada, as amended by the Legislature of the State of Nevada in the year 1927,
a general election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday, every odd
numbered year dating from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May, 1913, and it ap-
pearing therefrom that a general election for the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, shall be held on
the first Tuesday after the first Monday in May, 1927, and the matter coming up regularly to
be heard and arrangements made therefor, and motion duly made and carried, the following
Resolution was adopted, to-wit:

Resolved that a general election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held
at the City Fire House situated on lot 23 in block 15 of Clark's Las Vegas Townsite, for
voting precinct No. 1; at the building known as the Public Library Building situated on
block 20 of Clark's Las Vegas Townsite, for voting precinct No. 2; At the garage of the
Clark Forwarding Company situated on the rear of lot 26, block 7 of Clark's Las Vegas
Townsite, for voting precinct No. 3; at the Letter Day Saints Church on sixth street
between Fremont and Bridger in Hawkins Addition to Las Vegas, for voting precinct No. 4;
and at the Administration Building of the City and County Fair Grounds for voting precinct

precinct No. 5, on the 3rd day of May, 1927, for the election of a Mayor and four Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas: that the polls be opened at 8 o'clock a.m. and close at 6 o'clock p.m., on said day; that Clara Wadsworth, Minnie Woodard, and Alice Day inspectors and Harriety Hemphill and Delphine Squires, clerks, be and they are hereby appointed as inspectors and clerks of election precinct No. 1; That Luetta Gill, Agnes Watters, Loullaa B. Hansell, inspectors, and Emma E. Schuyler and Minerva Honford, clerks, be and they are hereby appointed as inspectors and clerks of election precinct No. 2; That Lucille Earl, Anna L. Peiffer, and Sarah W. Root, inspectors, and Minnie Davison, Agnes Mott, clerks, be and they are hereby appointed as inspectors and clerks of election of precinct No. 3; that Emily R. Ball, Ruth Cahlan, Euby White, inspectors, and Julia P. Kundy, and Elizabeth Pembroke, clerks, be and they are hereby appointed as inspectors and clerks of election precinct No. 4; and that Anna Knickerbocker, Eva W. King, Zetta Weeks, inspectors, and Walter Reeder, Sr., and Florence Boyer, Clerks, be and they are hereby appointed as inspectors and clerks of election precinct No. 5.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no candidate for office at said election shall be entitled to have his name placed upon the official ballot unless such candidate, at least ten days before the date of such election, file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, a certificate of nomination, in writing, containing the name of the person nominated. Such certificate shall be signed and verified by the candidate seeking nomination and shall show that the nominee therein possesses the qualifications as required by the Charter of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all provisions of the law relating to general elections so far as the same shall be made applicable, and not inconsistent with the provisions of the City Charter of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, shall be observed in conducting such election.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor of the said City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue a proclamation giving notice of the holding of said election. Such proclamation to contain the substance of this resolution and such other matters necessary to fully and fairly appraise the qualified voters of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, the date, time and place of holding such election, the purpose thereof, the condition under which held, the names of the Inspectors, the method and manner of classifying the commissioners on ballot and such other matters as may be deemed proper in the premises.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such Proclamation be published in the Las Vegas Age, a newspaper printed and published in the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, State of Nevada, for a period of at least four consecutive weeks, (four issues) prior to the date of such election and printed copies of such proclamation be posted by the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, in fifteen public places in said City of Las Vegas, Nevada, for the same period of time, three of such Proclamations to be posted in each of said voting precincts.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to notify the duly elected and acting registry agent in and for the County of Clark, State of Nevada, to open Registration Books for the registration of the voters of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, for said election at the time and in the manner provided by the laws of the State of Nevada, governing the registration of voters in incorporated cities. Registration Books shall be open March 14th, 1927.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for the purposes of complying with the general law of the State of Nevada governing elections and for the purpose of giving the qualified voters of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, a full and fair opportunity of casting their ballots at such election the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be and it is hereby divided into five (5) voting election precincts described as follows to-wit:

Las Vegas Precinct No. 1, shall extend from the center line of Ogden

Thereupon the following Resolution was adopted by the Board upon motion of Commissioner Mundy, seconded by Commissioner Elwell:

BE IT RESOLVED that the said Budget be signed in behalf of this Board by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk and the same be filed with the City Clerk and a copy thereof published in a weekly newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas, for two publications, one week apart. The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, Elwell, and Smith and His Honor the Mayor, J. P. Hesse, Aye. Nose, none.

The board then proceeded to take up the matter of the levy of taxes for the City of Las Vegas for the year 1927. Upon motion of Commissioner Mundy, seconded by Commissioner Smith, and unanimously carried, the following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.019 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds if the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Police and Fire Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.159 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds on the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Salary Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.22 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Street and Alleys Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.145 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Light Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.06 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Cemetery Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.075 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Publicity Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.089 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Emergency Loan Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.04 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property, situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Sewer Bond Interest Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.15 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Sewer Bond Redemption Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.098 on each one hundred Dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Highway Bond Interest Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.075 on each hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1927, including the net proceeds of the mines for the year 1927, said tax to be known as and used as the Highway Bond Redemption Fund.

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, Smith, Elwell and His Honor the Mayor, J. P. Hesse, Aye. Noes, none.

No further business appearing it was ordered on motion duly made, seconded and carried, that this Board adjourn until the 11th day of March, 1927, at the hour of three o'clock p. m.
