Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

At this time the Clerk presented to the Board the written applications of the following persons for permission to set off fireworks in the City of Las Vegas: D. G. Lorenzi, R. S. Lehman, R. G. McCubrey and Charles B. Hemphill. Thereupon, on motion of Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner German, and unanimously carried, it was ordered that the Clerk issue permits to the above named applicants, granting them permission to set off fireworks in the City of Las Vegas, in the manner and during the hours set forth in said permits.

No further business appearing it was ordered upon motion duly made that this body adjourn.

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 7th day of July, 1927, at the hour of three o'clock P. M. Present: Hon. J. F. Hesse, Mayor; Commissioners W. B. Mundy, W. C. German, and Roy Neagle, together with the City Attorney and Clerk. Absent: Commissioner C. J. Smith.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

Minutes of the previous regular and adjourned meetings read and approved.

All claims allowed as shown in the Claim and Warrant Register in the office of the Clerk. Officers reports read, approved and <sup>ordered</sup> placed on file in the office of the clerk.

Thereupon, the Clerk presented and read to the Board a letter from C. D. Bretze, Esq., Municipal Judge, requesting said Board to raise his salary from the sum of \$50. per month to the sum of \$100 per month. After full discussion this matter was laid over for future consideration.

The Clerk then presented four petitions to the Board praying as follows:

TO THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LAS VEGAS:

The undersigned citizens and taxpayers of said City of Las Vegas hereby petition your honorable body to immediately take such steps and proceedings as may be necessary, by ordinance or otherwise, to secure as a public utility, an adequate water supply for the residents of the Original Townsite of Las Vegas. There is a critical shortage of water in that portion of the City, which calls for immediate and urgent action in the premises.

The above mentioned petitions were signed by a number of citizens and taxpayers of the City of Las Vegas. Action on this matter was deferred to Saturday, the 9th of July, 1927, at the hour of three o'clock P. M.

A proposed contract for the <sup>collecting,</sup> hauling and disposal of garbage from this City was ~~presented~~ read by the Clerk, said contract being presented by A. B. Mitchell and signed by him. After general discussion this matter was laid over for future consideration.

Thereupon, the Clerk presented an application for a gaming license signed by O. M. Cowden requesting a license for the operation of two gaming tables, his fee of \$150 being previously paid, and the application being approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner. It was ordered upon motion of Commissioner German, seconded by Commissioner Mundy and duly carried that a license be issued to said O. M. Cowden as requested.

Thereupon, the Clerk presented the application of A. T. McCarter for a license for the operation of two gaming tables, the fee of \$150 being paid and said application being approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner. Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried it was ordered that the license be issued.

Thereupon, the Clerk presented the application of Stocker Bros. for a license for the operation of two gaming tables, the fee of \$150 being paid and the application being approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner. Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried it was ordered that the license be issued.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried it was ordered that the moneys turned in by the Municipal Judge and City Clerk for the month of June, 1927, be apportioned as follows: the sum of \$871.40 to the Police and Fire Fund and the sum of \$606.10 to the General Fund.

Mr. A. E. Cahlan, manager and editor of the Las Vegas Review, appeared at this time and made a proposition to the Board wherein he would print 100 copies of all city ordinances heretofore published, on paper prepared for insertion into binders, and 50 binders for the purpose of binding said ordinances, for the sum of \$250. After general discussion this proposition was laid over for future consideration.

No further business appearing it was ordered upon motion duly made that this Board adjourn until Friday, the 8th of July, 1927, at the hour of three o'clock P. M.
