At a regular recessed meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 27th day of February, 1929, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock, P. M.

PRESENT: His Honor the Mayor, J. F. Hesse, Commissioners W. C. German, W. B. Mundy, F. C. Deviney, County Assessor, ~~together with~~ the City Attorney and Clerk.

ABSENT: Commissioners O. J. Smith and Roy Neagle.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

Upon motion of Commissioner Mundy, seconded by Commissioner German, the following resolution was duly adopted:-

RESOLVED that it be recommended to the legislature of the State of Nevada, and particularly to the representatives and Senator of the County of Clark, that the boundaries of the City of Las Vegas in the County of Clark, State of Nevada, be enlarged by legislative action, to-wit:

By an amendment of Section 1 of an act of the legislature of the State of Nevada, entitled: "An act to incorporate the town of Las Vegas, in Clark County, and defining the boundaries thereof, and to authorize the establishing of a city government therefor, and other matters relating thereto", so that the boundaries of the City of Las Vegas shall be coincident with the boundaries of the Las Vegas School District, and a draft of the proposed amendment be made by the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas and forwarded to the representatives and assemblymen of the County of Clark, together with a certified copy of this resolution.

The vote on said resolution was as follows: Commissioner Mundy, Commissioner German and His Honor the Mayor, J. F. Hesse, voting aye; noes, none.

Upon motion by Commissioner Mundy, seconded by Commissioner German, it was ordered that the Clerk of this board write to the Treasurer of the City of Las Vegas authorizing the transfer of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars from the General Fund to the 5th Street Special Widening Fund.

Thereafter, no further business appearing, this meeting was recessed until Monday, March 4th, 1929, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock, P. M.

At a recessed regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 4th day of March, 1929, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock, P. M.

PRESENT: His Honor the Mayor, J. F. Hesse, Commissioners O. J. Smith, W. B. Mundy, Roy Neagle and W. C. German; City Attorney and Clerk.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

The Board proceeded to take up the Budget and Tax Levy for the year 1929, and, after full discussion, it was ORDERED upon motion of Commissioner O. J. Smith and seconded by Commissioner W. B. Mundy, and duly carried that the following Budget be adopted, viz:

Thereupon, the following Resolution was adopted by the Board upon motion of Commissioner O.J. Smith, seconded by Commissioner W. B. Mundy:

BE IT RESOLVED that the said Budget be signed in behalf of this Board by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk and the same be filed with the City Clerk and a copy thereof published in a newspaper published in the City of Las Vegas, for two publications, one week apart. The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, Smith, German, Neagle and His Honor, the Mayor, Aye. Noes; None.

The Board then proceeded to take up the matter of the levy of taxes for the City of Las Vegas for the year 1929. Upon motion of Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Mundy, and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.15 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property

situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Salary Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.552 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Street and Alleys Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.19 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Water, Sewer and Light Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.03 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Cemetery Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.041 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Publicity Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.01 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Sewer Bond Interest Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.041 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Sewer Bond Redemption Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.054 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Highway Bond Interest Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.041 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Highway Bond Redemption Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.015 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines, except such property as is exempt from taxation, said tax to be known as and used as the Street Paving Interest Fund.

RESOLVED that an ad valorem tax of \$.041 on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property situate, lying and being within the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, be levied, collected and paid for the year 1929, including the net proceeds of the mines for the year 1929, said tax to be known as and used as the Street Paving Redemption Fund.

The vote on said resolution was as follows: Commissioners Kundy, Smith, German, Neagle, and His Honor the Mayor, J. F. Heese, Aye; Noes; none.

At this time a delegation from the West Side of the City of Las Vegas, appeared before the Board, protesting against the removal of what is known and commonly referred to as "Block 15" this city, to the West Side. This matter was discussed and taken under advisement.

The Clerk was ordered to write a letter to Mr. W. E. Ferron, a member of the City Planning Commission of the City of Las Vegas, now in Los Angeles, authorizing him to look over lighting

systems suitable for use in a small municipality while in Los Angeles, advising him that whatever expenses were incurred in this connection would be paid for by the City of Las Vegas.

The matter of street paving decision to be given at this time was held in abeyance, due to the absence of the City Engineer, Mr. A. P. Slocum.

An ordinance entitled:

An Ordinance to amend, revise and re-enact Section 7 of Ordinance No. 48 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled: "An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas, licensing, for the purpose of regulation and revenue every kind of lawful business hereinafter specified, transacted or carried on within the corporate limits of the City of Las Vegas, State of Nevada, fixing the rates of license tax upon the same and providing for the collection of said license tax, and a punishment for carrying on or conducting any such business without a license, and repealing Ordinances Nos. 1, 2, 4, 13, 14 and 35," approved December 3, 1913, and repealing all Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith. ✓

was read for the first time, and, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, was laid over for a second reading.

No further business appearing, the meeting was recessed until Thursday, March 5th, 1929, at the hour of 7:30 P. M.

At a recessed regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 5th day of March, 1929, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock, P. M.

PRESENT: His Honor, the Mayor, J. P. Hesse, Commissioners O. J. Smith, W. C. German, Roy Neagle and W. B. Mundy, together with the Engineer for the City, City Attorney and Clerk.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

At this time the Clerk read to the Board the following letter from A. P. Slocum, Engineer for the City of Las Vegas:

Las Vegas, Nev. March 5, 1929

To the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas,

Las Vegas, Nevada.

Gentlemen:

I hereby propose, in the event you accept the bid of Roche-Akman Company for the construction of curbs and pavement under the proceeding heretofore had, in consideration of the compensation fixed in my contract with you as City Engineer, or Engineer for the purpose of said improvements, and in consideration of the acceptance by you of such bid so that such improvement may proceed, and in consideration of the payment to me of the additional sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), to either act as Inspector of such improvement, or in case of my illness or inability for any reason, to provide at my own expense an Inspector, as contemplated by the specifications, general conditions and the contract as heretofore submitted and adopted by you; it being understood that this proposition does not prevent you from providing additional or substitute Inspector acceptable to us as provided in my contract with you as Engineer. ✓
