Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, it was ordered that plat of Metropolitan Addition to the City of Las Vegas, situate in SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 2, Township 21 South, Range 61 East, M. D. B. & M., owned by Alfred Kebde, and approved by the City Planning Commission, presented to the Board at this time, be approved; that the Mayor be directed to approve same and the Clerk to attest said plat.

At a recessed regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, held on the 15th day of April, 1929, at the hour of seven-thirty o'clock, P. M.

PRESENT: W. B. Mundy, Mayor Pro tem; Commissioners O. J. Smith, W. C. German, together with the City Attorney and Clerk.

ABSENT: His Honor, the Mayor, J. P. Hesse and Commissioner Roy Neagle.

Meeting called to order by W. B. Mundy, Mayor Pro tem.

Mayor Pro tem Mundy appointed Commissioner German to act as Police and Fire Commissioner for the purpose of approving application for gaming licenses.

The Clerk presented the application of A. T. McCarter, Exchange Club, for a license for the operation of three gaming tables. The fee of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) having been paid and such application having been approved by the Police and Fire Commission, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was ordered that the license be issued.

The Clerk presented the application of Stocker Bros, for a license for the operation of five gaming tables. The fee of Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) having been paid and such application having been approved by the Police and Fire Commission, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was ordered that the license be issued.

The Clerk presented the application of A. T. Gilmore & J. W. Horden, for a license for the operation of two gaming tables. The fee of One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) having been paid and such application having been approved by the Police and Fire Commission, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was ordered that the license be issued.

The Clerk presented the application of F. S. LeRoy, for a license for the operation of two gaming tables. The fee of One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) having been paid and such application having been approved by the Police and Fire Commission, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was ordered that the license be issued.

The Clerk then read a letter from Mrs. Julia P. Mundy, Chairman of the Board of Cemetery Trustees, which letter requested an increase in salary from \$100.00 to \$125.00 per month for the sexton employed at the City Cemetery. Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was ordered that such increased salary be allowed, and that beginning with the first day of April, 1929, the sexton of said cemetery be paid the salary of \$125.00 per month.

The Clerk then read a letter from Miss Claud Frazier, City Superintendent of Schools, requesting the City to deed to Las Vegas Union School District Board, fifteen (15) acres of the Fair Ground, which the city expects to possess in a short time, for High School purposes. After some consideration this matter was laid over for further consideration, upon motion duly carried.

Upon motion by Commissioner German, seconded by Commissioner Smith, the following resolution was duly adopted:-

WHEREAS there has been filed with the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas a certified copy of conviction of Bert McDonald for illegal sale of liquor at 311 Stewart Street, in said City of Las Vegas, BE IT RESOLVED that the license issued to the said McDonald for sale of soft drinks at 311 Stewart Street, be, and the same hereby is, revoked; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for a period of one year hereafter no license shall be issued to the said McDonald, or for his benefit, directly or indirectly, to do business of any nature in the City of Las Vegas, the vote being as follows: Commissioners Smith and German and W. B. Mundy, Mayor Pro tem, voting aye; noes; none.

WHEREAS there has been filed with the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas a certified copy of conviction of Edward White for illegal sale of liquor at 17 Fremont Street, in said City of Las Vegas, BE IT RESOLVED that the license issued to the said White for sale of soft drinks at 17 Fremont Street, be, and the same hereby is, revoked; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for a period of one year hereafter no license shall be

issued to the said White, or for his benefit, directly or indirectly, to do business of any nature in the City of Las Vegas, the vote being as follows: Commissioners Smith and German and W. B. Mundy, Mayor Pro tem voting aye; Noes; none.

Thereupon, Wm. L. Scott, City Clerk, presented his bond in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) covering his duties as City Clerk in the City of Las Vegas, said bond having F. C. DeVinney and A. W. Han as sureties thereon, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, said Bond was approved.

An ordinance entitled:-

"An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas defining "barber shops" and "barbers", prescribing the hours of opening and closing of barber shops, and providing a penalty, and repealing all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith."

was read for the first time, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, was laid over for a second reading.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, it was ordered that plat of Artesia Heights, City of Las Vegas, Nevada, situate in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ S $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 6, Township 21 South, Range 61 East, M. D. B. & M., being owned by Earl W. Higgins and Winnie Higgins, was presented to the Board for approval at this time. It appearing to the Board that said plat is in proper form, it was by the Board ordered, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, that the Mayor approve said plat and the Clerk attest the same.

An ordinance entitled:-

"An Ordinance authorizing R. F. CRITTENDEN, and his assigns, to instal, lay down and maintain gas mains, distributing pipes and supply pipes, and all necessary and proper appliances used in connection therewith or appurtenant thereto, in, through, over, across, under and along all or any of the streets, alleys or public grounds of the City of Las Vegas in carrying on the business of furnishing gas to the inhabitants of said City for heating, lighting, power and other used and purposes, and establishing regulations and conditions in connection therewith."
