Hansell nominated Commissioner W. C. German for said office. Commissioner German declined the nomination, stating his reasons therefor, and placed the name of Commissioner L. B. Hansell in nomination for said office. His Honor, the Mayor, thereupon ordered a secret ballot taken to determine the election of the Mayor Pro tem, the result being that Commissioner O. J. Smith received two votes and Commissioner L. B. Hansell one vote. His Honor, the Mayor, thereupon declared Commissioner O. J. Smith being duly elected to the office of Mayor Pro tem.

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada held on the 6th of June 1929 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Present: His Honor, the Mayor J. F. Hesse: Commissioners O. J. Smith, W. C. German, R. W. Thomas also City Attorney, Clerk, and Engineer for the City.

Absent: Commissioner L. C. Hansell.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

Minutes of previous meeting read, and approved as read. All Claims allowed as shown by Claims and Warrant Register on file in the office of the Clerk.

0.5 Owing to the absence of Commissioner Hansell Commissioner German ^{was appointed by the Mayor} to O. K. all Police, ^{Water} and Fire fund bills.

On motion duly made, and seconded, and carried that all monies collected by the City Clerk the Municipal Judge, Plumbing Inspector for fees, and fines, and licenses be apportioned as follows:

\$2,000.00	to the Police, and Fire Fund
87.50	" " Water Sewer & Light Fund
1,285.00	" " General Fund.
<u>\$3,372.50</u>	Total Collected.

On motion duly made, seconded, and carried that the City take up the note at the Southern Nevada Bank for \$2,600.00 emergency loan, also pay last interest due on same amounting to 75.00.

On Motion of Commissioner Smith seconded by Commissioner Thomas the following Preliminaries, and Resolution were adopted;

Whereas the Board has under consideration the authorization of the construction, and erection and installing of an ornamental street lighting system complete in the following proposed district in said City. to wit;

In Clark's Las Vegas Townsite

The easterly side of Main St; from the northerly side of Bridger Street to the southerly side of Stewart St;

Fremont St; from the easterly side of Main St; to the westerly side of Fifth St;

The westerly side of Fifth St; from the northerly side of Bridger St; to the southerly side of Stewart St;

In Hawkins Addition.

The easterly side of Fifth Street from the northerly side of Bridger Street to the southerly side of Stewart St;

Whereas, it is proposed to defray the cost of such improvement by special assessment, and it is necessary that the City have an Engineer for the purpose of preparing estimates of the expense, and plat and diagram of the work, and the locality to be improved, a special assessment map, a drafting of the specifications, and plans, and general supervision of the work, during the installation, and

Whereas, Ralph Waggoner of Los Angeles, California, an experienced street lighting engineer has offered to perform the services aforesaid for, and in the consideration of the sum of One Dollar,

Now therefore be it Resolved, that the position of the said Ralph Waggoner be, and the same is hereby accepted, and said Ralph Waggoner be, and he is hereby appointed Engineer for the City of Las Vegas for the purposes aforesaid, and that a warrant be drawn by the proper officers of the City in Favor of the said Ralph Waggoner for the payment of the compensation aforesaid, and that said Ralph Waggoner be, and he is hereby directed to prepare, and submit to this Board as soon as possible an estimate of the expense of said proposed improvement, and also plat, and diagram of the work, and of the locality to be improved of said proposed improvement, and proceed with such other work from time to time as may be required of him under this appointment.

Plan No. 2 Showing the design, actual measurements in detail of pipes, dimensions, reinforcement construction, foundation to the ornamental posts, which are oscillatory centrifugally cast.

Notice of Proposed Street Lighting Improvement in the City of Las Vegas.

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, hereby gives notice to all parties concerned, and interested, and especially to those parties owning property situated in the district to be assessed, as hereinafter described, that the said Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas intends to construct, erect, and install an ornamental street lighting system complete, including conduits, cables, standards, lighting units, and all appurtenances thereto upon these certain streets, and portions of streets hereinafter designated in accordance with plans, diagrams, and estimates of cost, prepared under the direction of said Board of City Commissioners and on file in the office of the City Clerk for public examination.

The streets, and portions of streets on which said improvement is to be made and the location of the work to be done, follows:

An Ordinance declaring the determination of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas to make certain improvements in the City of Las Vegas by construction, erecting, and installing an ornamental street lighting system on certain streets, and portions of streets in said City; describing definitely the location of said improvements; providing that the cost and expense thereof shall be paid entirely by special assessment upon all lots included in the special assessment district, hereby established according to the benefits, except where by the Charter of the City of Las Vegas benefits certain portions thereof are required to be paid from the general fund of said City of Las Vegas, and other matters relating thereto.

There upon a proposed ordinance entitled;

An Ordinance regulating the collection, and fixing and establishing the rates, and compensation to be collected by any person, company, or corporation collecting garbage in the City of Las Vegas.

was read for the first time, and upon motion duly made seconded, and carried was laid over for second reading.

Upon motion of Commissioner Smith seconded by Commissioner Thomas the following Preamble, and Resolutions were duly adopted;

Whereas, the former City Clerk, Wm. L. Scott, during 1929 lost one of the license books containing the stubs of fifth licenses issued to various parties, and such book containing such stubs was, and is the only record book as to the names of such licenses, and the respective amounts of license paid, except as contained in the affidavit of said W. L. Scott setting forth the amounts, and names of licenses of 48 of such persons, leaving the name, and amounts of two licenses issued undetermined, and

Whereas said Wm. L. Scott has applied to this board to arbitrarily fix for the time being the amount of such undetermined two licenses and is willing to pay the amount so fixed and the additional amount, if any, in the event hereafter the amounts of said two licenses or either of them is determined,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the amount of such licenses be fixed temporarily at \$5.00 each, and that such amount be accepted by this Board from said Wm. L. Scott, with the understanding that when the true amounts thereof be ascertained the said Wm. L. Scott settle with this Board on the basis of the true amounts thereof.

At a recessed regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Nevada, held on the 11th day of June 1929 at the hour of 3 o'clock P.M.

PRESENT: His Honor, the Mayor F. F. Hesse, Commissioners Smith, Thomas, Hansell, German also Engineer for the City, City Attorney, and Clerk.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor.

Minutes of meeting of June 6th read, and corrected.

A Draft of an Ordinance entitled: An Ordinance Creating the Office of City Electrical Inspector, and Prescribe His duties, Creating, and Establishing The Bureau, Of Electrical Inspection And Defining The Duties And Powers of of Said Bureau, Providing For The Issuance Of Permits For Installing Electrical Construction And Fixing The Fees Therefor; Regulating The Installation of Electrical Construction, Maintenance And Repairs Of Electrical Wiring, Apparatus, or Equipment For Light, Heat or Power, Within, Upon Or Attached, To Buildings, Structures, Lots Or Premises With in The City Of Las Vegas And Providing A Penalty For Violation Of This Ordinance; was Read for a second time. Upon Motion by Commissioner Thomas, Seconded by Commissioner German said ordinance was duly passed, and adopted, and ordered published for one week (6 issues) in the Las Vegas Review a daily newspaper published in the City Of Las Vegas. Said Ordinance to be designated as Ordinance #137.

Vote as follows Commissioners Thomas, Hansell, German Smith, and His Honor The Mayor voting Aye, Noes None.

Commissioner Thomas introduced the following Resolution

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas Clark Co; Nevada, that there is great necessity for an enlargement of the present sewer system in said city, due to the added subdivisions in the community which have no adequate sewerage disposal; and

WHEREAS, the sanitary and health conditions of said City must be preserved at all times; and

WHEREAS, without an adequate sewer system an epidemic may arise at any time,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Light and sewer Commissioner of said City be and he is hereby authorized to ascertain as soon as possible, the estimate cost of a survey of said City of Las Vegas for sewerage disposal, and present the same to this Board for consideration.

Vote on resolution was as follows; Commissioners German, Hansell, Smith, and Thomas voting Aye, His Honor the Mayor Aye, Noes None.

Mr. Al Cahken of the Las Vegas Review & Representative was present and
