At this time the Board took up the matter of providing for a special City Election at
which should be submitted the question as to whether Mayor J. F. Hesse should be recalled
from such office, the City Clerk having issued a call for such election to be held on the
Wednesday the 23rd day of April 1930.

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There upon motion of Commissioner O.J. Smith, seconded by Commissioner R. W. Thomas the following preamble and Resolution was duly adopted:

Whereas, pursuant to the order, judgment and Writ of Mandate of the District Court of the Tenth Judicial District of the State of Nevada, in and for the County of Clark, State of Nevada the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas, in the County of Clark, State of Nevada did on the 3rd day of April, 1930, issue a call for a special City Election to be held in said City on the 23rd day of April, 1930, at which election should be submitted the question as to whether Mayor J. F. Hesse should be recalled from such office, and it appearing to this Board that provision should at once be made by it for said election,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a special City Election be, and the same is hereby ordered to be held in said City of Las Vegas on the 23rd day of April 1930 for the purpose aforesaid, and at the places and in the manner hereinafter set forth.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the purpose of complying with the provisions of an Act of the State of Nevada, entitled "An Act to provide for the Recall of public officers in the State of Nevada," approved March 26, 1913, and Section 4 of an Act of the State of Nevada entitled "An Act to amend an Act Entitled 'An act to incorporate the town of Las Vegas, in Clark County, and defining the boundaries thereof, and to authorize the establishing of a City government therefore, and other matters relating thereto,' approved March 16, 1911, by amending section 2 of Chapter 1 and sections 2,3,4,5,6, 10 and 14 of Chapter 2 thereof, and by adding a new section to be known as section 5, to chapter 2 thereof, approved March 11, 1929, and in compliance with other laws relating to the subject of special elections in said City of Las Vegas, said City of Las Vegas be, and it is hereby divided into five election precincts as follows: to-wit:

Precinct No.1, which shall extend from the center line of Ogden Street south to the center line of Carson Street, and west from the center line of Fifth Street to the west City limits; Precinct No.2, which shall extend south from the center line of Carson Street to the center line of Clark Street, and west from the center line of Fifth Street to the west City limits; Precinct No. 3 which shall extend south from the center line of Clark Street to the south city limits, and west from the center line of Fifth Street to the west city limits; Precinct No. 4, which shall extend east from the center line of Fifth Street to the east city limits; Precinct No.5, which shall extend North from the center line of Ogden Street to the North City limits.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the polling places in said election precincts shall be and they are established as follows: to-wit;

For Precinct No.1, at the City Fire House, situate on lot 23 in Block 15 Clark's Las Vegas Townsite.

For Precinct No.2, at the building known as the Public library building situate in Block 20 of Clark's Las Vegas Townsite.

For Precinct No.3, at the garage of Clark Forwarding Co; situate on the rear of lot No. 26 in Block 7, of said Townsite.

For Precinct No.4, at and in the rear room of the Latter Day Saints Church on the N.W. corner of Sixth and Carson Streets in Hawkins Addition to Las Vegas.

For Precinct No.5, at and in the store room opening on Stewart Street in the Gateway Hotel Building at the corner of Main & Stewart Streets in Clark's Las Vegas Townsite.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that inspectors and clerks of election for each of said election precincts shall be as follows, to-wit:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that on the ballot at said election there shall be printed verbatim, as set forth in the recall petition, the reason for demanding the recall of said officer, and in not more than two hundred words, the officer's justification of his course in office, if furnished by him.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if there be no other candidate nominated to be voted for at said election, there shall be printed on the ballot the name of the officer sought to be recalled, the office which he now holds and the words "For Recall" and "Against Recall"; if there be other candidates nominated for the office of Mayor, there shall be printed upon the ballot the name of the officer sought to be recalled, and the office which he now holds, and the name or names of such other candidates as may be nominated to be voted for at said special election, and the words "For Recall" and "Against Recall" shall be omitted: in other respects the ballot shall conform with the requirements of the general election laws of the State of Nevada.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that other candidates for the office of Mayor may be nominated to be voted for at said special election by petition, which said petition shall be signed by the qualified electors of said City of Las Vegas, equal in number to twenty-five per cent of the number of votes cast for the justice of the supreme court in the City of Las Vegas at the last preceding general election. Said nominating petition shall be filed with the City Clerk of the City of Las Vegas at least fifteen days prior to date of said election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all persons who reside within the exterior boundaries of the City of Las Vegas at the time of holding said special recall election; and are qualified to vote at said election and whose names appear upon the official register of voters in and for said City shall have the right to vote at said special recall election for all officers to be voted for and said question to be submitted to the people at said election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk of said City of Las Vegas be and she is hereby authorized and directed to notify the County Clerk of the County of Clark to perform all duties required by him under Sec. 4 of said above mentioned Act, approved March 11, 1929.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk of said City of Las Vegas be and she hereby is, authorized and directed to have official ballots prepared, including all supplies required for absent voting, and to do and perform all such further acts, and give such notices as may be necessary or required by the charter of the City or by the general election laws of the State of Nevada, in order that said election may be called and held as required by law, and in order that the qualified voters of said City may have due notice of said election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk of said City of Las Vegas be and she hereby is authorized and directed to notify the persons above appointed as Inspectors and Clerks of their said appointments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Clerk of said City of Las Vegas be and she is hereby, authorized and directed to cause to be printed a list of the registered voters.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all provisions of the general election laws of the State of Nevada, so far as the same may be applicable and not inconsistent with the said City Charter and laws relating to recall and special elections, shall be observed in conducting said special recall election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor or Mayor Pro Tem of said City of Las Vegas be and he is hereby authorized and directed to forthwith issue a proclamation giving notice of the holding of said election, and such other matters as may be necessary to fully and fairly apprise the qualified voters of said City of Las Vegas of the date, time, places of holding and purposes of said election, and such other matters as may be deemed proper in the premises.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that one copy of such proclamation be posted forthwith by or under the direction of the City Clerk of said City in each election precinct.

An ordinance authorizing the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada to borrow Forty-nine Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-five and 12/100 Dollars (\$49,595.12) to cover certain unpaid assessments heretofore levied and confirmed by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas for the purpose of paying for the work of making improvements in the City of Las Vegas, by grading for and construction of Asphaltic Concrete Pavements Durite Process on certain streets and portions streets in said City, to-wit: On Main Street, First Street, Second Street, Third Street, Fourth Street, Lewis Street, Clark Street, Bonneville Street and Garces Street, to issue and sell the bonds of the City of Las Vegas therefor, said bonds to be known as "Las Vegas Special 1930 Pavement Improvement Bonds Series C," and providing for the collection of said unpaid assessments by dividing the same into ten (10) annual installments on the Tax Roll of Clark County and collecting same in the same manner as State and County taxes are collected by law, was read for the first time.

An ordinance authorizing the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, Clark County, Nevada, to borrow Thirty-four Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-eight and 92/100 Dollars (\$34,898.92) to cover certain unpaid assessments heretofore levied and confirmed by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas for the purpose of paying for the work of making improvements in the City of Las Vegas, by grading for and constructing Hydraulic Cement Concrete Curbs and Gutters and Rough Grading for street improvement on certain streets and portions of streets in said City, to-wit: On Main Street, First Street, Second Street, Third Street, Fourth Street, Lewis Street, Clark Street, Bonneville Street, and Garces Street, to issue and sell the bonds of the City of Las Vegas therefor, said bonds to be known as "Las Vegas Special 1930 Curb

and Gutter Bonds, Series D," and providing for the collection of said unpaid assessments by dividing the same into ten (10) annual installments and placing said installments on the Tax Roll of Clark County and collecting same in the same manner as State and County Taxes are collected by law," was read to the Board for a first time.

Upon motion of Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner German it was moved that the said two ordinances read for a first time this date be laid over for a second reading at the next regular meeting. Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners German, Smith Thomas, and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor J. V. Hesse voting Aye. Noes none.

There being no further business to come before the Board at this time the meeting recessed until Friday the 4th day of April at the hour of three o'clock P. M.

At a recessed regular meeting of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas held on the 4th day of April 1930 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Present Mayor Hesse, Commissioners Thomas, German, and Smith together with the City Attorney and Clerk.

Absent Commissioner Hansell.

A petition from residence of Westside was presented to the Board asking that a voting precinct be placed on the Westside. Clerk was directed to write to the signers of said petition that the County Board of Commissioners designate the polling places, and this election is being held before the County Board meets, therefore the election precincts are as used in the last general election.

All communication read, and Clerk directed to answer same, and place on file.

At this time the question of the issuance of an additional One Thousand Dollars worth of Las Vegas City Highway Bonds to meet the cost of the repair Fifth Street, and Main Street as follows: Main Street from the corner of Main and Fremont Streets to the northeast city limits and of Fifth Street from the corner of Fremont and Fifth Streets to the southwest city limits, a distance of approximately three miles, which highway was heretofore construction in connection with Federal Aid to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway System of the State of Nevada, came on for discussion, and it appearing to the Board of City Commissioners that by an Act of the Legislature of the State of Nevada, for the year 1923, the City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas have authority to issue bonds in the amount not to exceed

Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for the construction, maintenance and repair of a highway through the City of Las Vegas to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway System under an Act of the legislature of the state of Nevada in convention assembled, entitled "An Act Authorizing the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, to issue bonds to provide for the construction of a highway through said City of Las Vegas, to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway System of the State of Nevada, and providing for the ratification thereof by special or general election before the issuance of any such bonds," approved March 5, 1923, and

It further appearing to the Board of City Commissioners that Forty-nine Thousand and Dollars (\$49,000.00) worth of said authorized issue of bonds have been sold for the purposes above mentioned, and it also appearing that the further sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) is required for said additional work of and in connection with the maintenance and repair of Main Street, commencing at the corner of Main and Fremont Streets, thence to the northeast city limits, and of Fifth Street, commencing at the corner of Fifth and Fremont Streets, thence to the southwest city limits, a distance of approximately three miles; and it further appearing to the Board of City Commissioners that the amount of money now remaining in the State Highway Fund of the City of Las Vegas is insufficient to meet the cost of the maintenance and repair aforesaid,

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Commissioner Smith seconded by Commissioner Thomas and the question being put to a vote, the following Preambles, and Resolution were regularly and duly adopted by the unanimous vote of the Board:

Whereas, pursuant to and in strict compliance with the provisions and authority of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Nevada, including the provisions of Chapter 74 of the laws of the State of Nevada, 1923, being an act of the Senate and Assembly of the State of Nevada, entitled "An Act authorizing the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, County of Clark, to issue bonds to provide for the construction of a highway through said City of Las Vegas to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway System of the State of Nevada, providing for the ratification thereof by special or general election before the issuance of any such bonds," approved March 5, 1923, the City of Las Vegas was authorized to issue its bonds in a sum not exceeding \$50,000 for the purpose of constructing a highway through the City of Las Vegas to connect with Route 6 of the State Highway System of the State of Nevada; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to each of the requirements of said Act, and particularly with the requirements of Secs. 2, 3, 4, and 5 of said Chapter 74 of the laws of 1923 of the State of Nevada, the question of the issuance of highway bonds of the City of Las Vegas, to the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) was submitted to the qualified electors of the City of Las Vegas, in the County of Clark, State of Nevada, at a general election held in said City of Las Vegas on the 8th day of May, 1923 of which election notice having first been duly given strictly as provided by law, and at which election more than a majority of the votes cast were in favor of the issuance of said bonds, and the result of the vote upon said question of the issuance of said bonds having been duly certified to this Board by the election boards conducting said election, and the result of the vote on said question of the issuance of said bonds having been by this board at a meeting duly and regularly held on the 16th day of May, 1923, declared in the manner and form and at the same time as other returns of said general City election were canvassed and proclaimed: and
