"An Ordinance regulating the doing of plumbing work and providing for the examination of persons engaged in the same, and creating an examining board, providing a penalty for the violation thereof, and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith, was read to the Board for a second time, and the Clerk was directed to have same published for a period of one week in the Las Vegas Age, a tri-weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Las Vegas. Said Ordinance was passed by the following vote: Commissioners Hansell, German, and Thomas, and His Honor the Mayor J. F. Hesse, voting Aye. Nones none.

A letter from the Organized Labor Unions asking the Board of Commissioners to adopt an ordinance setting \$5.00 per day as the minimum wage scale on all Public Works.

City Attorney Stevens was instructed to write up such an ordinance, if possible, and to write to San Bernardino for a copy of their ordinance covering same.

A petition signed by about six hundred residents of the City asking that the present garbage ordinance be changed so that other persons than those holding the contract with the City might haul dry garbage. This matter was laid over for further consideration.
