A letter from the Organized Labor Unions asking the Board of Commissioners to adopt an ordinance setting \$5.00 per day as the minimum wage scale on all Public Works. City Attorney Stevens was instructed to write up such an ordinance, if possible, and to write to San Bernardino for a copy of their ordinance covering same.

A petition signed by about six hundred residents of the City asking that the present garbage ordinance be changed so that other persons than those holding the contract with the City might haul dry garbage. This matter was laid over for further consideration.
