At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas, held on the 2nd day of October 1930 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Present Mayor Hesse, Commissioners Thomas, and Smith together with the City Attorney and Clerk.

Absent Commissioners German, and Hansell.

Commissioner Smith was appointed by the Mayor to approve the bills of the finance officer owing to the absence of Commissioner German Finance Commissioner.

All bills allowed as per Claims and "arrant register on file in the office of the Clerk.

Monies received for the month of September as follows:

\$160.00 Municipal Court Fines.
1670.00 Licenses, fees, and sale of cemetery lots.
1830.00 Total.

Monies proportioned as follows:

Mr. Ward, Mr. Flowers, Mr. Down, and Captain Griffin of the Salvation Army appeared before the Board at this time in regards to the carrying for of the needy in the City at the present time, and ask that the Board of Commissioners donate a substantial sum towards the cause.

City Attorney Stevens informed them that at the present time the City could not donate towards the fund as the only fund that the City could donate from was the Publicity Fund and at the present time that fund depleted, and would not be reimbursed until the City had received its share from the taxes in December.

An Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance for licensing and regulating the carrying on of certain businesses, professions, trades, callings, and occupations; fixing a penalty for the violation thereof; repealing ordinances of the City of Las Vegas, as follows: Ordinance No. 48, approved December 3, 1913, Ordinance No. 62 adopted December 1, 1915, Ordinance No. 74, adopted March 5, 1919, Ordinance No. 75, adopted May 7, 1919, Ordinance No. 61, Adopted June 15, 1921, Ordinance No. 95, adopted September 6, 1922, Ordinance No. 102, approved November 26, 1923, and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith," was read to the Board for a first time, and laid over for a final reading.

No further business appearing before the Board at this time the meeting recessed until Tuesday October 7th at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Present Mayor Hesse, Commissioners Thomas, and Hansell, together with the City Attorney and Clerk.

Absent Commissioners Smith, and German.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hansell, seconded by Commissioner Thomas it was moved that the bond of A.R. Thompson, City Engineer, be approved by the Mayor. City Attorney Stevens ruling that the bond was correct as to form. Said bond is from the Aetna Casualty and Surety Company.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Hansell, and Thomas, and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

Said bond being filed with the Clerk after its approval by the Mayor.

Mayor Hesse, appoint Commissioner Hansell to approve some of the Sept. bills as Finance Commissioner owing to the absence of Commissioner German, Finance Commissioner.

The Board of City Commissioners then met in a joint session with the Board of County Commissioners and discussed ways and means of caring for the needy within the City. No definite action was taken.

At a recessed regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas held on the 15th day of October, 1930 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Present Mayor Hesse, Commissioners Smith, Thomas, and Hansell together with the City Attorney and Clerk.

Absent Commissioner German.

Minutes of previous meetings read and approved as read.

A petition was filed with the Board of Commissioners signed by a number of citizens asking that Henry Blackall be placed on the Police Department and patrol the northern portion of the City. Said petition was referred to R. W. Thomas Police and Fire Commissioner for his consideration.

A Letter from the Deer Creek Corporation was read to the Board asking that the City help construct six miles of road into Deer Creek, and that the Deer Creek Corporation would deed to the City and County of Clark 20 acres of land to be used as a public park.

City Attorney Stevens informed the Board that the City could not acquire lands out side of the city limits except for water right. Clerk was directed to write to said corporation and thank them for their offer, and explain to them the reason for not accepting their offer.

Upon motion of Commissioner Smith seconded by Commissioner Hansell it was moved that the following gaming application be granted, said applications being accompanied by money covering the amount of tables applied for:

Mayme V. Stocker, four tables, application accompanied by \$350.00
Leo Kind, two tables, application being accompanied by \$150.00
A. T. Mc Carter, three tables, application being accompanied by \$250.00
H.P. Harris and Lyle Smith, two tables, \$150.00 accompanying application.
Geo. Smith, and Jack Butler, two tables, application being accompanied by \$150.00
The foregoing applications being approved by R. W. Thomas, Police & Fire Commissioner.
Vote on said motion being as follows: Commissioners Smith, Thomas, and Hansell, and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

The applications of Boulder Club, Las Vegas Club, and Chas. Taylor Company being held over until the application are properly filled out.

The application of Cleto Aguirre was laid over for further investigation.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hansell, seconded by Commissioner Smith it was moved that the gaming applications of Don Yee, and J. P. Petti not be granted as same were not approved by the Police and Fire Commissioner Thomas.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Smith, Thomas, and Hansell, and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

The Board next considered a letter from the Board of Examination of the Civil Engineers and Surveyors offering their services gratis in drafting an ordinance for the joining of the City of Las Vegas is the Board of Commissioner should consider such an ordinance at this time.
