

At this time Attorney Dan V. Noland appeared before the Board of Commissioners on behalf of the licensed electricians in the City of Las Vegas, and presented to the Board for its consideration a form of ordinance prepared by him at the direction and expense of the above mentioned electricians.

At this time "An Ordinance to amend sections 3 and 9 and to repeal section 8 of Ordinance No. 161 entitled "An Ordinance regulating the business of doing electrical installation, fixture and connection work and providing for the examination of persons engaged in the same, creating a Board of Examination, regulating the sale of electrical fixtures and appliances, providing for the licensing of electrical workers, providing additional regulations for electrical installation, fixing a penalty for the violation thereof and repealing Ordinance No. 156 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance regulating the business of doing electrical fixture and connection work providing for the examination of persons engaged in the same, and creating an examination Board, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof," and repealing Ordinance No. 128 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled "An Ordinance providing for the licensing of electrical workers in the City of Las Vegas, and fixing a penalty for the violation thereof," and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance." was read for a first time, and after some discussion was laid over for a second reading.

Upon motion of Commissioners Hansell seconded by Commissioner Thomas the following Resolution was introduced and passed:

Resolved, that it be the sense of this Board of Commissioners that F. W. Hickey be granted a certificate of competency as Master Electrician, as said F. W. Hickey was in business as a Master Electrician when Ordinance No. 152 of the City of Las Vegas was adopted.

Vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners Hansell, Thomas, and Smith, and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none. Commissioners German leaving before said vote was taken.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hansell, seconded by Commissioner Thomas the following Resolution was introduced and passed:

Resolved, that it be the sense of this Board of Commissioners that A. C. Clark, be granted a certificate of competency as Master Electrician, as said A. C. Clark was in business as a Master Electrician when Ordinance No. 152 of the City of Las Vegas was adopted.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Hansell, Thomas, and Smith, and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

The plat of Sunrise Park Tract No. 1 was presented to the Board for its approval. Said plat had been approved by the City Planning Commission, and owned by L.L. Brentner, and his wife, Mabel Brentner.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner Smith it was moved that the plat of Sunrise Park Tract No. 1 be approved by the Mayor, J.F. Hesse, and attest by the City Clerk, under the seal of the City.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Hansell, Smith and His Honor the Mayor, J.F. Hesse, voting Aye. Noes none.

Commissioner Thomas leaving before the vote was taken.

The City Attorney, F. A. Stevens was directed to draft an amendment to the City Zoning Ordinance No. 168 of the City of Las Vegas, placing amusement houses, gaming houses, and theaters in the mercantile district.

Mr. F. C. DeVinney appeared before the Board at this time in regard to the salary allowed the Assessor of Clark County at the last session of the Nevada State Legislature.

Therefore upon motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner Thomas it was moved that the Assessor of Clark County Nevada, Ex-Officio Assessor of the City of Las Vegas, and the County Treasurer of Clark County, and the Ex-Officio Treasurer of the City of Las Vegas be allowed salaries at the rate of \$130.00 per month, effective as of this date, as all wed under the statutes of the State of Nevada 1931.

At this time the Board took up the matter of accepting the amount of licenses collected by the Sheriff of Clark County for the gaming houses.

Upon motion of Commissioner Hansell, seconded By Commissioner Thomas the following Preambles and Resolution was upon vote thereon duly adopted:

WHEREAS, it has been reported to the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas that Joe Keate, the Sheriff of Clark County, State of Nevada has heretofore deposited with the County Treasurer of the County of Clark and ex-officio City Treasurer of the City of Las Vegas, for the credit of said City of Las Vegas, the sum of Five Thousand One Hundred Four and 20/100 Dollars (\$5,104.20) on account of collections made on gaming licenses issued for operation of games within the City of Las Vegas for the quarter commencing on the first day of April, 1931 and ending on the 30th day of June 1931 under and act of the State of Nevada, entitled "An Act concerning slot machines, gambling games, and gambling devices; providing for the operation thereof under license; providing for certain license fees and the use of the money obtained therefrom; prohibiting minors from playing and loitering about such games; designating the penalties for violation of the provisions thereof; and other matters properly relating thereto," and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas that said Sheriff has not paid into the Treasury of said City the proportion of said license fees belongs to said City, by the deposit aforesaid, but has retained from the said City's portion of said license fees an amount equal to six per cent. of the whole amount due said City as its portion of said license fees, and

WHEREAS, this Board is advised that said Sheriff has no warrant or authority in law to with hold and retain said six percent. or any percent. of the said City's portion, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that demand be forthwith made upon said Joe Keate, Sheriff of Clark County for the balance due said City as its portion of the said gaming license fees collected by him upon license issued for the operation of games within said City of Las Vegas for said quarter beginning April 1, 1931 and ending June 30, 1931; that such demand be made by the City Clerk of said City by the delivery to said Joe Keate, Sheriff, of a certified copy of this Resolution, and a written demand signed by said Clerk on behalf of said City in the following form:

Las Vegas, Nevada, May 19, 1931.

To Joe Keate, Sheriff of Clark County, Nevada.

You are hereby directed and commanded to forthwith pay over to the City of Las Vegas, in the County of Clark, State of Nevada all of the proportion of gaming license fees belonging to said City for licenses issued by you for the quarter beginning April 1, 1931 and ending June 30, 1931, according to the terms of the attached copy of Resolution adopted by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas on the 19th day of May, 1931.

WHEREAS, this Board of Commissioners of the City of Las Vegas have by Resolution at this meeting provided for demand to be made on Joe Keate, Sheriff of Clark County, Nevada for the balance due the City as its portion of license moneys collected on licenses issued for gaming in the City of Las Vegas during the quarter beginning April 1, 1931 and ending June 30, 1931 by said Sheriff of Clark County, Nevada, and

WHEREAS, said Sheriff has heretofore deposited with the County Treasurer of the County of Clark and ex-officio City Treasurer of the City of Las Vegas, for the credit of said City the sum of Five Thousand One Hundred Four Dollars and 20/100 (\$5,104.20) on account of the City's portion of such license fees, but has retained six per centum of said City's portion of such license fees, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City shall take and use said sum of (\$5,104.20), which belongs to it, but in so doing and using same it shall not be deemed to have waived its right to the balance being held by said Sheriff of Clark County, Nevada, and that a certified copy of this Resolution be served on said Sheriff at the same time as service is made of the previous Resolution adopted at this meeting demanding said City's full proportion of such license fees.
