

The Clerk was then directed to return the certified or cashier checks as the casemight be to the firms having bids over the two named as low bidders.

The meeting then recessed until the hour of 3:30 o'clock P.M.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor, E.W. Cragin at the hour of three o'clock P.M. with the Mayor, Commissioners Thomas, Hansell, Mundy and German, and City attorney and Clerk present, also City Engineer Thompson, and Consulting Engineer W.L. Benham.

After some discussion on the matter of the kind of pipe, clarifier, and other units to be used in the installation of the sewer system and plant the following resolution was introduced and passed;

Upon motion of Commissioner E.B. Hansell seconded by Commissioner W.B. Mundy the following Resolution was duly adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the bid of the Fuller Construction Company, of Dallas, Texas, for the construction of sanitary sewer system and disposal plant in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore adopted, be and the same is hereby accepted subject to the following conditions:

1. That the contract price of same shall be the sum of One Hundred six Thousand, five hundred ten and 54/100 Dollars (\$106,510.54) as shown by the tabulation of unit bids,
2. That the basis of the award shall be use of Dorr Clarifier, digestion and mechanical equipment; vitrified clay pipe, with asphalt joints; Wallace-Tiernan Chlorinator.
3. That the said bid is accepted upon the further condition that the same shall be in effect until the sale of the bonds now being advertised.
4. That before final contract shall be entered into the said bidder shall present satisfactory evidence to this Board that the said bidder is qualified to do business in the State of Nevada as a public contractor in accordance with the laws of the State of Nevada.
5. That the certified check now deposited with this Board in the sum of \$7000.00 may be held by this Board for a period not to exceed ninety days from the date hereof to await the fulfillment of the conditions hereinabove specified, the same to be released to said bidder immediately upon the execution of the contract and the furnishing of surety company bond as provided in the specification and general conditions of the contract.

The vote on said Resolution was as follows: Commissioners German, Mundy, Thomas and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

On motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner German it was moved that the certified check be returned to the Standard Paving Company.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, German, Hansell and Thomas and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

On motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner German it was moved that two slot machine licenses be granted to Sam P. Lipkin for the operation of two slot machines at the Metro Store, Applications being in proper order and money to cover the same being on file with the City Clerk.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners German, Mundy, Thomas and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

No further business appearing before the Board at this time the meeting adjourned.

Roll call showed the following present, Mayor Cragin, Commissioners Mundy, German, and Thomas, City Attorney and Clerk.

Mayor Cragin appointed Commissioner Mundy to approve the bills of the Water, Sewer and Light Dept. owing to the absence of Commissioner Hansell of that Department.

Minutes of all previous meeting read and approved.

Dr. W.S. Park and A.L. Worswick appeared before the Board in regard to the amending of the present Building Code now in effect in the City and offered their services in regards to the amending and revising of said code.

"An Ordinance of the City of Las Vegas to amend Sections IV and V of Ordinance No. 168 of the City of Las Vegas, entitled: "An Ordinance of the Commission of the City of Las Vegas establishing a residence district, industrial and commercial districts within said City of Las Vegas; defining such districts; declaring it unlawful to erect, establish, maintain, or operate certain factories, works, or establishments within said residence districts and said commercial districts; regulating the erection, establishment, maintenance, operation and rebuilding of certain works or establishments in said districts; providing penalties for the violation of said ordinance, and repealing ordinances in conflict therewith," was read for a second time and passed upon the following vote; Commissioners Mundy and German, and His Honor the Mayor A.W. Cragin voting Aye. Noes none.

Said Ordinance to be known as Ordinance No. 183 of the City of Las Vegas and to be in full force and effect from and after its complete publication for one week, six issues, in the Las Vegas Evening Review-Journal.

The Board at this time discussed the matter of the City Dump ground. On motion of Commissioner Mundy, seconded by Commissioner German it was moved that the Las Vegas Disposal Company be informed that they must provide a dump ground for itself as the company is not fulfilling the terms of the contract held between itself and the City of Las Vegas in not providing a suitable dumping ground, and the land that is being used at the present time will revert back to the Las Vegas Land and Water Company as soon as the new disposal plant for the City of Las Vegas is constructed. That a dump ground must be accessible to the public at all times in order to fulfill the terms of the contract and in not doing so the contract may be broken at any time.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioner Mundy and German and His Honor the Mayor A.W. Cragin voting Aye. Noes none.

At this time the matter of straightening some of the streets in the City was brought before the Board by Mr. King, Supt. of City Streets. After some discussion on the matter on motion of Commissioner German, seconded by Commissioner Mundy moved that the City Engineer A.R. Thompson straighten the streets in of the additions to the City that were not properly laid out at an expense to the City not to exceed \$800.00. Such work to extend over several months.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Mundy and German and His Honor the Mayor voting aye. Noes none.

No further business appearing before the Board at this time the meeting recessed until Friday the 13th day of November, 1931 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Minutes of a recessed regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners held on the 13th day of November, 1931 at the hour of three o'clock P.M.

Roll call of officer showed the following present: Mayor Cragin, Commissioners Mundy, German, Hansell and Thomas City Attorney and City Clerk.

Semi-monthly salary bills approved for the Police and Street Depts.

On motion of Commissioner Thomas seconded by Commissioner German it was moved that two slot machine licenses be granted to the Vegas Sweet Shoppe. Applications being in proper form and money to cover same being on file with the Clerk. Vote on said Motion was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, German, Thomas and Hansell and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

A copy of the Resolution passed by the Las Vegas Central Labor Council condemning the City's Anti-Picketing Ordinance was read to the Board and ordered placed on file.

A petition signed by a number of property owners of the Westside petitioning the Board of Commissioners for water in the H.F. M. & M. Addition was presented to the Board.

On motion of Commissioner Hansell seconded by Commissioner Thomas it was moved that the said petition be referred to the Las Vegas Land and Water Company as that company is serving the City of Las Vegas as a public utility in furnishing water to the residence of the City.

Vote on said motion was as follows: Commissioners Mundy, German, Hansell and Thomas, and His Honor the Mayor voting Aye. Noes none.

At this time a number of gaming applications were presented to the Board for consideration. After some discussion on the applications it was on motion of Commissioner Mundy seconded by Commissioner that the following Preambles and Resolution were introduced and passed: WHEREAS, conditions have changed in the City of Las Vegas since the adoption of that certain Resolution by this Board at a recessed regular meeting of said Board on the 6th day of July 1931 and its modification on the 10th day of July 1931, wherein and by said Resolution and modification thereof it was provided that until the further order of the Board not more than eight gaming licenses, exclusive of Slot Machine licenses be granted for the quarter commencing on the first day of July, 1931 and ending on the 30th day of September, 1931, and whereas in the opinion of this Board undersaid changed conditions there is a need and demand for at least ten such gaming licenses for the quarter beginning October 1, 1931, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1931, and the City's interest will be served thereby, and whereas there has heretofore been issued or renewed in this quarter, beginning October 1, 1931 and ending December 31, 1931 seven of said licenses, exclusive of licenses for slot machines only, and that the granting for said last mentioned quarter at least ten such licenses will not contravene public interest and will not require an excessive amount of police protection under the City's 1931 and 1932 budgets heretofore adopted and the state of the City's funds applicable to police protection, but that the granting of more than ten such licenses for said last mentioned quarter will contravene public interest and will require an excessive amount
